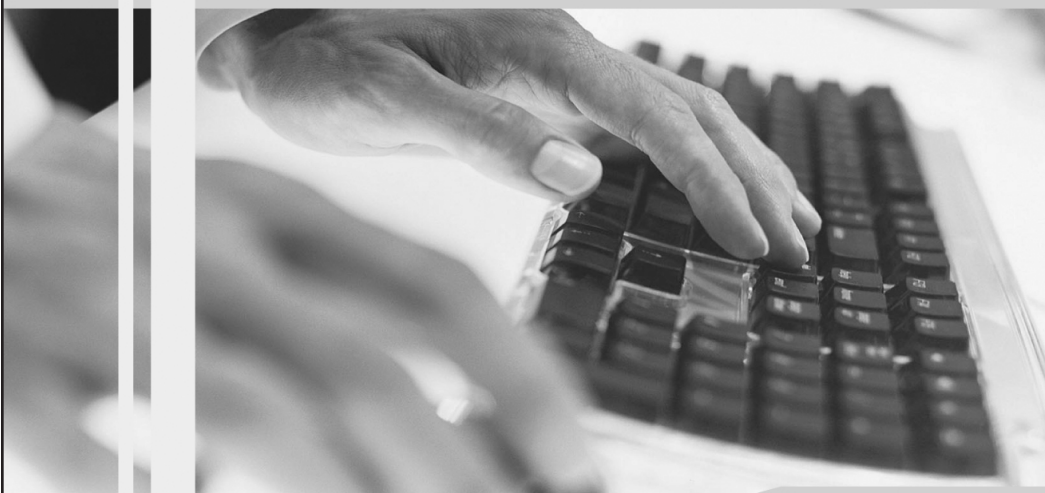

The New Mexico Athletic Association on Monday approved a stoppage of all school sports for one week due to the swine flu situation.

Here is what it means for Texico:

-- The state golf meet was moved to May 11 and 12.

-- Athletes cannot practice after school until May 12.

-- The Texico Wolverines' baseball game set for May 5 was cancelled; this was to be the state tourney opener. Sixteen teams will be seeded on May 8. Then those teams will begin state tourney play on May 11 in Albuquerque.

Texico School Supt. R.L. Richards explained

that since some schools were closed this week due to fear of a flu outbreak, the NMAA felt it wouldn't be fair for some athletes to practice while others couldn't, thus leading to the "no practice" rule for a week.

He also said the state has 140,000 vials of anti-virus on hand, and Gov. Richardson has ordered 200,000 more.

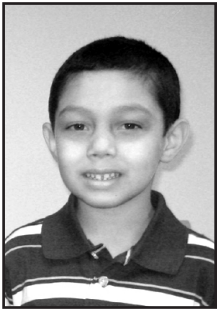

The average corn yield was 180 bu/acre vs. 200 in 2007.

For reference, the 2004 and 2005 Parmer County corn crops had average yields of 226 and 185 bu per acre, respectively. Parmer County is typically one of the top 10 corn producing counties in Texas.

Parmer County corn producers planted over 86,000 acres in 2008, up from just over 40,000 acres in 2006.
