writing is found in Faulkner's
Sanctuary written in 1929 As Faulkner himself said, he wrote it for the money.
He had
He had published better,
earlier books, which hadn't earlier books, which hadn't
sold well. Thus, he was hungry, to sum it up. So he
wrote Sanctuary in about three weeks, including a sex
scene to help sell it. As a book, Sanctuary isn't
that good. The plot is sub-par for Faulkner. In my opinion though, it had one item to
boast of: the final paragraph. can think of no more beautiful
a paragraph to be found in literature (except for the
Bible).
So, l'd like to share tha paragraph with our readers
today: "In the pavilion a band
in the horizon blue of the army played Massenet and
Scriabine, and Berlioz like a thin coating of tortured
Tschaikowsky on a slice of stale bread, while the twi-
light dissolved in wet gleams from the branches, onto the pavilion and the sombre toad-
stools of umbrellas. Rich and resonant the brasses crashed
