The vote came after discussion with Ted Copeland, discussion with Ted Copeland,
traffic engineer for the state highway department.
Copeland was asked to come here after the council's discussions the past several months on whether or not to ban parking along the highway between 1st and 3rd streets. Copeland said about 5 or 6 accidents have occurred in that three block stretch over a 3 -year period. He said it seems to be increasing, noting that more traffic comes to Farwell because of the lottery. Councilman Martin Kube asked him if parallele parking Copeland said he had no way of knowing.
