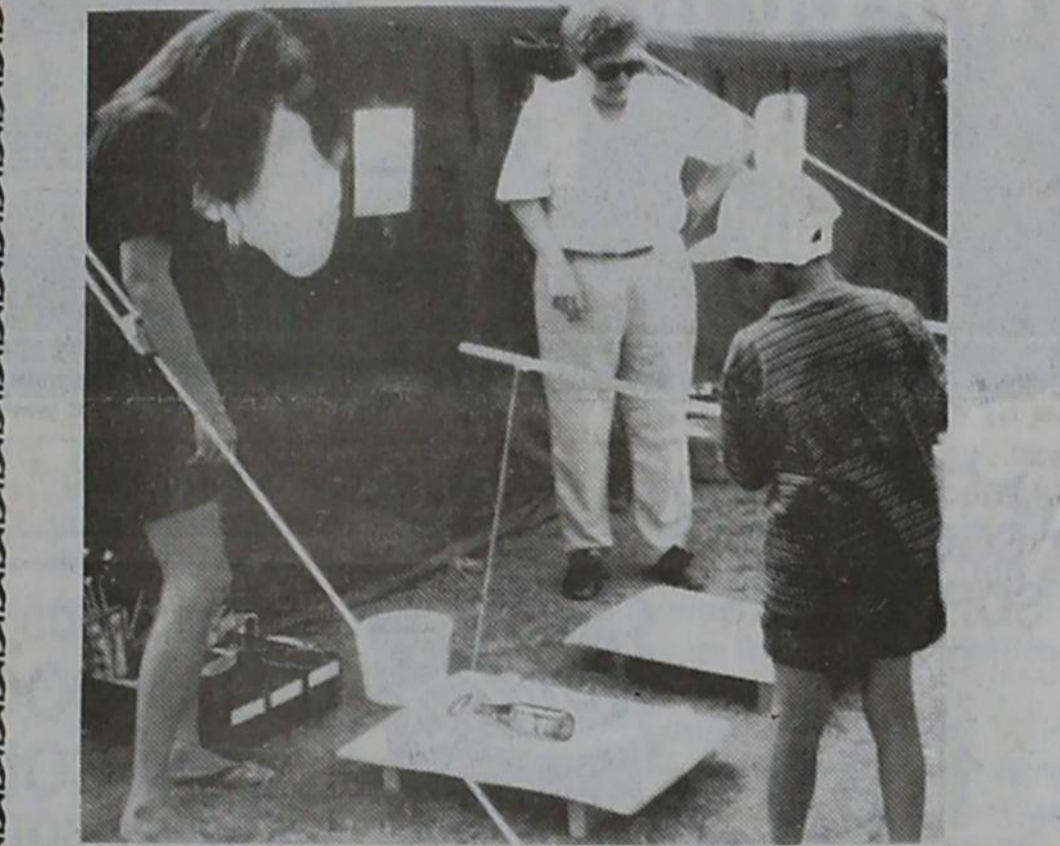
The Carnival and Picnic made for a very fun afternoon and evening for the families that attended.



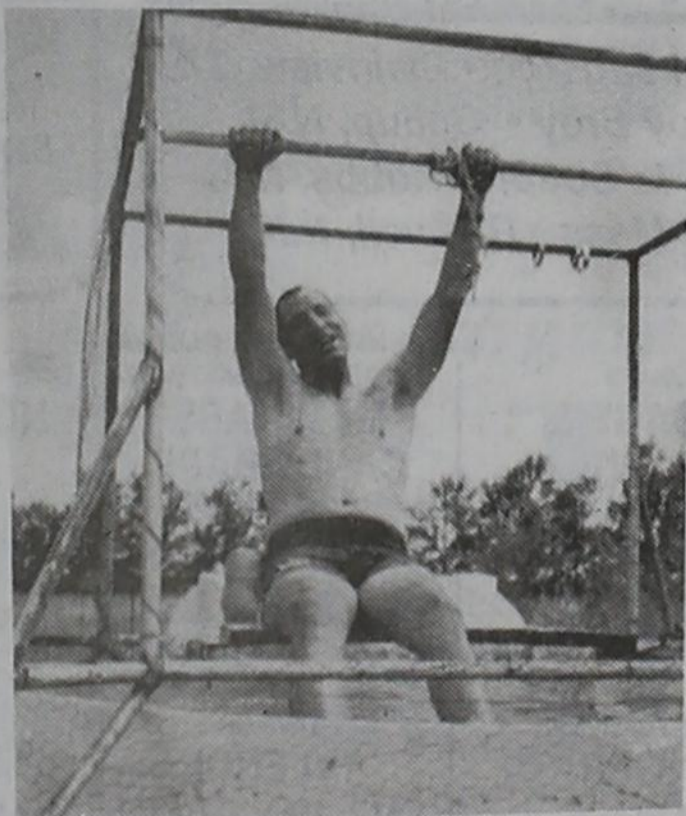

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## Speed zone study asked

The Farwell City Council voted 3-1 Tuesday to request the state highway department take a speed zone study of Avenue A and stripe the parking lanes on the highway.

Opposed was Jerry Stover.

The vote came after a discussion with Ted Copeland, traffic engineer for the state highway department.

Copeland was asked to come here after the council's discussions the past several months on whether or not to ban parking along the highway between 1st and 3rd streets.

Copeland said about 5 or 6 accidents have occurred in that three block stretch over a 3-year period. He said it seems to be increasing, noting that more traffic comes to Farwell because of the lottery.

Councilman Martin Kube asked him if parallele parking has been a cause of accidents. Copeland said he had no way of knowing.

Asked for his suggestion on how to solve the problem of whether to ban parking, Copeland suggested the council call a public hearing, have everyone air their views and then act whichever way the citizens feel.

Local businessman Lee Hutchins is opposed to the no parking idea because he has a warehouse in the 100 block of Avenue A and uses that entrance (the back of his building is blocked).

Hutchins suggested that the highway lanes be marked better and some parking be reserved for loading zones.

Copeland said he is a proponent of lower speed limits. He noted that if the lanes are narrowed, it will slow traffic down.

He pointed out that Farwell has several speed zones along Avenue A and they need to be reduced in number.

He indicated that if the state does the speed zone study there is an excellent chance the speed limits will be lowered.

In other business, the council:

-- Approved applying for a 3-year federal grant to hire a part-time police officer.

This is the program where the government pays part of each year on a declining scale.

Mayor Jimmie Mace said that due to the economy and other factors he doesn't favor having a second fulltime police officer.

-- Received two bids for the annual street work, to cover 23 blocks this year. Eastwood, Clovis, bid \$29,897. Lipham, Hereford, bid \$30,135. Eastwood's bid was taken.

-- Approved a building permit for Bruce Pemberton, 504 3rd St., for a fence.

-- Approved a variance request for a mobile home on the back of the Don Malcome

restaurant property. -- Discussed the proposed budget. Last year, the city overspent by about \$11,000.

A major expense this year will be a new well at the southwest corner of Farwell.

Water Supt. Dee Hammitt reported that water levels have dropped and the current wells are not pumping water as well as they have been (an example, from 500 gallons a

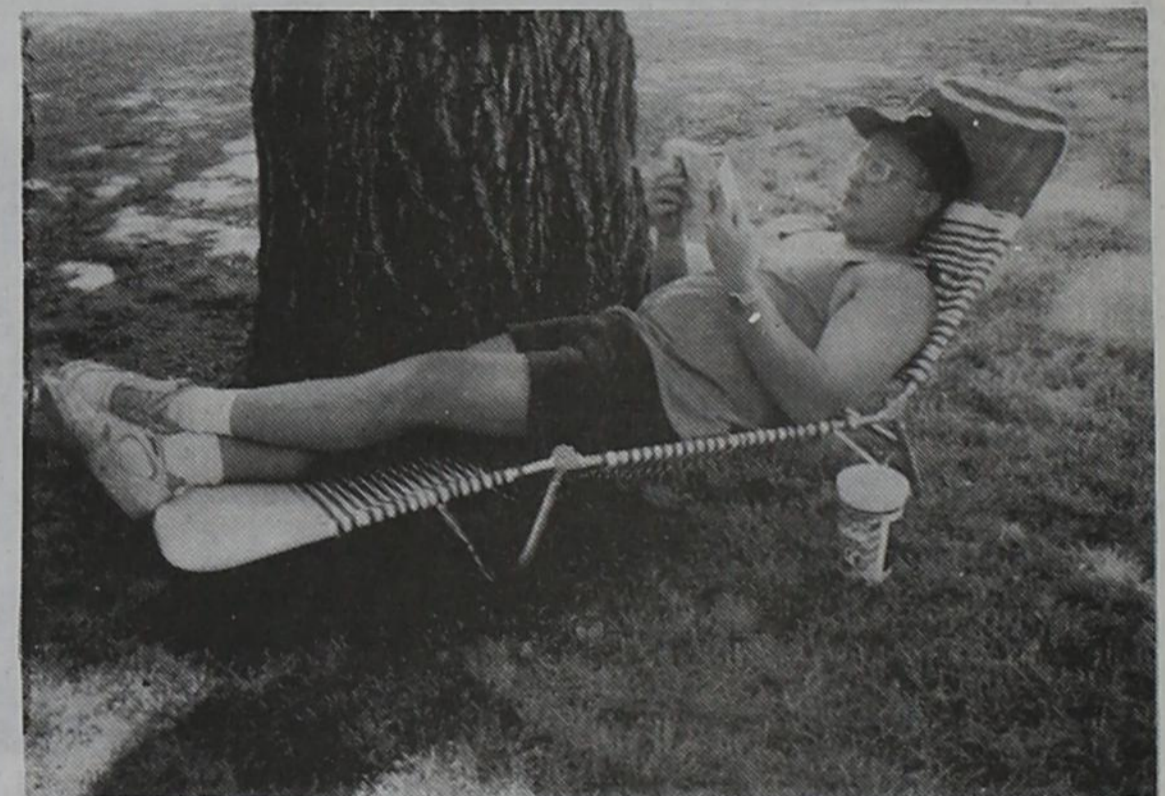
minute to 400 gallons a minute).

A Farwell man was listed in critical condition in Lubbock earlier this week after an explosion at the Excel plant in Friona.

Santiago Lucio, 60, along with two Clovis workers, were hurt.

Officials believe natural gas may be the cause for the explosion but a final judgement won't be issued until federal officials check. The explosion occurred

The "jail" will be open from the end of the parade until 5 p.m.

Parmer County Crimestoppers also invite anyone who wishes to join the Crimestoppers program to talk to one of its members at BTM or attend one of their meetings.

**Farwell Band to participate in BTM parade**

The Farwell Convalescent Center, which opened Aug. 9, 1976, is located at 305 Fifth St. The phone number is 481-9027. It has 75 employees in various departments.

The convalescent center's owner is the Farwell Hospital District. The Good Samaritan Society manages the center. Current administrator is Ron Kilgore.

Presently, health care is an issue concerning every individual regardless of age. At the center, the theme is "In Christ's Love, Everyone Is Someone." Based on this Christian philosophy, the center is dedicated to helping elderly persons, who are served with respect, dignity and love.

Good friends are always around for support, reassurance and for a kind word. And that's no different at the center, with quality staff ranging from social services, activities, dietary, environmental services, and nursing.

Services offered include 24 hour licensed nursing care, physical therapy, and recently the opening of Jericho Road - the only licensed Alzheimer's Unit in the Texas Panhandle.

These services, including many others, allow the center to offer top quality nursing care to its residents and top quality training to its staff.

The 1990s saw the opening of Heritage Square Garden Homes, adjoining the center, which featured independent living units for senior citizens. Six units are filled, with three more to open this summer.

The center's history started with the Farwell Development Company organized on March 5, 1974. It was formed as a non-profit group in order to attract industry and development to Farwell. The first item considered was the construction of a nursing home.

In an election held on June 24, 1975, the Hospital District was authorized, and the issuance of \$750,000 in bonds was approved by voters for construction of a nursing home. Ground-breaking occurred on Jan. 27, 1976.

The original Farwell Hospital District board of directors were Don Williams, president; Caroline Anderson, secretary; R.W. Anderson, Charles Aycock, Jim Berry, Prentice Mills, W.T. Perry, Claude Rose Jr. and Maxine Williams.

Current board members are Jerry Monk, president; Tom Nichols, Mike Ratke, Joe Haseloff, Peggy Sudderth, Troy Christian, Bert Williams and Jack Allen Kirkland.

## Phillips to entertain at fund-raiser

Charlie "Sugartime" Phillips and the area's top western band, the "Sugartimers," will be playing a benefit dance at the Clovis Holiday Inn July 29 at 9 p.m. cdt.

Tickets are \$5 in advance or \$6 at the door. Tickets are available at Rip's Western Wear, Stalene Drugs, Hughes Auto Parts, Beauty Box and Cribbs Western Wear.

This is the 7th annual benefit dance for the Farwell Convalescent Center at Border Town Days.

The five member band consists of Jimmy Young, fiddle; Vick Ashmead, steel guitar; Frank Hardcastle, lead guitar; Chet Calcote, base guitar, and Ted Czahowske, drummer. Young and Calcote once played with the legendary Bob Willis and the "Texas Playboys." Young is a member of the Western Swing Hall of Fame.

Phillips became famous for writing and recording the No. 1 hit in 1958 "Sugartime." His original version was recorded at the Norman Petty Studios in Clovis. Buddy Holly played the lead guitar on the original recording. It hit the top of the country and western charts, but the McGuire Sisters' pop version gave it worldwide recognition.

Phillips was a teen-ager in Farwell High School when he wrote "Sugartime" while driving a tractor on the family farm. Since then, he has recorded a number of country and western hits. In the 1960s, every record he made was on the national charts. He has performed on the Grand Ole Opry and toured with Johnny Cash, Willie Nelson, Brenda Lee, Jim Reeves and Marty Robbins.

## Area gets needed moisture

Area farmers are breathing a sigh of relief this week thanks to some much needed rain in the region.

Sherley-Anderson Pittman Grain Elevators in Farwell reported 1.65" in their gauge after the storm that passed through the city on July 18.

Sherley-Anderson in Lariat measured rain totals for three days. Totals for July 16 were .08" and .45" for July 17. July 18 totals measured .54". Yolanda McFarland also reported that the rain gauge at her home in Farwell measured 1.51" after the rain on Tuesday night.

Sherley-Anderson in Lazbuddie reported .20" at the elevators. This area probably got a little more rain to the south of the elevators. Some parts of Lazbuddie didn't get any rain at all.

Although this storm raged through with high winds and "beat force" rains, it didn't leave behind any reported damage.

## Courthouse annex to be requested

Reports are that the Frona Chamber of Commerce will again approach the Parmer County Commissioners this month about possibly placing a courthouse annex in Frona.

The Chamber worked on this project last year but in August the commissioners voted 3-1 to table the request until the 1995-96 budget discussions by a 3-1 vote.

Opposed to tabling it was commissioner Johnny Mars, whose district contains the bulk of Frona.

Last year, the commissioners were looking at about \$40,000 to \$50,000 to rent a building and install county personnel there, including about

\$12,000 for a state-mandated computer for the county tax assessor's office.

But they also reviewed a proposal which would have been less expensive by renting offices at the Federal Credit Union office in Frona for three days a week.

Also, several county services already are offered in Frona.

Last year, when the Chamber made its request, the county commissioners were looking at some large expenditures - a new roof for the courthouse and jail, mortar work to the outside of the courthouse, and a state-mandated computer hook-up.

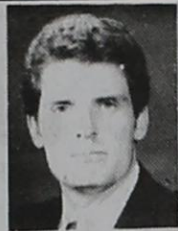
