goal. However, it wasn't politically wise to let us know where they were coming from. So you haven't seen sors.

today. Just look at the size of our Armed Forces and where they are
located -. troops in Korea, in West located - troops in Korea, in West
Germany, throughout Europe, in the Phillipines, in Cuba, etc. And we
