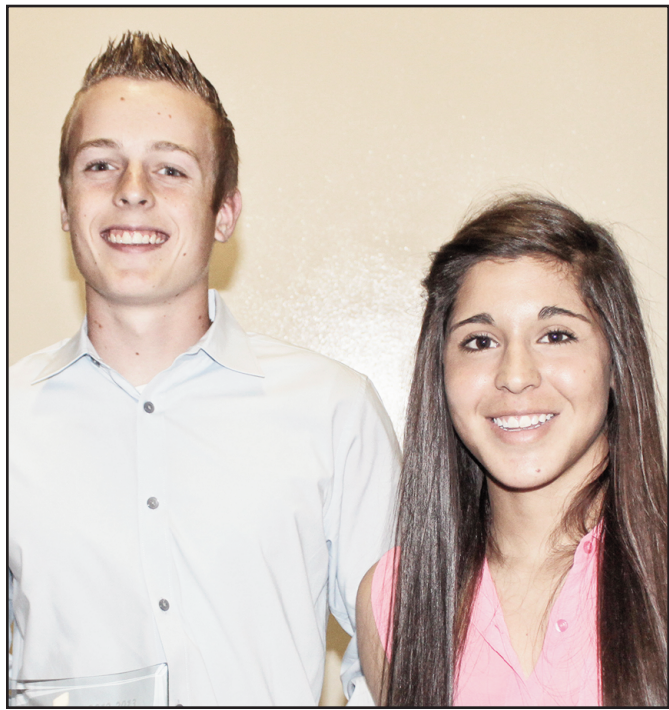




Lucero, Tuls named Texico top athletes

The FFA had their most successful year ever, placing second in the Area Sweepstakes.

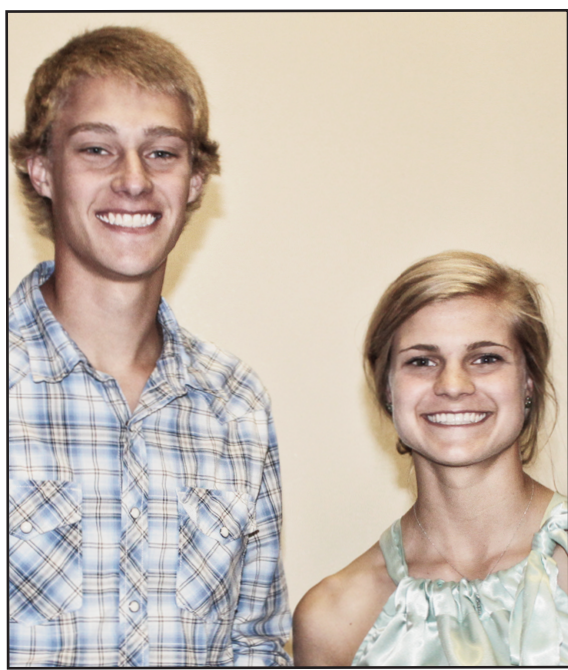
Ag teacher Sid Morris said he was proud of the success the FFA had this year, and said it was the best overall placing he's had as an ag teacher.

Live Cattle prices have continued to beat this \$118-119 low to death and have yet to convincingly break down below these levels. On the other hand, each rally off these lows have turned into nothing. Prices can't seem to move higher or lower more than a few short days at a time. Cash fed cattle prices are drifting lower while beef prices are trading at record highs. The cattle market on the whole is in disarray and really has no direction at this time. Prices topped last December and have yet to see a substantial rally of any kind. Resistance lies above at \$124 and support is \$119 on the weekly, \$118 basis August.

Feeder prices dropped down into the \$142 level early last week and bounced back up towards the \$147 area before breaking back down late in the week to test the \$142 level again. Prices continue to try to work higher, but with \$1.31 cash trade hanging around, it's been like an anchor on the August contract. Prices are struggling to maintain such a large premium over cash at this time.

Soybean prices broke above their six month trading range last week before selling back down. Prices are strongly back above these levels today and may actually test last weeks highs over the near term. Market is strong and long term trends are up which is also unusual for this time of the year.

Corn prices continue to move higher even though most of the crop is planted and looks like rain across the major growing regions. All analysts are extremely bearish on prices and yet they continue to move higher. The \$6.70 level is major resistance in July while \$5.70 is resistance in December. A breakout above these levels could possibly push prices significantly higher over the near term.

Wheat prices continue to lag far behind the rest of the grain complex which is a little unusual considering most analysts believe production has been greatly affected this year with winter freeze kills across most of the major winter wheat growing regions? It may take getting into the middle of harvest before the rest of the story is told. For now, the market is quiet, but above their \$7.30 support in the July KC contract.

Cotton prices remain inside a trading range with \$87 holding the top side and \$83 holding the low side. Prices have been trading inside this range for almost the last month and a half. Until prices can break out of the way side or the other, they're trapped. Not much in the way of news, just quiet trading at this time.

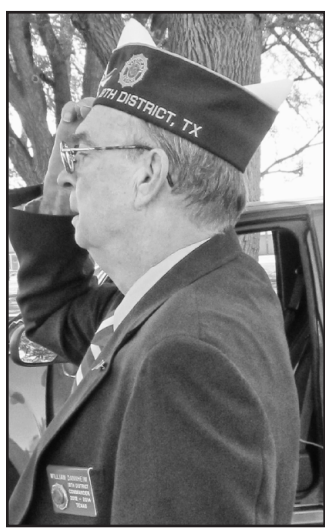

Texico discusses new ordinances

The Texico City Council on May 14 discussed city ordinances dealing with three issues. No actions were taken.

First, a proposed mobile home ordinance would require mobile homes to have a permit if they are moved. This includes moving a home in or out of town, or simply moving a home from one place to another in town.

Second, a plumbing ordinance would standardize plumbing codes. City Clerk Carolyn Johnson said this will make it easier for city workers.

The third ordinance was declaring that Texico is not in a flood plain. This will be beneficial for folks who have flood insurance, and should help them get a reduced rate.

In other news, the council:

- Discussed the Bill Autrey property on the corner of Craig and State streets.

Autrey had asked to tie his water line into a private line of a neighbor. The council would have had to buy the water line from the neighbor in order to do it, and suggested that Autrey connect to a line near his house.

- Granted a noise permit to Carmen Acosta to have an outdoor graduation party.

- Heard from Mrs. Johnson that the CDBG grant for the first phase of the sewer plant has been paid out and the first part of the construction has been finished.

She is working on securing a second grant to continue the planned work.

Be safe this summer

- Do not use a propane gas cylinder if it shows signs of external damage, such as dents, gouges, fire damage, corrosion, leakage or excessive rust.
- Before grilling, make sure the propane cylinder is secured to the grill as directed by the manufacturer.
- After grilling, the cylinder must not be stored indoors or within any enclosed space.
- Always open the grill hood before lighting, and light according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Never use gasoline or kerosene to start the fire.
- Always grill in a well-ventilated area. Do not grill indoors or close to the side of a building.
- Use foil or a drip pan to catch juices and help avoid grease fires.
- To see how much propane is left in your cylinder, run a wet finger down the side. The wet streak will evaporate faster over the empty part of the cylinder.
- To turn the cylinder valve on or off, remember "Righty, tighy/Lefty, loosey."

She taught longer at Bovina than any other educator ever Janie Sudderth to retire

Janie Sudderth wasn't even planning to be a teacher. That fact is a little ironic since this month Janie will retire from Bovina Schools after an amazing 52-year career.

Janie originally thought she would work in a business office. When she graduated from college in 1959, women's careers were too often restricted to "teachers, nurses, or secretaries."

As she earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in business administration West Texas State College in Canyon, teaching still did not enter Janie's mind. It wasn't until the chairman of the Business Department suggested she take education classes as a backup plan that she even considered it. Now, she couldn't imagine a better path for her life.

Janie began her career in Muleshoe where she taught for one year. Since Janie grew up and graduated from Bovina schools, it was just a natural move when a position came open in her hometown.

She began teaching English, then moved on to a number of different classes such as girl's P.E., keyboarding, and technology.

She credits the technology classes with keeping her young. "I had to learn all the different technology updates and get certificates for the new programs to be able to teach them. That way, I never stopped learning and am still learning today."

Obviously, times change. "When I first began teaching, we used manual typewriters, then graduated to electric typewriters and finally to computers."

She enjoyed teaching students shorthand and other office skills. "Some students come back at reunions and tell me how much my class helped them over the years, especially the boys. They didn't like learning some of those skills at the time, but came to appreciate them later."

Janie will miss visits with Bovina alumni when she retires. "I just love to see how the students turn out and what they are doing years later. There have always been some amazing students in Bovina - teaching here has been very rewarding."

But let's take a look at the present: "The students in my technology class are learning a lot about digital media, including Photoshop and Illustrator programs," Janie says. They also learn about video technology - how to use video equipment and edit their productions.

For an end-of-the-year presentation, students must create a PowerPoint presentation about their own family histories, including photos.

Another amazing project in Janie's class is restoring old photos. Students are asked to bring in old, damaged pictures - possibly from their parents or grandparents, then restore them digitally.

"One student brought in his parents' wedding picture that had been torn and damaged. It was the only copy that his parents owned and he restored it to look brand new. It was a great project."

Janie describes her co-workers at Bovina as "family." She notes her pride in being part of the school for so many years.

For example, she will never forget how supportive

everyone was when her husband became ill, then passed away. "I could not have had better treatment. Everyone pitched in to help me. They are definitely family."

Although Janie retired once before - in 1995, she eventually came back to work part-time, then was talked into full-time again. This time retirement will stick.

"I only have so long left to do the things I want to do," she said, pointing out visiting her children who live near Austin, doing exercise classes, playing golf and keeping up on her own technology.

"I never want to stop learning new things. I never regret my decision to become a teacher and I will miss the students here. There are really great kids here in Bovina and I am proud to have had a part here."
