stay cold enough to keep food frozen for two days, notes Wagner, while one half-full will
only keep food cold for a day. only keep food cold for a day.

freezer closed and not to check the food regularly.
Meats that still contain ice
crystals or that have been kept at 40 degrees $F$. or below for less than two days may be
safely refrozen. Some quality may be lost but the product is more dry ice or to remove it
