Farwell School's 100th anniversary to be BTD theme

The Border Town Days Committee held its opening meeting of the season on Monday.

This year's theme will be "Farwell Schools Celebrates 100 Years - A Tribute to Education."

Several extra Farwell floats are expected to be in the parade.

The big Farwell School celebration will be at 6 p.m. on Friday, July 25 (the night before BTD) at the high school gym. Doors will open at 5 p.m.

There will be a program of entertainment featuring the Farwell Legends in Blue Band

plus alumni performers. After the program, a meal will be held, and a ceremony where the gym is renamed after the late Jack Williams, longtime Farwell educator.

As part of the school celebration, the Senior Citizens Lunch Site at the Farwell Community Center will have a special pancake breakfast on Saturday, July 26.

Farwell High wins UIL district academic meet

In 2007, it was the first time that Farwell High School had captured their UIL District Academic Meet championship in about 15 years.

This year, they made it back-to-back district championships.

At the academics spring meet at Sudan High School for Conference 1A District 5 in March, Farwell High took top honors with 498 points.

Eleven teams competed. Sudan was 2nd with 381, and Crosbyton 3rd with 188.

Last year, Farwell garnered 428 points, with Sudan 2nd with 290.

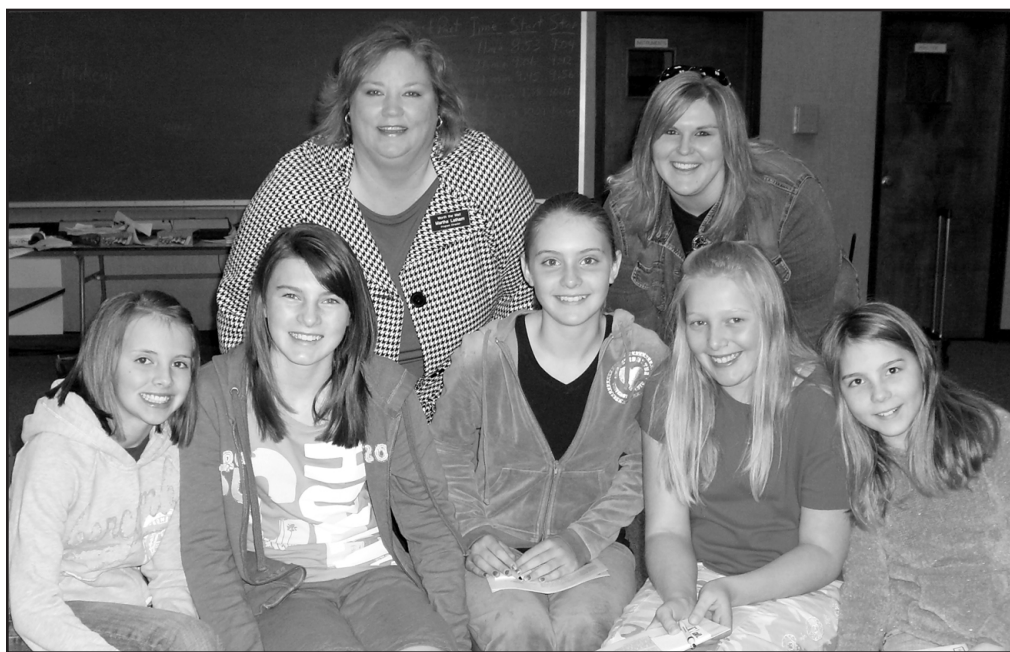

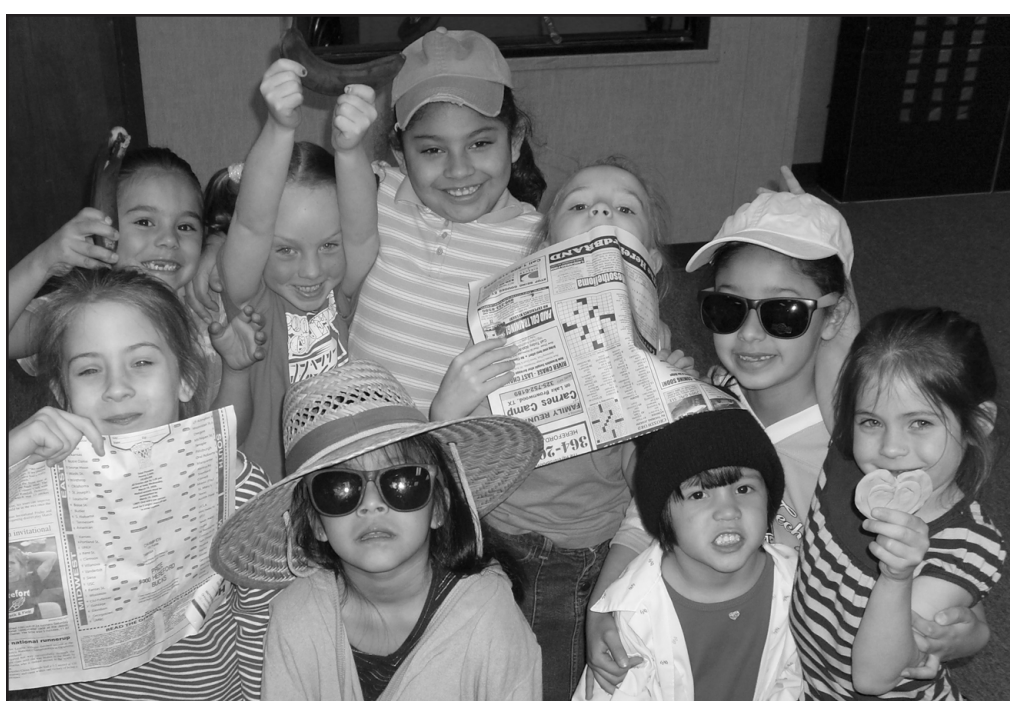

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,
What is the greatest gift that you can give your child? It is the gift of self-esteem, self-discipline and respect not only for themselves, but for others.

Children these days often have a difficult time fitting in with their peers and many times are the subject of ridicule by those older than them. Self-esteem, self-discipline and respect are very difficult qualities to teach a child or teenager.

Jones, who passed away in April of 2007, worked diligently to strengthen and promote Farwell for over 50 years.

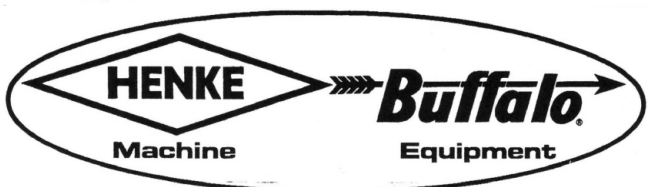
He was a founding member of the Texico-Farwell Rotary Club, and we hope that all past and present Rotary members attend the special ceremony in his honor.

The plaque will be placed on the wall of the Farwell Community Center in his memory.

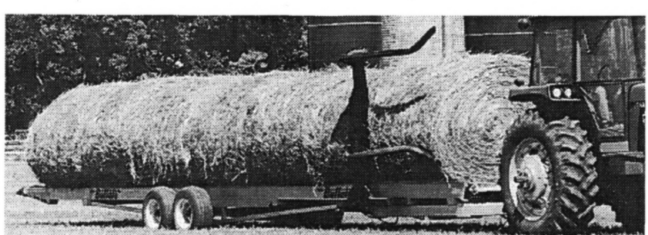

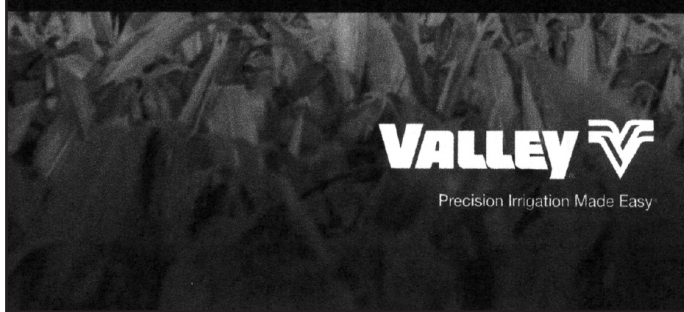

Texico receives \$450,000 grant

The Texico City Council received word from City Clerk Carolyn Johnson that Texico will receive a CDBG grant for \$450,000 for the waste water treatment plant project the city has been working on.

Johnson said that as soon as the Environmental Department, engineers, and city council finalize the plans, construction can begin.

The maximum grant allocation that CDBG gives out is \$500,000. Mayor Jerry Cunningham once again stressed what a great job Johnson did in getting the grant.

In other business, the council:

- Heard that the Ute Water Project will not be putting a 19 cent per 1,000 gallon increase in affect. This was reported at the last council meeting, but it did not go through.

- Accepted a county wildfire plan that will help smaller fire departments like Pleasant Hill get special funds. Texico is too big to get any of the funds, but Councilman Doug Scioli pointed out how often Pleasant Hill Fire Department helps out when there is a fire.

- Discussed paying for prisoner housing. Currently Texico prisoners are held in Clovis, and Texico must pay \$20 out of every ticket written to pay for it, even if there are no prisoners being held. The council voted to go to a system where Texico pays the full daily charges of \$75 instead of paying for unused jail time.

Baseball League sign-ups continue

Another round of sign-ups for the High Plains Youth Baseball League will be April 14 from 6 to 8 p.m. at the baseball complex behind the Farwell Schools bus barn.

The league (t-ball and baseball) is open to Farwell and Texico youth currently enrolled in school (or will be enrolled next fall) through age 12. Cost is \$40 for the first child and \$25 for any other child.

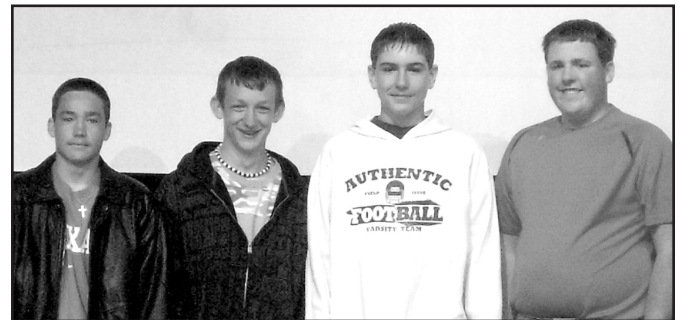

A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

If a hearing request is timely filed, the executive director will complete the technical review, issue a preliminary decision on the application, and a Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. 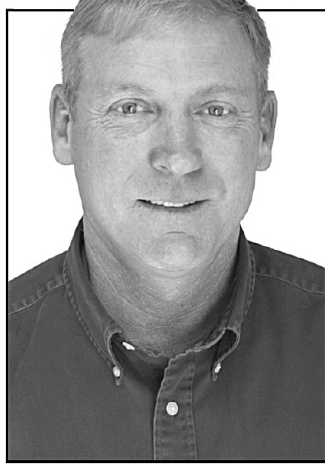

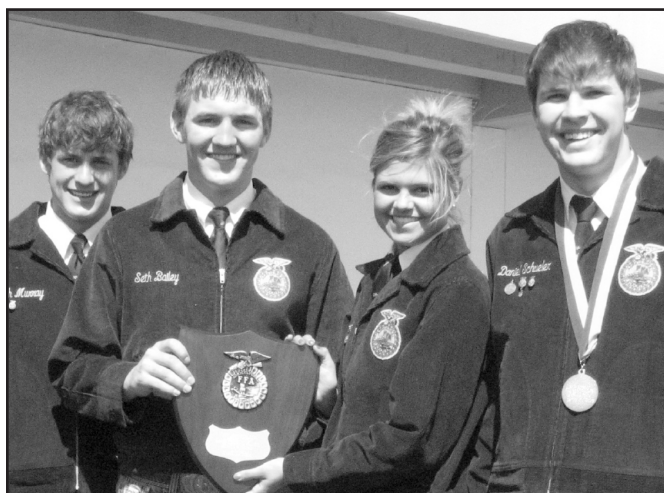
Reserve State Champions

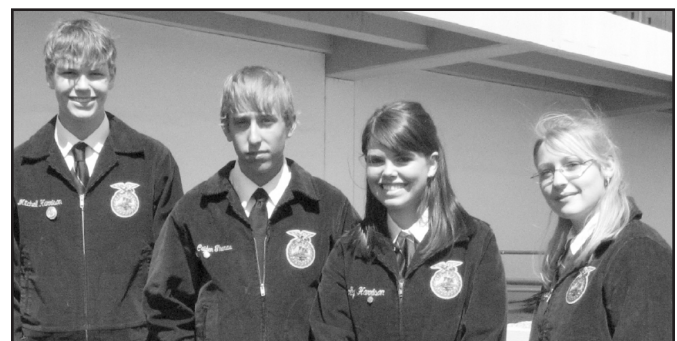

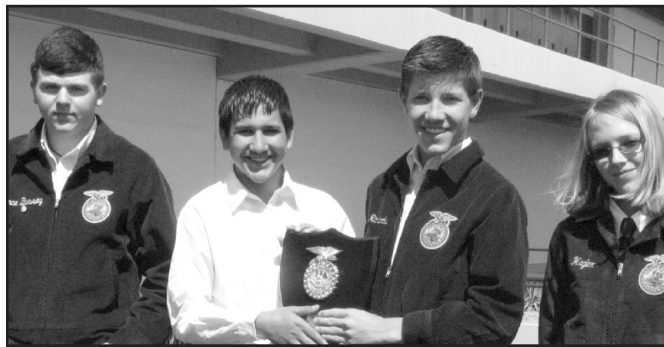

Bovina School Board approves Six Flags trip

The Bovina School Board on Monday approved a spring trip for the Mustang Band to Six Flags May 16-18.

In other business, the board:

-- Hired Jennifer Briesh, who has been a student teacher this year, to be an elementary school teacher next year.

-- Received the resignation of Melissa Solis, who has been the special education teacher for the elementary and middle schools.

-- Upgraded four salary schedules due to the new federal law of \$6.55 minimum for hourly employees, starting July 24. This will only affect one school employee.

-- Received the preliminary budget for 2008-2009 of \$4,701,184. This is close to this year's, said Supt. Bill Bizzell.

Good news is that the refined Average Daily Attendance (ADA) has been increasing due to more students. This defines state funding. Thus, Bovina Schools will get more money from the state next year.

The ADA has increased from 437.275 to 462.428, Bizzell reported.

-- Appointed Brenda Riddle election judge.

-- Approved applications for Texas Education Excellence Award grants to the state by the middle school and high school. Bovina will find out next year if these schools will get any grants.

Xcel Energy increases charges

Higher natural gas prices have resulted in an increase in the fuel-cost portion of Xcel Energy customer bills in Texas.

Beginning May 1, Texas customers using 1,000 kilowatt-hours of power a month will see a 13 percent increase in the overall bill, or \$11.61 more per month.

The increase was filed last week with the Public Utility Commission of Texas.

Fuel costs, which are passed through to customers directly at no profit to the company, are figured through a fuel factor that is set twice a year. The summer factor will take effect May 1 and takes into account a 28 percent rise in the cost of natural gas over the winter. These costs are not part of a customer's base electric rate.

The recently announced fuel surcharge in Texas is also a separate charge that will expire in March 2009. Its purpose is to recover past under collections of fuel costs. It is not factored into this fuel cost increase.

The increase in the fuel factor is not permanent. If fuel prices fall over the next six months, the winter factor will be less when it goes into effect in October. Any over collections would be credited back to the customer.

Gist, Brozek compete for School Board seat

A second person has filed for the special Bovina School Board post that will be on the May 10 ballot due to the resignation of Matt Hromas.

The deadline for filing is April 9.

On Monday, Bill Gist filed.

Earlier, Jake Brozek had filed.

The term is for one year.

Thus, Gist and Brozek will vie that that post, in addition to the regular school board election.

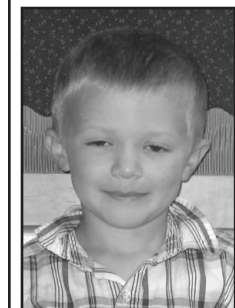

We were pleased with these students' progress and the warm reception of the residents and staff.

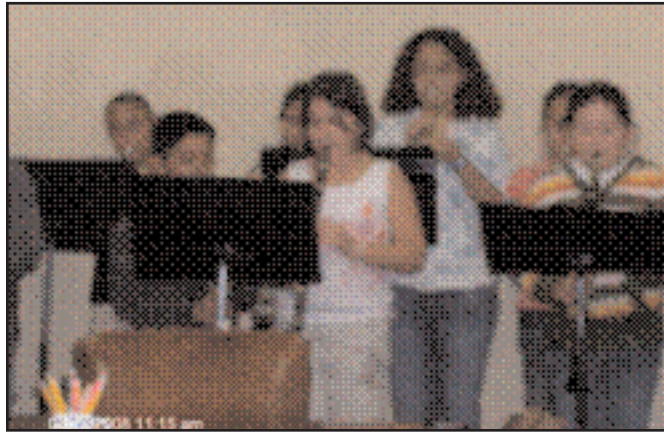

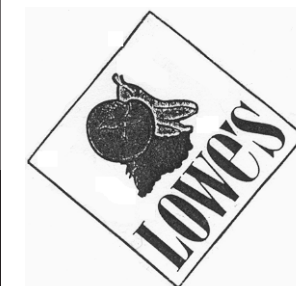
