## in Kane Texico youths attended the National FFA Conventio

 in Kansas City. On the way to the convention the FFA members enjoyed a trip to the Cowboy Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City. "We saw John Wayne, Marshall Dillonof stuff," said Justin Meeks.
About 26,400 people attended the convention including representatives of all 50 states, Puerto Rico, Washington D.C. and the Virgin Islands. The Texico FFA members were able to meet fellow FFA members engaged in quite a variety of agricultural activities. All shared a common bond o
agriculture, but not all of them did the same kinds of work Meeting other people involved in the same profession is always a big help in a profession.
