Texico Wolverines won their first game in the county softball tournament on Tuesday when they collided with Elida. Final score in the senior game was 4-1 and final score in the junior game was 8-1, with the Texico juniors being defeated by the Elida Tigers.

Roy McDaniel, Texico pitcher, had an almost perfect afternoon walking one man and allowing one hit. The only Elida score came on a walk followed by a double in the fifth inning. The Texico aggregation also had an errorless afternoon.

Texico runs came in the first, second and fourth innings. Scoring for Texico were Ardale Autrey, Joe Patterson, Bobby Joe Stewart and Donnie Morris.

In commenting on the game Coach Johnny Green said "This was the best game of the season, and we hope to be able to continue our winning ways through the next few days to end a perfect season."

Texico will meet Dora in the second game of the tournament today (Thursday) at Dora. Winner of that game will again play at Dora on Saturday. Four teams will be playing in the finals on Saturday.

The Wolves have won all of their games thus far this season. Juniors are closing their

season with four wins and one loss.

In the junior game Elida led all the way getting off to a good start in the first inning by scoring two times. They got the other six runs in the fourth inning. Texico crossed home plate with its only run in the sixth inning. Charged with the loss was Delford Martin. He was relieved by Ricky Martin in the fourth inning. Winning pitcher for Elida was Kiker, who allowed only five hits during the game.

Coach Green commented that the juniors played good ball except for the fourth inning.

NAIA And NCAA List Dial And Martin Tops

Benjy Dial, Eastern New Mexico University quarterback, has shot up to sixth place in the individual total offense among players rated by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics in the first week of evaluation by that national sports organization.

Dial, whose mother Mrs. Clytie Dial lives in Farwell, has gained 589 yards in 70 plays in three games for an average per game of 196.3 yards. These ratings do not include the Saturday game.

Dial was also ranked eighth in individual passing achievement against other NAIA leaders, completing 46 of 79 passes for a percentage of .582, two touchdowns and total yardage in the air of 533.

Also given a good rating is Jim Martin, Clovis end, who is listed among the top pass receivers with a 23rd ranking on

the basis of 204 yards gained in 18 catches and a game average of 68. Martin is also credited with two touchdowns.

Both Dial and Martin moved up in NCAA rankings. Dial moved up nine places in the total offense, being listed in 10th place in both rushing and passing, and eighth in forward passing. Martin moved up from 16th in pass receiving to 11th.
