Tornado slams Friona

A devastating tornado twisted its way through Friona early last Friday evening. Major property damage occurred at Hi-Pro Feeds and Excel.

Several trailer homes also were destroyed on the south side of town. The one serious injury reported occurred to E. M. Bailey, 68, whose trailer home was destroyed by the twister. He is in Amarillo's Northwest Texas Hospital and listed in critical but stable condition with leg and internal injuries.

Other than Bailey's, all injuries reported were in the minor category. Bovina Fire Chief Richard Bonham saw the storm before it became a tornado. A quick rain and hail fell on his community, and then heavy winds began to blow as the storm headed northwest along Highway 60.

Bonham said power went off in Friona just as the weather bulletin warning was being broadcast on TV. And because there was no electricity, the sirens couldn't be blown as a further warning. But thanks to the sound of the storm and the feel it was still daylight, folks were able to take cover.

Electricity was restored Saturday. Excel and its environs took the first full blast of the twister. Billy McIntosh, of Texico, was in his pickup crossing the Santa Fe tracks to go to work at Excel when the twister struck. He said the back of his pickup was lifted off the ground, then put back. He wasn't hurt.

McIntosh said a moving train that had some of its cars blown over. Most of the cars moved off the tracks were empty and at the rear of the train. Vonnie McIntosh, Billy's wife, said her brother-in-law, Jerry McIntosh, of Farwell, was in the Excel tool warehouse when a large noise was heard. The workers moved to the other side of the warehouse - just in time. They avoided the twister which hit - lifting part of the building. Several cattle were killed.

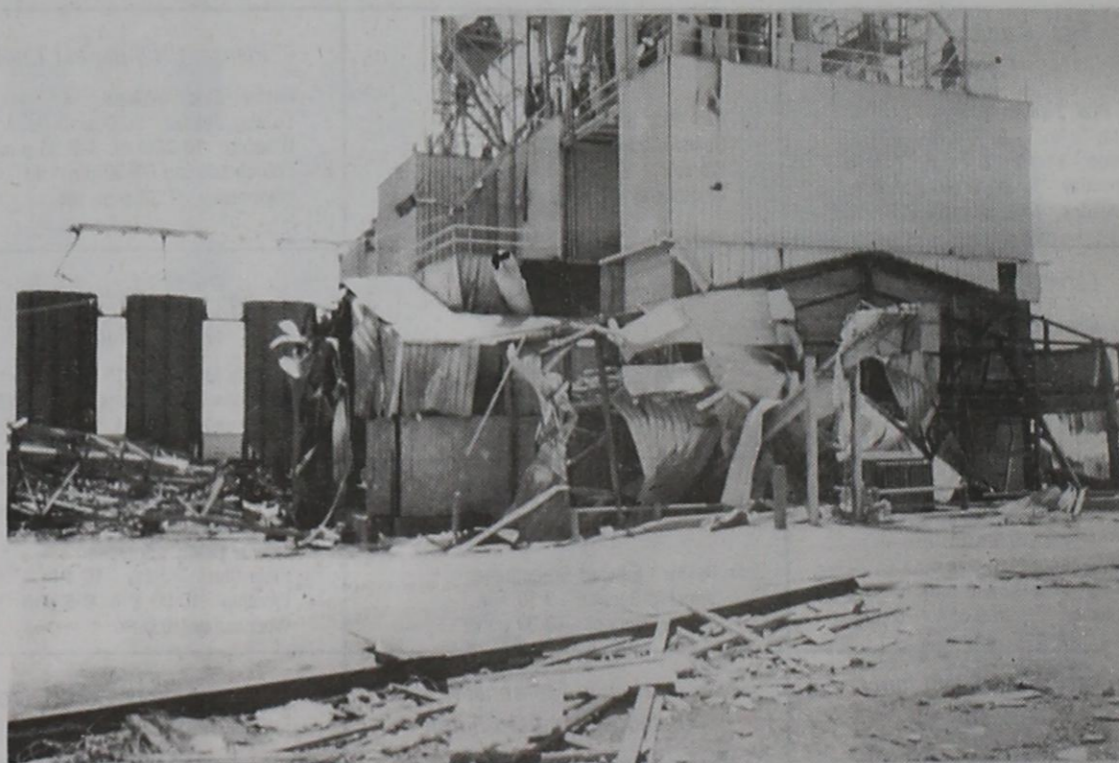
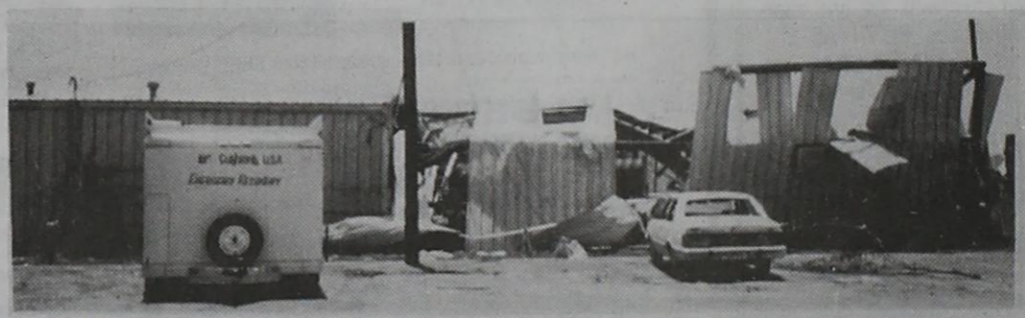
The tornado then moved into the souther part of Friona, destroying several trailer houses. Teresa Ancira, of Farwell, said a trailer house belonging to her brother, David Romero, was blown apart. Fortunately, his family, and that of his brother-in-law, Eddie Mendoza, had taken cover in a nearby cellar, avoiding injury. All told, four trailer houses in that area were destroyed. Two horses were killed. The homeless families are seeking places to stay.

The city cemetery and water treatment plant were also damaged severely. Friona Wheat Growers lost a grain silo and fertilizer building.

As the tornado neared Hi-Pro, employees gathered in the basement, a wise move considering the damage down at this facility.

Farwell Schools may have 'home rule'

The Texas Legislature has finished its sessions, and changes in public education have been made.

The most high profile change involves the no pass, no play policy. It has been shortened from six weeks to three weeks (a one-time deal). Also, athletes can continue to practice with their teams during the three weeks even though they can't play in regular games.

Farwell School Supt. Richard Boothby said he supported that change. "I think it's a good move," he said.

Another major change the Legislature approved involved allowing schools to become home-rule districts.

Boothby said he will recommend to the school board that it go this route. He said it will give local school districts some more freedom, but not that much. Certain state and federal laws stay in effect, such as those dictating days, hours and credits.

Another change involves

Miss Border Town Days Queen Contestants' Rules

1. Entries are open to any girl residing in Texico or Farwell school districts and attending Texico or Farwell High School next year. Those who are attending Texico or Farwell High School but live outside the school districts shall be starting their third consecutive school year at one of these schools.

2. She cannot be over age 18.

3. Entrant must be of good health and of good moral character.

4. There will be a scholarship awarded to the queen upon completion of high school and enrollment to further her education or training.

A. She will be given a certificate at the park when she is crowned Queen during Border Town Days activities.

B. The scholarship account will be set up as Border Town Day's Queen with her name and the names of the President and Secretary of Border Town Days.

C. The scholarship must be used within 3 years of completion of high school.

D. The Queen must attend a college, university, trade or vocational school.

E. The scholarship check will be made payable to school or choice of the Queen.

F. The Queen will forfeit the scholarship if she does not maintain a C average through high school, further her education after completion of high school or complete her term as Queen.

G. Interest built up in this account will be used for future scholarships.

5. There will be an automatic forfeit if the Queen does not complete high school, transfers to another school, marries or becomes pregnant during her year as Queen.

6. If substitute serves as Queen, then she cannot be contestant that year, but will be eligible for the next year.

8. Each year the Bordertown Days Queen Committee has the right to set guidelines for judging, activities and prizes.

teacher salaries. The bulk of this good news for teachers involves beginning salaries, raised from the current \$17,000 a year to \$18,500 (and going to \$20,000 in 1997), and the most experienced teachers.

The teacher appraisal system also has changed. A factor has been added dealing with student achievement. "This will put more pressure on teachers," said Boothby.

The annual school calendar was not changed, mainly because many school districts already had approved their calendar for the 1995-96 school year while the Legislature was still in session. However, Boothby said the Legislature may add two days for the 1996-97 school term.

Try to rob someone and have them defend themselves - then sue!

It's not your fault. It's never your fault. It's the dreaded "them."

My favorite is what I used to call the Good Samaritan law. That's when you see an accident, you do what you can to help the injured persons. Regardless of what occurs, you were considered a "Good Samaritan" and would

be held harmless.

Forget that one.

Today, folks have been known to sue "Good Samaritans."

I guess we need to call them "Bad Samaritans."

And there's that nifty school of thought that blames everything on the news media.

Nasty, nasty news media.

A key reason that the Cubs haven't been in the World Series since 1908 is a lack of good pitching.



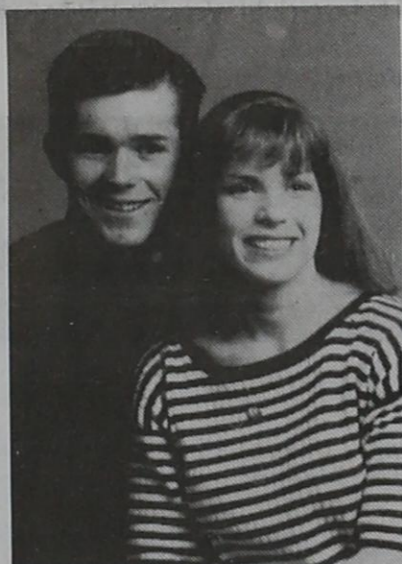
### Chilton, Murray to wed

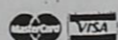

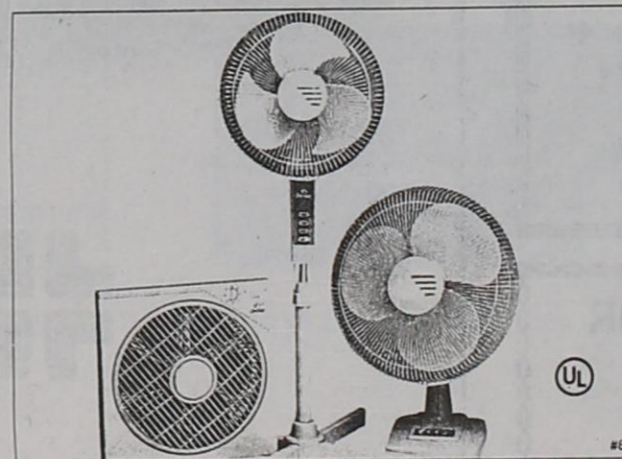

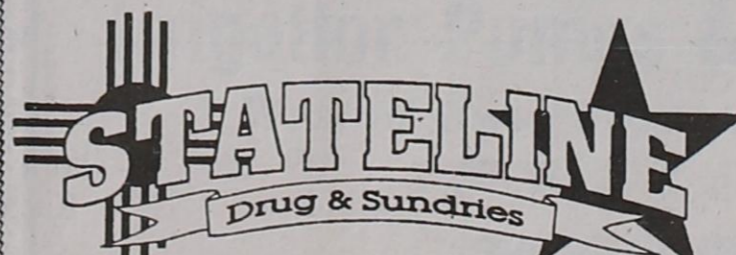

The Hi-Pro facilities that were damaged will be rebuilt, said company officials. The feed production plant is one of the largest in the nation.

Then the tornado hit buildings at the Friona airport, causing major devastation.

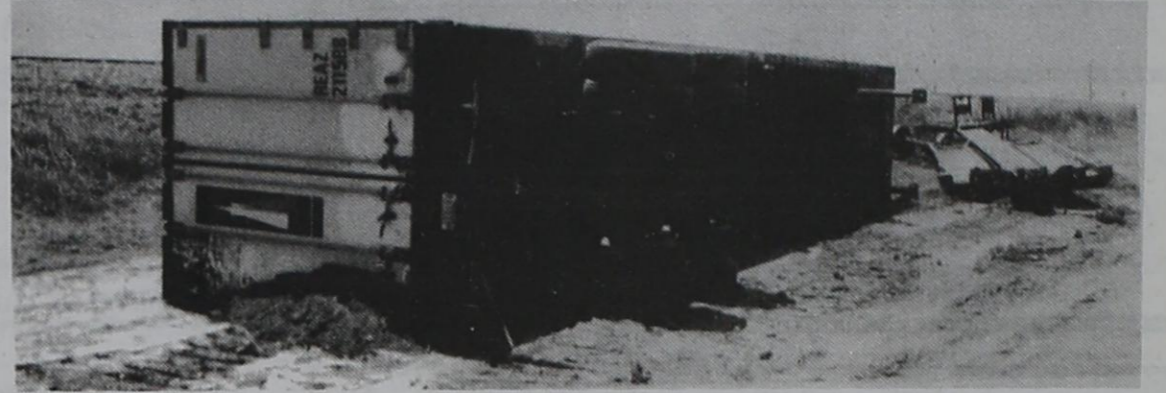
Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams thanked all the area police and fire departments, ranging from Deaf Smith County to Curry County, which responded. "All did an excellent job," he said. "The cooperation was excellent."

Williams said no looting or vandalism was reported. He noted the large number of police on hand.

Meanwhile, twisters slammed into other area towns, including Olton, Nazareth, Dimmitt and Happy. Several homes were damaged in Dimmitt but the most serious tornado damage occurred in Friona. Damage estimated from Friona were around \$15 million, with Hi-Pro about \$12 million of that total.

It also has been a busy time for tornadoes the past month in Lazbuddie.

First, a twister struck at Easter Grain. Then reports of other property damage were received two weeks ago. And a spokesman for the Lazbuddie Volunteer Fire Department said 7 twisters were counted in that area Sunday afternoon. Sprinklers were overturned but otherwise no major damage was reported.

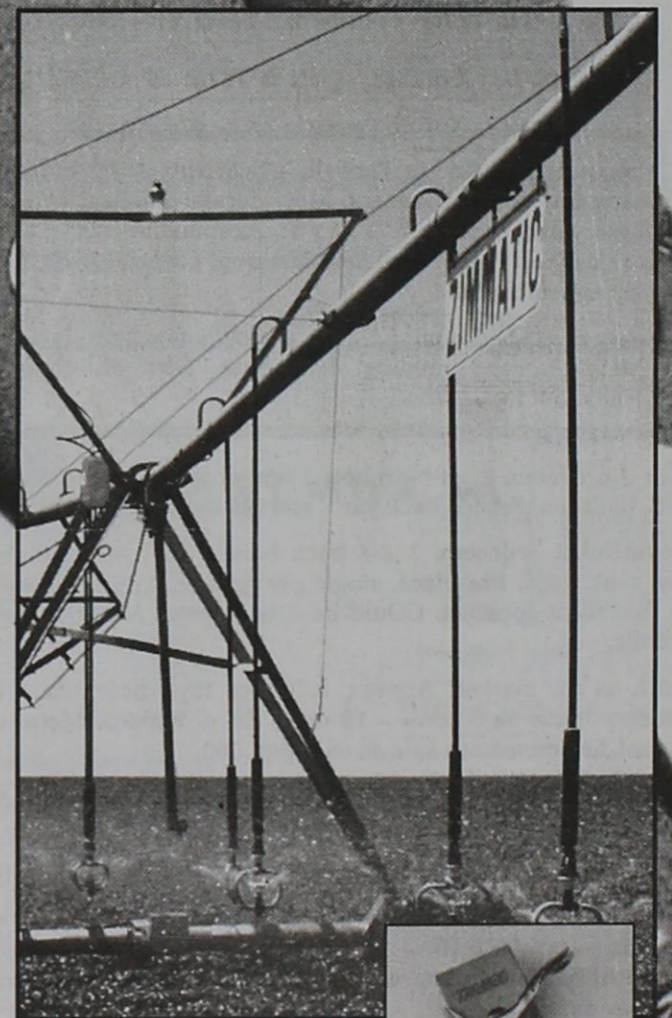
