September 25, 2012, and decided that reasonable notice to the public as required in Open Meetings Act (NMSA 1978, Section $0-15-1$ to 4) would be as follows:
Unless the business before the City Council dictates otherwise, the City Council conducts open meetings to take formal
action on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month at 6:30 p.m. However, when that Tuesday is a City holiday, that meeting will be held on the next business day.
The City Clerk and staff were authorized and directed to publish an annual schedule of regular meetings as legal adversement in the State Line Tribune.
Emergency meetings will be called only under circumstances, which demand immediate action to protect the health,
safety and property of citizens or to protect the public body from substantial financial loss. The City of Texico Council will avoid emergency meetings whenever possible. Emergency meetings may be called by the Mayor or a majority of the members upon four (4) hours notice, unless threat of personal injury
or property damage requires less notice. The notice for all or property damage requires less notice. The notice for all
emergency meetings shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how the public may obtain a copy of the agenda.
The Mayor or majority of the council members upon three (3) days notice may call special meetings. The notices shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how memda shall be available to the public at least twenty-four hours before any special meeting.
All other meetings which may be called for informational purposes at which no action is taken shall be held only after written notice is issued to the State Line Tribune no later than
12:00 noon of the day of such meeting, of four (4) hours before such meeting, whichever is greater.
