However, the wants of the populated have overrun the needs of the rural communities. It is understood that the regionwide need should munities are experiencing an increase in crime communause of the lack of funding available to develop rural force. The smaller counties and cities do not possess the businesses that create the funds that much larger cities have.
This shortage has led to staffing shortages as well as deficiencies in equipment, thereby creating a safe issues and choose to live where they cannot be found and where the resources are not readily available to catch and convict them.
I submit that meeting the needs of many of the smaller cities and counties should be viewed as regionwide need. If we are unable to police our own communities effectively, it will be impossible to assist with the enforcement needed to combat crime on a region wide basis.
We do not believe that there are merely two ways to distribute the funds. It does not have to be a "free for all." in fact, the funds can and should be distribpoints for population per capita crime rate, funds available, and the NEED that it addresses.
Although the MDT's you are proposing could be of some value, it does not carry the weight of ignoring the emergency needs of departments that cannot purchase equipment that is basic to law enforcement. The MDT could be considered a luxury comparable to the equipment that many smaller cities and counties could not purchase if these funds are redirected.
This will serve as our pleading to PRPC for the basic need of law enforcement and safety to be reinstated to the citizens we serve by distributing these funds in a more useful and fair way. For us, it would be not just a loss in funds that bring something
