partment of Public Safety began uniform testing of all currently licensed bus drivers. All commercial who drive vehicles in excess of 26,000 pounds or transport hazardous materials that require the vehicle to
be placarded are required to be placarded are required to
have a commercial drivers license by April 1, 1992. Bus drivers, including school bus and church bus drivers, who drive buses designed to carry
16 or more passengers, including the driver, will also be required to obtain a commercial drivers license by the same date. 150 miles of their farms are
