## Attention, tree lovers...

This is the time of year that plant lovers get eager about the coming spring and thoughts of fresh garden veggies and big shade trees dance through our heads. Wind breaks and shade trees are important to area residents. Several comes come in tous about insect and disease ridden trees at different times of the year. Most of these insect and disease tree invaders are secondary pests, and are atracted to weak, stressed or dying trees. Sore per suited for our climate. There are some can take to adin preventing these pests
Tree topping is harmful to trees. Removing a large portion energy temporarily. New bud growth will tree and stare as the tree tries to compensate for the loss. This is not healty regrowth The new buds are weak structurally and easily break in windy weather. The topping wounds are large and slow to close if at all. This allows extended time for insects and disease to enter the tree. To properly trim your trees, only trim branches in the way, sprouts, limbs rubbing or growing the wrong way, and dead limbs.

When planting trees and shrubs be sure whoever is planting the tree follows these guidelines: The hole should be the same depth as the soil that is covering the root ball. The hole should be three times the width of the root ball. Back fill with the same soil that was removed from the hole. The tree or shrub should be removed from the container, all root ball covering should be removed, this includes all wire and string. It's recommended that three inches of organic muich should be added to the top of the backfill. No black plastic should be used.

A tree should be watered at the feeder roots which are at the dripline. If you draw an imaginery line from the outer most branch to the ground, that is the dripline, and where you
