and responsibility that has always been highly and seriously regarded by the Commissioners Court of
Parmer County.
When the surface of the land was sold, the money was invested in
ways set forth by the Legislature ways set forth by the Legislature.
Interest from this investment has been divided among the school districts through the years, as the County Available Fund.
From 1975 through 1985; the inFrom 1975 through 1985, the in-
terest from this fund divided among the county school districts adds up to $\$ 778,459.02$, broken down as folows: Bovina $\$ 157,119.97$; Farwell \$146,454.56; Friona \$390,972.68; Lazbuddie $\$ 83,911.81$.
If you were to go back to the start
