## Texico writes to Gov. King

The Texico City Council Tuesday voted to send a letter to Gov. Bruce King explaining why it recently turned down state unds to help with its water contamination problem. (Butch Tharp, Carolyn Burrows, Oran Jay Autrey and Ronnie

Last month, the city closed a transaction to buy property near the school to build a second well, with a state grant. d on this well next month.

than totally "free trade."

Crichton suggests that we
