## $12 \%$ turn out for election

With all 254 Texas counties reporting, the proposed constitutional amendment that would clear the way for districts passed by a slim margin statewide - while the proposal to authorize bonds for college loans failed. On Proposition 1 to allow homestead exemptions and personal property taxation in Texas' new county education favor, and 346,826 or 42.6 percent against
On Proposition 2, 410,117 voters, or 50.42 percent voted against the measure, and 403,352 , or 49.58 percent voted in favor of the proposition which would have authorized $\$ 300$ million worth of loans for texas college students attending state colleges and universities
state: narrowly passing Proposition 1 and narrowly defeating Proposition 2.
"As usual on an amendment election, the turnout was
bad," said Parmer County Clerk Bonnie Warren. She noted that there is not normally a good turnout for elections to about $12 \%$ of the Parmer vonstitution. On this "In some counties l've talked to they had
said Mrs. Warren.

Not only was the election turn out low, some voters did not seem confident about the issues in this election. "lt's one of Proposition 1 - Exemptions to Taxes
In Parmer County, the residents narrowly favored 36 against. In Lazbuddie, 20 voted for it and 12 against. In Oklahoma Lane, 4 voted for it, and 12 voted against.

Proposition 2 - Bonds for College Loans
Countywide, Proposition 2 was defeated 256-170. In Farwell, 31 voters voted for it and 42 voted against it. In
Lazbuddie, 13 voted for the bonds, and 19 voted against. In Oklahoma Lane, 4 voted in favor, and 12 voted against it.

County Education District Special Ballot
The special ballot for the Parmer County Education District had just about the same number of respondents as the state wide election- a very small percentage of the possible voters.
The first two propositions, exemptions of property from the tax rolls, passed in Parmer County. The third proposition, which would allow for the taxation of personal property other which would allow for the taxation
than manufactured homes, failed.

Proposition 1-20\% Property Tax Exemption
In Parmer County, 245 voters favored Proposition 1, which would exclude up to $20 \%$ of the market value of a residence
homestead, and 179 were against it. In Farwell 42 favored it, and 27 opposed. In Lazbuddie 24 favored it, and 9 opposed. Proposition 2 - Tax Exemption for Disabled or Elderly
In Parmer County, 239 voters favored Proposition 2 which would exempt up to $\$ 10,000$ of the market value of a home of an elderly person or a handicapped person, and 163 voters
opposed it. In Farwell, 44 favored Proposition 2, and 25 opposed it. In Farwell, 44 favored Proposition 2, and
