unfair or illegal, the pattern of actions can often determine the extent of harassment or aggression. By now, according to Crichton's evidence, there are ample patterns upon which to base legal cases which could block the sale of businesses or products. It may be time to press for "fair trade" rather than totally "free trade."

(3) Japan uses a wealth of red tape in issuing patents and in certain business practices when dealing with the U.S. We can, too.

(4) We could tax the profits of businesses owned by foreign nationals or businesses.

Crichton suggests that we adopt a Japanese management philosophy: "Fix the problem, not the blame." That makes a whole lot of sense.

And Crichton points out in the book that both the British and the Dutch have larger investments in the U.S. than the Japanese do. The difference he contends is that the Japanese have targeted key U.S. industries.

"The British and Dutch don't operate that way... if we want to buy a Dutch or English company, we can. We can't buy a Japanese company," he says.

Helton's artistic talent helps Lions clubs

Kyle Helton, 14 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Hal Helton, Clovis, has been drawing since he could hold a pencil - mostly on the backs of napkins and place mats. This year he used his artistic talents to help the Lions Clubs of New Mexico.

Kyle designed a patch and a banner, and he helped Clovis resident Dave Sanders design a pin for the Lions Clubs of New Mexico.

The Lions Club needed a new Friendship Banner because Lions International changed its New Mexico districts this year, and their old banner showed three districts marked on the state of New Mexico. Kyle designed a friendship banner with a roadrunner logo and the new districts.

The collectible patch that Kyle designed is shaped like the state of New Mexico, too. It features a roadrunner who wears a Lions Club orange vest and a leader dog for the blind because the Lions Clubs help to raise money to train the leader dogs and to assist blind people.

Once Kyle had come up with an acceptable design, it had to be approved by the District Committee. Then it was sent to the state Multiple Council for approval. Then the design was sent to a banner manufacturer who made the pattern. Finally, it had to get approval from Lions International.

It took nearly six months from the time the drawing was made until the finished product was ready for distribution. The patches will be sold by the Lions Club Multiple Council to promote its Leader Dog for the Blind project in New Mexico.

The Friendship Banners are similar to the patches except that they do not have the dog on them. These banners

are usually given to visiting dignitaries from outside the state who visit Lions Club functions in the state. They are also available to members who collect and trade Lions Club memorabilia.

Kyle has been interested in the Lions Club projects for years. Both his father, Hal, and grandfather, Joe Helton of Texico, are Past District Governors of New Mexico Lions clubs. Hal and Joe are members of the Texico-Farwell Lions Club.

Kyle has been to Lions Club functions throughout New Mexico during the past 10 years, plus attending International Conventions in Australia; Denver, Miami and Dallas. Whenever possible, the Heltons have made Lions Club conventions into family vacations. Hal, Gloria, Kyle, Kimberly, and sometimes grandparents Joe and Dardanella Helton have all gone together.

Kyle has been trading Lions Club pins and patches for the past 4 - 5 years. He has quite a display of them by now.

During the past few years Kyle has taken art lessons from several teachers in the Clovis area. One that he really enjoyed was a computer art class at Clovis Community College. Last year he was even a helper in the art department for Terrell DeFoor.

Kyle won second place in the Curry County Fair's art show when he was about 9 years old with a drawing of Billy the Kid. Since then he has won first place awards at both the Curry County and Roosevelt County Fairs. He hopes to study art in the future.
