



Leading scorers for Texico were Kevin West with 18; followed by Dennis Chavez who pumped in a total of 11.





Welcome to the exciting world of molded candies. Here is an art everyone can master and enjoy. With a little instruction and the necessary supplies you can be making fresh, delicious candies that a special touch to any

These unique candies can be made with real chocolate and also summer coatings. The secret to working with these candies is temperature control. If coatings or chocolates are allowed to reach a temperature beyond certain limits the result is "caking" which makes the candy unsuitable for

The candy should be melted in a double boiler in which the water is between 115 and 125 degrees. This temperature can usually be achieved with tap water. Do not attempt to melt caudy with double boiler on a cal source.

The candy will be at its best pouring consistency when at a temperature between 95 and 100 degrees If using several

In the record of Joseph's reactions we are given light as to the extreme embarrassment in which Mary now found herself. Consider Joseph's position. Mary was his "espoused wife." Why had she gone away - and stayed so long? And now, what is this? She is found with child-not by him. Her explanation, if indeed she offered it to him, must have seemed most unsatisfactory. He could have charged her with adultery and had her stoned, but "being a just (Lit., "fairminded") man" he "was minded to put her away privily" (Matt. 1:19).

But "while he thought on these things," with a heavy heart, "the angel of the Lord appeared to him' and Joseph learned that his beloved had told him the truth; that she was indeed to be the honored mother of the Messiah of Israel, the Redeemer of sinners.

It was because our Lord was the Son of God, born into the world by a virgin and not partaking of Adam's sinful nature, that He could go to Calvary and pay the full penalty for our sins. He "suffered for sins, the Just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God" (I Pet. 3:18).



Q: Do you do any charity work? By that I mean, do you take care of people who need your services but can-

A remarkable thing happens to Cornish game hens when they're stuffed with ripe olives and vegetables. No bread crumbs needed for this gourmet stuffing. "I get some people that stop by, although I'm really not in it to make money, but if I pay for my supplies I'm perfectly satisfied. Besides it gives me a chance to meet people."

Guthals came to Clovis from Pueblo, Colo., where he had been working in a steel mill melting metal during World War II. "I quit once because I was working seven days a week 8-16 hours a day, but the pay was so good, so I went back," he recalls, "But it was really wearing me down. My brother needed help here and I figured the only way to get out of that steel mill was to move far away ... and here I am.'

He spent his "working" years in pest control and the vending machine business until he began to lose his eyesight and finally retired in 1975. "You know I quit driving as soon as I began to lose my sight, and I didn't wait for anyone to tell me to. I just never wanted to take the chance of hurting anyone while I was driving, that's too serious." That's the

Recalling one of the times ne had a gun pulled on him, the veteran lawman breaks into a wide grin and tells the story like this:

I got a call about a man wandering around an empty field about 10 miles east of Farwell in a rural area. I drove there with my deputy and the farmer that called in about the man. The man was by himself in the field and there were no lights. I put my lights on him and pulled up to see him good. Right away we saw the gun aimed at us and the farmer immediately crawled under the car!" he says with a laugh, "Believe me I wish I could have too but I said 'Put up your hands. this is the law . . . and drop your gun' and he dropped it

Lay snowflake into mixture and saturate. Remove and blot with paper towel. Lay snowflake on waxed cardboard. With fingers, shape snowflake being careful to include ends. Henry Cole, an English businessman, was astonished to realize that with Christmas just a few days away he had forgotten to send his personal best wishes to his friends - as was the custom of the time.

Seeking a desperate, last minute solution to the problem. Cole contracted an artist friend, Calcott Horsley, for help. Horsley was asked to design a card that could be reproduced and mailed to Cole's friends.

Horsley's finished product portrayed three typical vuletide scenes. A man feeding the poor was pictured on the left side of the card, and the right side showed the poor being given clothing. However, the center of the card caused quite

versy surrounding the first Christmas card, the idea quickly became very popular. The time then was right for this simple, basic idea. Even though Cole and Horslev were criticized for that first card, they later attained high honors and recognition.

Academy. After much prodding by a woman in England, Louis Prang -- a German immigrant printed the first American Christmas Card in 1875.

He had been printing business cards for several years, featuring colorful floral designs. But in 1874, the wife of Prang's London agent suggested that he print Christmas and New Year cards for the holiday season. Prang followed her advice and the cards were shipped to England for a trial run. Following their immediate success, they were introduced in America the following year.

Prang's first Christmas cards were created with dedicated, conscientious craftsmanship and were of the finest

quality. Those early cards portrayed pictures of flowers; but later Prang switched to the more traditional Christmas scenes which are prevalent

Prang's enterprise prospered for 15 years and by 1881 he was producing five million cards a year. When heavy demand led to other cheaper quality cards being produced, Prang folded his business rather than cheapen the quality of his work. Today, collectors highly prize Prang's cards.
