Stray animal problem addressed

The Texico City Council on Nov. 23 moved ahead on the problem of catching stray animals in the community.

A couple of months ago, Texico Mayor Jerry Cunningham and Farwell Mayor Jimmie Mace discussed the possibility of jointly having an animal control officer.

This can work if both cities pay the officer (an "independent contractor") separately for his services.

City Attorney Marion Ty Rutter said, after talking with Clovis officials, Texico would need to have a memorandum of understanding with Farwell to allow Texico to transport stray animals to the Clovis animal pound.

Texico has an available vehicle, and Farwell would pay Texico to do this.

Also, Rutter said, Farwell would have to have a memorandum of understanding with Clovis to allow Clovis to euthanize animals that were not claimed.

Cunningham said he will discuss this further with Mace.

In other business, the council:

-- Plans to raise the trash pickup fees paid by city residents.

City Clerk Daisy Swerzcek presented the statistics showing that, for fiscal year 2003-2004, the city ran a deficit of \$9,700 -- a difference between what the city collected from residents and what the city had to pay Duncan Disposal for trash pickup.

It's been five years since this rate has changed. For the first three years, the city made a profit. The 4th year was break-even. And the 5th year showed that deficit.

Thus, the council feels it's time to increase this rate. The question is whether to increase the rate a small margin, just to break even, or to increase it so that another rate hike won't be needed for several years -- much like the one done five years ago.

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey said the council needs to study this before deciding which way to go. Also, Duncan will be contacted to see how many dumpsters they are charging the city for, just to make sure it's up-to-date.

Currently, the average residence pays \$8.50 plus tax (\$9.04 total) per month for the small dumpsters.

Because Duncan Disposal recently alerted Texico (and Farwell, too) that it was placing a 4 percent surcharge on its bills due to higher fuel costs, as allowed by their contract, Texico is looking at a 21 percent hike in these bills just to break even.

So, if Texico does as it did five years ago, boost the bills to make a profit for awhile, the average Texico customer is looking at a much higher hike than 21 percent.

-- Approved allowing water customers to use direct payment plans on a voluntary basis. This means, that if a customer chooses, they can have an electronic draft made from their bank to pay their water bills each month.

For more information, customers need to contact city hall and fill out a form.

-- Noted that street Supt. Darrell Stanton has no employees at present and a fulltime

employee will be sought.
-- Appointed Fire Chief Lewis Cooper as the city's representative to the area high-

way department planning group.



He also is credited with setting a new arena record in the short go with a 91-point ride.


L.J. won the New Mexico Rodeo Association Open Bull Riding year-end in October, becoming the youngest bull rider, at age 17, to achieve that honor.

He will attend the 1st annual Casper Baca Angry Continued on Page 2







Radionuclides, like arsenic, are naturally occurring elements that can get into the water supply. Considered heavy metals, uranium and radium, are the two RNs that TCEQ is most concerned with.

In January 2001, the EPA set the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for arsenic to 10 parts per billion (PPB) across the country. Reducing the arsenic levels in drinking water could help prevent cases of bladder cancer, lung cancer, and other related cancers deaths each year. The RN standard for drinking water is five picocurries (pci) per liter for radium and 30 micrograms per liter for uranium. About 4,000 water systems across the country will have to install treatment facilities or take some other measures, like finding alternate water sources, to meet the standard. The compliance deadline is 23 January 2006. What does this mean for Bovina's water system?



New standards will affect us all

From City Manager (TCEQ)

Little known outside of meetings of City Managers and Water Supervisors is a change in the drinking water standards across the nation.

New federal standards for the amount of arsenic and radionuclides (RN) will go into effect January 2006. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality

December 2004 to adopt the Environmental Protection Agency's standard on RN and January 2005 on arsenic.

What does that mean for small towns in Texas?

It could mean a lot of money that small towns do not have! The technology required to lower the acceptable levels is expensive. For some small towns, it could be fatal for

the survival of the towns. Preliminary indications show costs ranging in the millions of dollars to reduce levels of arsenic and RN to acceptable levels. More than 200 water systems in Texas will fail the new standards.

Arsenic is colorless and tasteless, and it occurs naturally. It is used in insecticides, herbicides, and paints. It is present in
