Texas Parks and Wildlife to establish a shooting preserve. Then, the land is posted as such.
After the land is set up, the ofority must estinate he number each area. They patrol the preserves to make sure there are no nauthorized hunters
To hunt on the ESA preserves, one must be a licensed hunter, and
purchase a permit for the preserve All permits are good from the date they are issued through the closing day of the season. The permits ar
good for any or all of the land good for any or all of the land
secured by the sorority. Each par ticipating landowner is given one or more complimentary permits.
