is needed. And current policies toward the Palestinian militants not working

who feel there is no other way to who feel there is no other way to
gain their end, which they consider honorable: a home.
There are other ways to deal with
terrorism, of course. But most are terrorism, of course. But most are
reactions, not actions. The better reactions, not actions. The better
way, I feel, is to take action at the root of the problem. In the case of the Palestinians, that means a home is needed. Until that happens, I'm
