four desks for deputies. The sheriff and the chief deputy will have their own offices. Also, the Texas Department of Public Safety officers will move from their current area on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ floor of the county courthouse to a room in this building. The administration area will also have a training room and storage areas.


Individual cells will have a toilet, sink and women. Their separate cells can accommodate up hower area. There will be separate areas for to 12 inmates (in 4-person cells).


In the control room, police can check on any cell or area within the building.
