



You may question that, but remember that as vice president you spend a lot of time on the road making contacts, and picking up potential delegates. That's how Nixon got to be nominated in 1960.


#### Farwell Booster Club to meet Tuesday



On Election Day, the polling places will be: 101, Calvary Baptist Church in Friona; 210, Bovina EMS Building; 202, Friona Community Center; 203, Rhea Community Center; 301, Farwell Community Center; 302, Oklahoma Lane Methodist Church; 303, Bovina Ridgelea School; 401, Lazbuddie School; 402, Friona Fire Station.

Voters are asked to bring their voter registration cards with them to the polling place.

Locally, there is only one contested race. Incumbent Parmer County District Clerk Marjorie Watkins, a Democrat, is being challenged by Republican candidate Sandra Warren. Jack Young will be re-elected as District Judge, and

Bonnie Clayton will retain the County Judges' seat. Bonnie Warren will be re-elected as Parmer County Clerk. Anne Norton is unopposed for County Treasurer and Louise Hancock will be re- elected Justice of the Peace.

At the state level, there are many contested races including the race for Governor. Democratic incumbent Ann Richards is opposed by Republican George W. Bush.

Republican Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison is being challenged

by Richard Fisher, Democrat. Rep. Larry Combest is unopposed.

State Rep. Pete Laney is running unopposed, as is State Sen. Teel Bivins.

#### Texico

The polls will be open in Texico from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. mst. in the Texico Community Center next to City Hall.

Pleasant Hill voters cast their ballots at the Pleasant Hill Fire Department.

The ballot for New Mexico voters is full of highly contested races. Incumbent Gov. Bruce King and Lt. Gov. Patricia Madrid are opposed by the Republican candidates Gary Johnson and Walter Bradley.

U.S. Sen. Jeff Bingaman, incumbent Democrat is being challenged by Republican candidate Colin McMillan.

Locally, the race for State Representative, District 64 (Pleasant Hill) is between Mrs. Jerry W. Crook, Republican, and Tom Hartley, Democrat.

The position for State Representative, District 66 (including Texico) is between Democrat Travis Foster and incumbent Republican Earlene Roberts.

District Magistrate Judge Richard Burke is running

unopposed. The position of County Tax Assessor is between Democrat Margie Crooks, a Texico resident, and Republican Eddy Hiner. Incumbent County Sheriff Mike Jackson is being chal-

lenged by Democrat Wesley Myers.

#### **Texico Schools issue** accountability report

Texico Schools have issued their annual accountability eport for the 1993-94 school year. Highlights include:

Drop-out percentages continue to stay well below state levels. Texico's is about 2.5 percent, while the statewide average is about 8 percent.

- Student breakdowns include: 32 percent Hispanic, 62 percent Anglo, 6 percent Black.

- A follow-up on this year's graduatees shows: 4.5 percent at vocational schools; 13.7 percent in fulltime employment; 68.1 percent in college; 13.7 percent, other.

- Teachers' salaries are above the state average but below the national norms. Administrative costs per student are well-above the state average. Expenditures per student are above the state average.

The net operating budget included: teachers, 71.6 percent; administration, 3.6 percent; support personnel, 14.3 percent; non-certified, 10.4 percent.

- Revenue sources were: state, 93.1 percent; local, 0.5 percent; federal, 6.4 percent.





Notice of Rate Change Request Relating to Irrigation Interruption Credit And Recovery of Power Costs

Notice is hereby given that Bailey County Electric Cooperative, Inc. (the "Utility") intends to change rates for electric utility service by implementing an irrigation interruption credit applicable to irrigation customers who agree by contract that their service may be interrupted and by revising the Utility's power cost recovery factor ("PCRF"), effective November 15, 1994, or as soon thereafter as may be permitted by law. The proposed changes are not expected to have any effect on the revenues of the Utility. The changes are applicable to all electric utility service, all areas served by the Utility, all customer classes, and all customers.

Copies of the proposed revised tariffs, schedules and supporting testimony and other pertinent data may be inspected in the office of the Utility located at 305 East Avenue B, Muleshoe, Texas 79347, and at the office of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, 7800 Shoal Creek Boulevard, Austin, Texas 78757. The Utility's wholesale power supplier currently allows a credit on the Utility's wholesale power bills in exchange for the ability to interrupt a portion of the Utility's irrigation load. The Utility's existing retail rates, which were established before the wholesale interruption credit became available, apply the interruption credit to all customers of the Utility regardless of whether such customers have agreed that their service may be interrupted. This occurs because the Utility's power cost is reduced by the amount of the irrigation interruption credit from the Utility's wholesale power supplier and the reduced level of power cost is flowed through to all consumers through the PCRF.

The rate revisions are proposed for the purposes of: (1) establishing a tariff authorizing payment of an interruptible credit to irrigators who agree by contract to allow their service to be interrupted, and (2) allocating the irrigation interruption credit received from the Utility's wholesale power supplier to the irrigation customers who have agreed to allow interruption of their load in the event the Utility's wholesale power supplier requires the Utility to shed load. Irrigation customers who agree to have their services interrupted should receive the benefit of the interruptible credit from the Utility's wholesale power supplier. The proposed charges will not increase or decrease the revenues of the Utility, however, the proposed changes are expected to increase the revenues derived from all customer classes other than irrigation.

Persons who wish to intervene in or comment upon these proceedings should notify the Commission as soon as possible, as an intervention deadline will be imposed. 

"He's already helping our band," said band director Pat Henry. "He's a motivated kid who wants to excel."


