LIVE CATTLE: Live Cattle prices were able rebound after a $\$ 5$ drop in just a few days. Prices may be in position to retest their old highs, but it may be more difficul to see the back months push this high? There is a strong case that long term trends have turned down, but there
still needs to be more confirmation in order to call a long term top in place. All seasonal trends have turne down into late June.
