## Cotton <br> harvest completed early

By Judy Pamper

This year's cotton harvest went faster and smoother than usual, according to local gin workers.
"Were about 15 days early," said JaDon Gallman of the Farwell Gin. He mentioned good weather and the quality of the cotton "If you slows down everything," he said.
Cotton bolls are harvested after the first frost when the bolls have opened and the fiber inside has had a chance to dry out. If there isn't a frost early enough, some farmers use
chemicals to kill the leaves and force the cotton bolls and open up and dry out.
The cotton is then harvested with a cotton stripper which separates the cotton from the stems and leaves. It is stored in the field in modules about the size of a semi - trailer. Then it is hauled to the gin where the cotton is separated from the
remaining seeds, leaves and other "trash." remaining seeds, leaves and other "trash
it is classified and stored until it is sold. Gallman estimated the harvest this year
than normal this year.

Kaunda Martin of Lariat Gin noted that they had to work fast and furious, but they got the job done. "'re never had as busy a year as The weather was just perfect" she said Normally there are several real windy days that keep th farmers from their work and several rainy ones that really slow down the progress of the harvest.
Martin said that Lariat's crop was sold out by the first week in January.
"Selling cotton isn't like selling other crops," said Martin She explained that farmers don't get paid for their cotton
immediately after they haul it to the gin. First it is ginned and then hauled to the compress where it is classified and stored.
All of the cotton that a farmer has harvested is averaged together. "Each bale weighs 480-500 lbs. - each weigh The final check the farmer receives depends average of the total cotton crop the farmer has brought to the gin
"It may be one to three weeks after the cotton is brought in before you can sell it," said Martin. "It's a long drawn out process, and it just takes time.
