In areas of West Africa, cotton gins are commis sioned and owned by the government and people are given small, one-half acre plots to farm for ers pick their cotton patch by hand and put the cotton on a smal buggy. They bring their cotton to a central loca tion where it is loaded onto a trailer to go to the gin. The farmer is paid a small amount of money for his cotton
Since the gins are govrnment entities, they assign people to work here. It was mostly political designations and the workers are not skilled or educated. All maintenance for the gin is contracted through utside organizaion company.
Craig said, "Working in lest Africa was very di ficult. Gins wer xtremely isolated and he food and water was not really safe. We tayed in cinder block ooms, many times bathed out of buckets and shared our living quarters graciously with many lizards. The lizards ate the malaria-carrying mosquitos so we didn't ind at all.
The people of West frica were very friendly, ut very poor. Since most people made in two
years. I began bringing matchbox cars with me matchbox cars with me

really liked the little gifts even more than money." Craig said one of his clearest memories was the open-air meat markets in the little town. Meat would just hang out there all day with flies all around and people would buy it for their amilies.
