Parmer County schools may get financial windfall

Public school districts in Parmer County could have an additional \$1.5 million over a two-year period to spend, according to Strategic Partnerships, an Austin-based research and procurement consulting

The totals quoted are part of the \$825 billion economic stimulus package being considered by

The funding is aimed at improving public school classrooms, laboratories and libraries for students.

Another \$14 billion is estimated to be allocated for school modernization and repairs and an estimated \$1 billion could be allocated for education technolo-

A breakdown of how much it is estimated that Parmer County public schools will receive over two years from the House version of the Economic Recovery Package follows:

Bovina -- \$335,800. Farwell -- \$268,500. Friona -- \$792,500. Lazbuddie -- \$121,700.
