County in great financial shape

Just like last year, the Parmer County Commissioners on Monday received an annual audit report from Kirkland, Kirkland & Co., CPA, that shows the county to be in excellent financial shape.

The county's tax rate isn't determined yet because the Appraisal District won't have the certified values until later.

The CPA firm reported that the county's total revenues exceeded expenses by \$335,921 during the past fiscal year, putting the combined fund balances at \$3,267,304.

In the past, the CPA firm has told the commissioners it would be wise to keep a fund balance (surplus) of at least \$1.5 million. Thus, the current surplus is more than twice that.

Last year's tax rate was .4949 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.

The audit was accepted.

The commissioners will meet with the county appraiser in August to set the effective tax rate.

In other business, the commissioners:

- Awarded the contract for the Bovina water and sewer project to West Texas Utility Contractors of Amarillo.

- Approved the competition of banks in Parmer County for the financing of equipment the county purchases if their rates are competitive.

- Voted to not accept the public defender's grant that was proffered in the previous meeting of the commissioners.

- Approved the governor's proclamation of extreme drought to be forwarded to the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission to establish eligibility for relief

This year's giveaways will start promptly at noon at the Saturday festivities. To enter, you must be at least 12 years of age and you must be present to win.

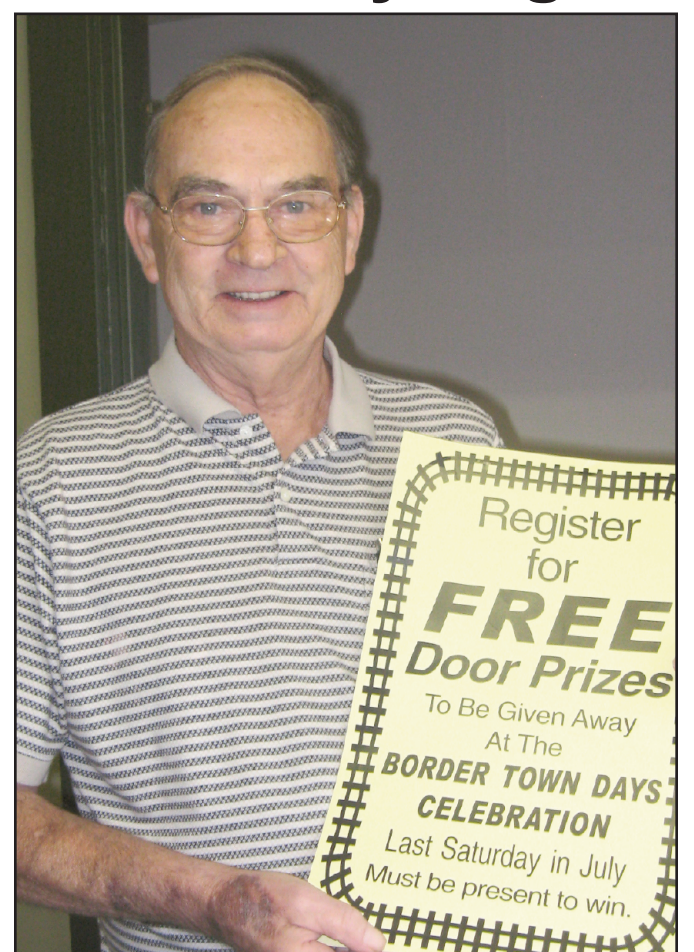
In charge of this year's giveaway are Bill Dannheim and Jerry Whitney.

Convalescent Center receives two honors

The Farwell Convalescent Center has received not one, but two crowns for its quality as a care-giving facility.

"We are very gratified that our substantial advances are being recognized," said Bryan Sullivan, the center's administrator the last two years. "The state of Texas conducts annual surveys of its licensed facilities and the last evaluation discovered only minimal deficiencies for us."

At the same time, the Texas Association of Homes and Services for the Aged released the results of its own research that is based on poll responses of the employees, residents, and families of residents of care-giving facilities.

"That second evaluation was also excellent," Sullivan smiled. "We are all very pleased with both of these results and are also very optimistic that we can do even better in the next 12 months."

Sullivan is quick to give the lion's share of credit to the nursing administrator, Janice Brown, who also very modestly passes the credit on.

"I have worked in other convalescent centers in Curry County and Parmer County, and this one is the very best," Ms. Brown said. "One very

big reason for that is the membership of the hospital board that works with us on everything. Every one of them loves this community and the people in it and they are dedicated to making sure our residents get only the best."

"The other great blessing we have here is our staff of nursing assistants," she continued. "We have a very low turnover in staff and some of them have been with us for 20 years. They are the great source of direct care and concern for each one of our residents."

One state official praised the center's performance on the list of quality indicators but added that the high marks reflect much more than that, saying "Grades on a sheet of paper are great but the most important ingredient is the milieu of care

-- Continued the \$10 fee involved in each vehicle registration to provide funds for road and bridge maintenance actions.

-- Appointed Flo Davis as election judge in Oklahoma Lane (Pct. 302), replacing Harold Carpenter. Tommie Fulcher will be alternate judge.

-- Discussed the regime of fees, tax abatements, policies, and procedures that ought to be in place before the construction of the wind farms that may be coming to Parmer County.

-- Tabled the agreement under which county law enforcement officials can use the dog and handler trained in the detection of illicit drugs maintained by the city of Bovina. This delay will permit the county attorney to review the agreement.

sively shiny and perfect. If Jesus was driving through Clovis, He would be in that car.

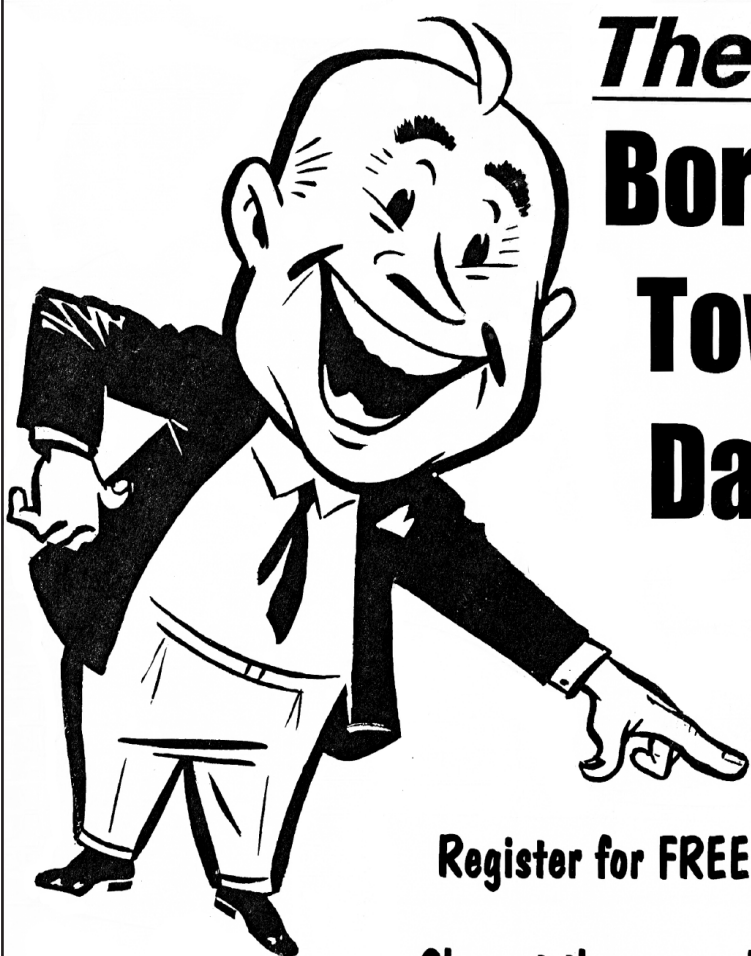
I thought, "Wow that car is beautiful. I'd love to drive that around!"

Sheriff Geries: Neighbors need to stay alert

A new wave of criminal activity is rising in the area in the form of daylight burglaries of people's homes. "It appears that the criminals knock on people's doors," said Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries. "If there's someone home to answer the door, the criminals ask directions or anything else to give them an excuse for being there and they leave."

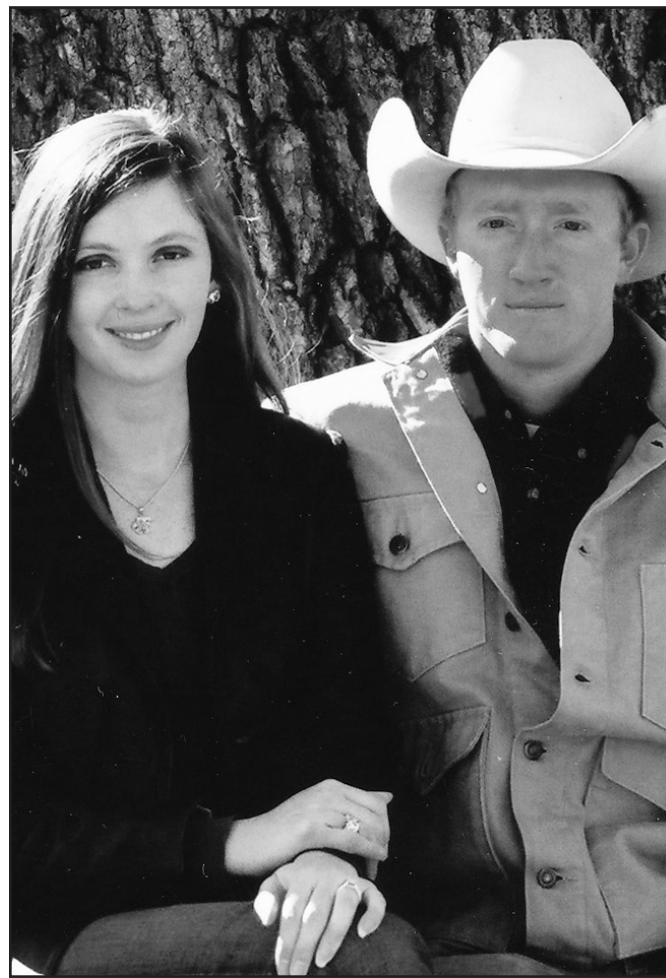
"If no one is home to answer the door, however, the criminals seize on the opportunity," he explained. "They smash through a door or a window, rummage through the house, and get away as quickly as they can."

"TVs, jewelry, and firearms are the main things they've been stealing," he continued.

The home-invaders that have been arrested were captured because alert and concerned neighbors have noticed parked vehicles or saw strangers in the yards next door and then immediately called the police.

Sheriff Geries said that there have not yet been any daylight break-ins of residences reported in Parmer County but he believes it could be coming this way.

"It's already taking off in neighboring counties in Texas and New Mexico," he said. "All of our neighbors need to stay alert and take care of each other, now more than ever."

A look at the drought situation

A look at the drought situation from Plains Cotton Growers, Inc.:

Mostly due to La Nina, the last nine months have been the driest ever in the southern center U.. since records began in 1895, according to the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration and National Weather Service.

And NOAA/NWS experts say conditions are not likely to improve drastically anytime soon, although some alleviation is forecast.

In West Texas and many other locations, it would take 1 1/2 times to twice the average seasonal precipitation needed over the next three months to end the drought. The experts say there is a 5 percent or less chance of the drought ending in three of even six months in

West Texas.

Ninety-one percent of Texas is in extreme to exceptional drought.

The drought has brought unprecedented consequences to the cotton crop. For the first

time ever, the High Plains is looking at a near 100 percent abandonment rate on dryland cotton. Some producers are shifting water from other crops to cotton, trying to salvage what they can.

Sheriff's Report

Here is the weekly report from Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries:

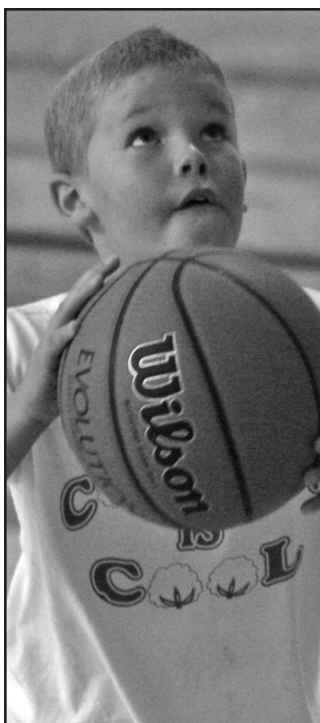

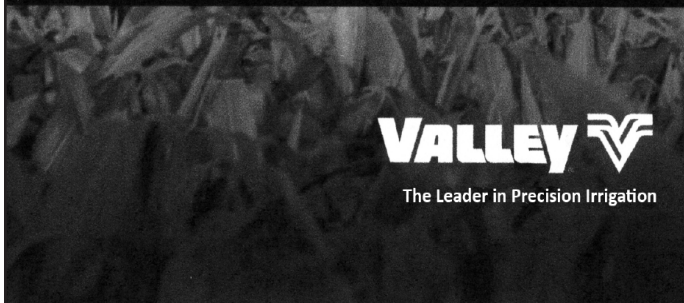

Museum helpers requested

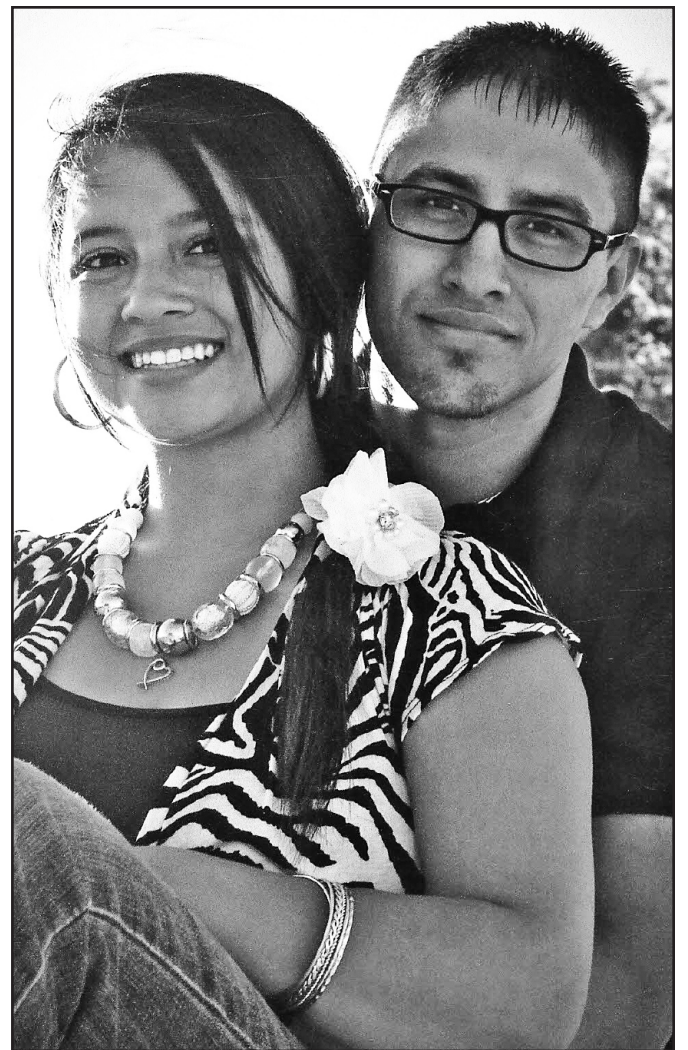
The Parmer County Historic Commission will meet July 21 at 7 p.m. at the Parmer County courthouse.

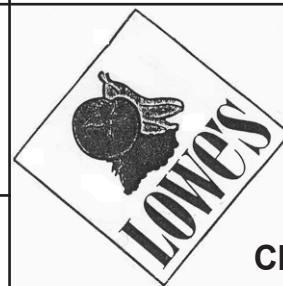
