## TORNADO Safety Rules

TO KNOW What to do when a tornado is approaching may mean the DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LIFE AND DEATH!
I If you are near a tornado cellar:
When time permits, go to a tornado cellar, cave or underground excavation which should have an air outlet
to help eovailize the air pressure It should be kepe fif for we, free form water, gas or debbis, and preferably
II If you are in open country:
Move at right angles to the tomado's path. Tomadoes ussually move ahead at about 25 to 40 miles per hour.
If there is no time to escape, lie falat in the nearest depression such as as ditch or ravine.
III If in a city or town.
 frame houses, Peopie in hhouses without basements can sometimes be protected by taking cover under
heavy furniture against inside walls. Doors and windows on the sides of the house away from the tomado
may be poened to help reduce dama e to the building.
V. Standing against the inside wall on a lower floor of an office building offers some protection,
