County burn ban started
The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday approved a countywide burn ban, effective Feb. 1 for 90 days.
No burning will be allowed in the county areas unless it is in a ground incinerator with metal walls, said County Judge Bonnie Heald.
In other business, the commissioners:
-- Received two bids for a new pickup for the Parmer County Extension Agent, from Stevens 5 Star, of Hereford, and John Rowley, of Littlefield.
Stevens' low bid of $\$ 36,535$ (less $\$ 11,500$ trade-in) as accepted.

- Allowed 4 Reasons Vending, operated by Michael Haseloff, to install an office deli vending machine in the county courthouse hallway.
This is on a probationary period to see how it works out.
- Approved a request by District Attorney Kathryn Gurley to continue using the courthouse office she previously used when she was county attorney. She now will use it for a 287th Judicial District attorney's office.

The current county attorney is Jeff Actkinson, whose legal office is across the street from the courthouse. Mrs. Gurley's regular office is in Friona. -- Tentatively approved a request by KAR Services, a trailer dragging service which operates at Cargill Meat Solutions near Friona, to purchase some county right-of-way along the railroad tracks there.

Parmer County schools may get financial windfall
Public school districts in Parmer County could have an additional $\$ 1.5$ million over a two-year period to spend, according to Strategic Partnerships, an Austin-based research and procurement consulting firm.

The totals quoted are part of the $\$ 825$ billion eco-
omic stimulus package being considered by Congress.
The funding is aimed at improving public school
classrooms, laboratories and libraries for students.
Another $\$ 14$ billion is estimated to be allocated for
