Are we teaching them how to feel good about themselves no matter what level of learning they are at or are we teaching them to see themselves as failures early on in life?
I have taught school for a long time. I have homeschooled and taught Sunday School. There is not one child that is exactly the same as another. There is not one child that learns exactly the same as another. We are trying to teach our children to learn within a certain set of guidelines that has been set by the state and federal government. Like we are all taught a BOX and I don't think I will ever teach a box! We will see the drop-out rate increase because it gets harder and harder to pass a test. We will see less children who want to go to college attend will increase with boys, in particular, because they are not allowed to move.
We need to stand up for our kids and take back our schools. We have an amazing staff which works really hard for your children but our hands are tied. We need to stand up and fight to get our children back. I want my children to have knowledge and understanding of the learning they need in order to succeed in what God has planned for them.
