
The last two weekends have found the Steers and Wolverines meeting in the championship of the Farwell and Texico tourneys with each team winning once.





Kyker wrote about his family's Texico-Farwell background in "Prairie Progress," a 1981 book

Historical County Society. One of seven children of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Kyker, he left home in the Great Depression and Dust Bowl of the 1930s with \$37 in his pockets.


Bovina Schools to contest insurance payment


