## Farwell Schools earn very high test scores

The Farwell School District earned very high scores in the recent Texas Academic Excellence Indicator System, reports discuss the test results was held Monday at the superinten dent's office.
Texas gives its schools four ratings, in descending value exemplary, recognized, academically acceptable and aca demically unacceptable.
Farwell Schools received "exemplary" status for the junior high school and high school, and recognized status for the elementary school.
Last year, Farwell High was the only one of the three campuses to gain the exemplary status. Farwell will receive $\$ 1,500$ from the state ( $\$ 500$ per school) for its excellent rankings.
"'m very proud of our scores," said Supt. Richard Boothby. "And I want to thank our principals, teachers and staff for their outstanding work to gain these high ratings."
Killough said special mention should be made of the three campus coordinators "who did a great job" -- Patsy Camp, high school; Kay Ray, junior high, and Robin Gregory, ele mentary.
"There's a lot of work that goes into achieving these scores," added Killough. "The teachers did a great job."
