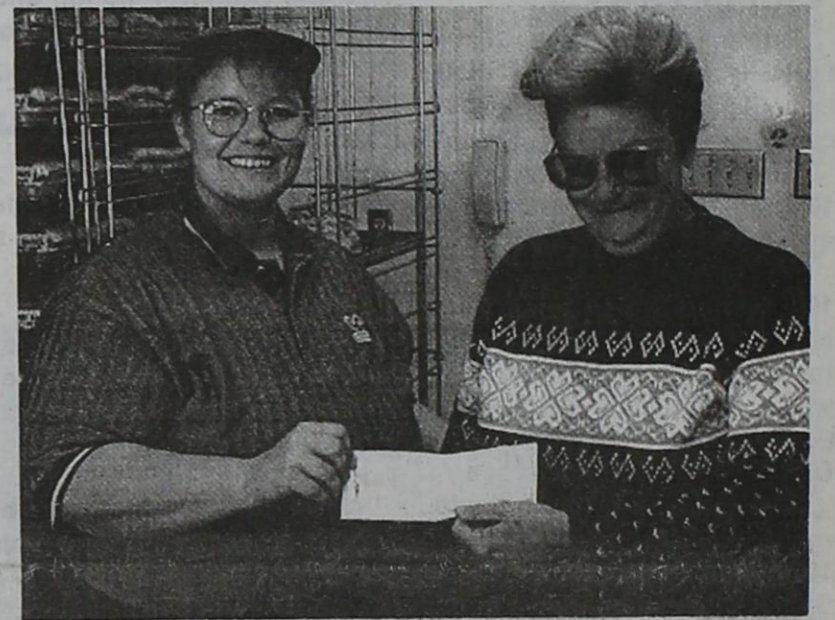
The contest is now three-quarters over toward its 12-week run. And this may have been the week that Kirk Saul looks back on as the key to his victory.

But Saul managed a big "9" last week to shoot ahead, while Mrs. Smith only got five right -- a 4-point swing.

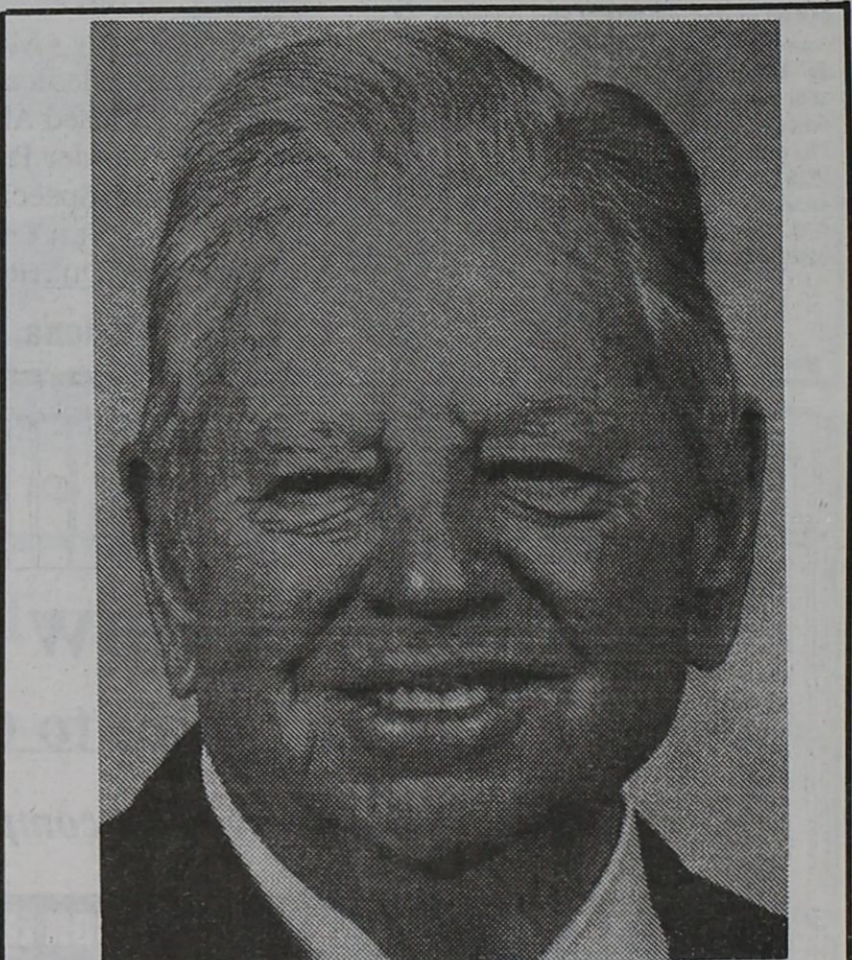

It's located in Hansford County, Texas, between Gruber and Spearman. There's a ghost town there that is called "Farwell."

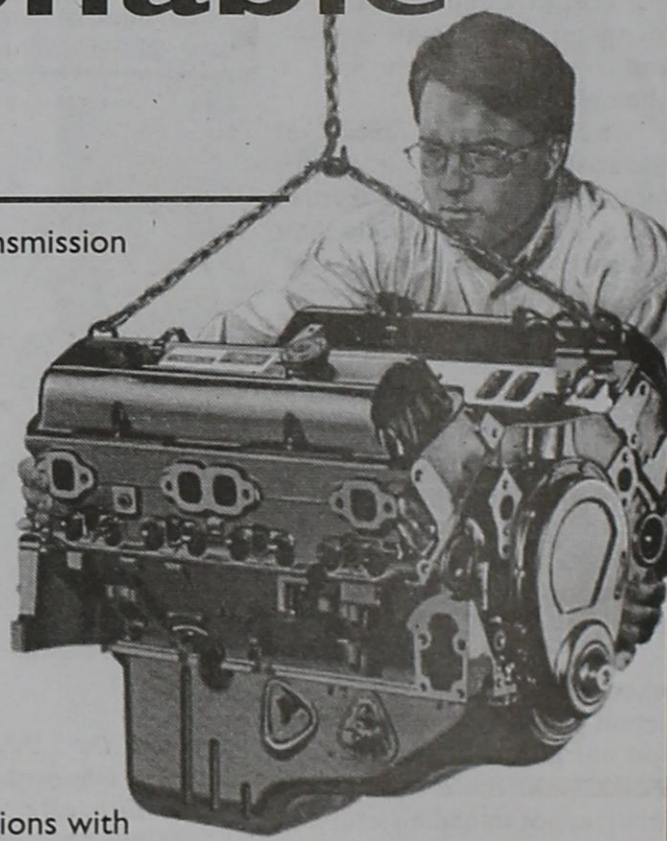

# Parmer County voters go to the polls

1. The amendment to revise the provisions for filling of a vacancy in the office of governor or lieutenant governor. Divides the executive and legislative branches by preventing a lieutenant governor who is called upon to fill the office of governor from holding both offices at the same time.

For 222, against 89.

2. The amendment relating to the making of advances under a reverse mortgage. Conforms state law on reverse mortgages to federal law. Allows elderly homeowners to supplement their income with the equity they have built up in their homesteads.

For 151, against 162.

3. The amendment to eliminate duplicative, executed, obsolete, archaic and ineffective provisions of the Texas Constitution. The Texas Constitution becomes easier to use while no substantive changes are made.

For 223, against 83.

4. The amendment exempting property owned by institutions engaged primarily in public charitable functions from ad valorem taxation. Clarifies whether charities that receive tax exemptions may engage in auxiliary activities without endangering their tax exempt status.

For 180, against 132.

5. The amendment allowing state employees to receive compensation for serving as a member of a school district, city or other local government district. Increases the pool of qualified candidates for local elections.

For 133, against 180.

Unless rejected by either the House of Senate, the commission's recommendation would become final. This would do away with the governor's ability to veto judicial pay raises and increases in lawmakers' pensions. This amendment also sets bad precedent by granting an appointed commission limited lawmaking authority.

10. The amendment to provide that the commissioner of health and human services serves at the pleasure of the governor. Increases the accountability of the commissioner of health and human services.

For 111, against 198.

11. The amendment permitting a political subdivision to purchase property and casualty insurance from a mutual insurance company. Creates competition that could result in lower premiums.

For 176, against 127.

12. The amendment to exempt from ad valorem taxation leased motor vehicles not held by the lessee primarily to produce income. Provides leased vehicles with the same tax treatment as personally owned vehicles.

For 118, against 183.

13. The amendment providing for the issuance of \$400 million in general obligation bonds to finance educational loans to students. The state, which had \$11.7 billion in bond debt as of Aug. 31, 1998, should not provide public loans in competition with the private sector at favorable interest rates only available to the state when the private sector can meet the demand.

For 182, against 119.

14. The amendment providing that a state board or commission be governed by a board composed of an odd number of three or more members. Minimizes voting ties and provides flexibility to lawmakers in creating boards and commissions.

15. The amendment permitting the conversion of separate property to community property. Provides tax relief to spouses who convert property.

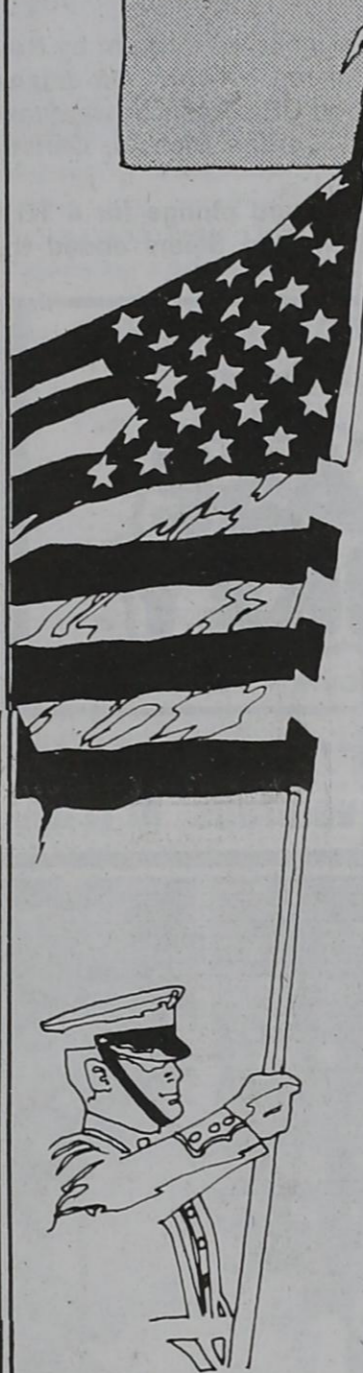
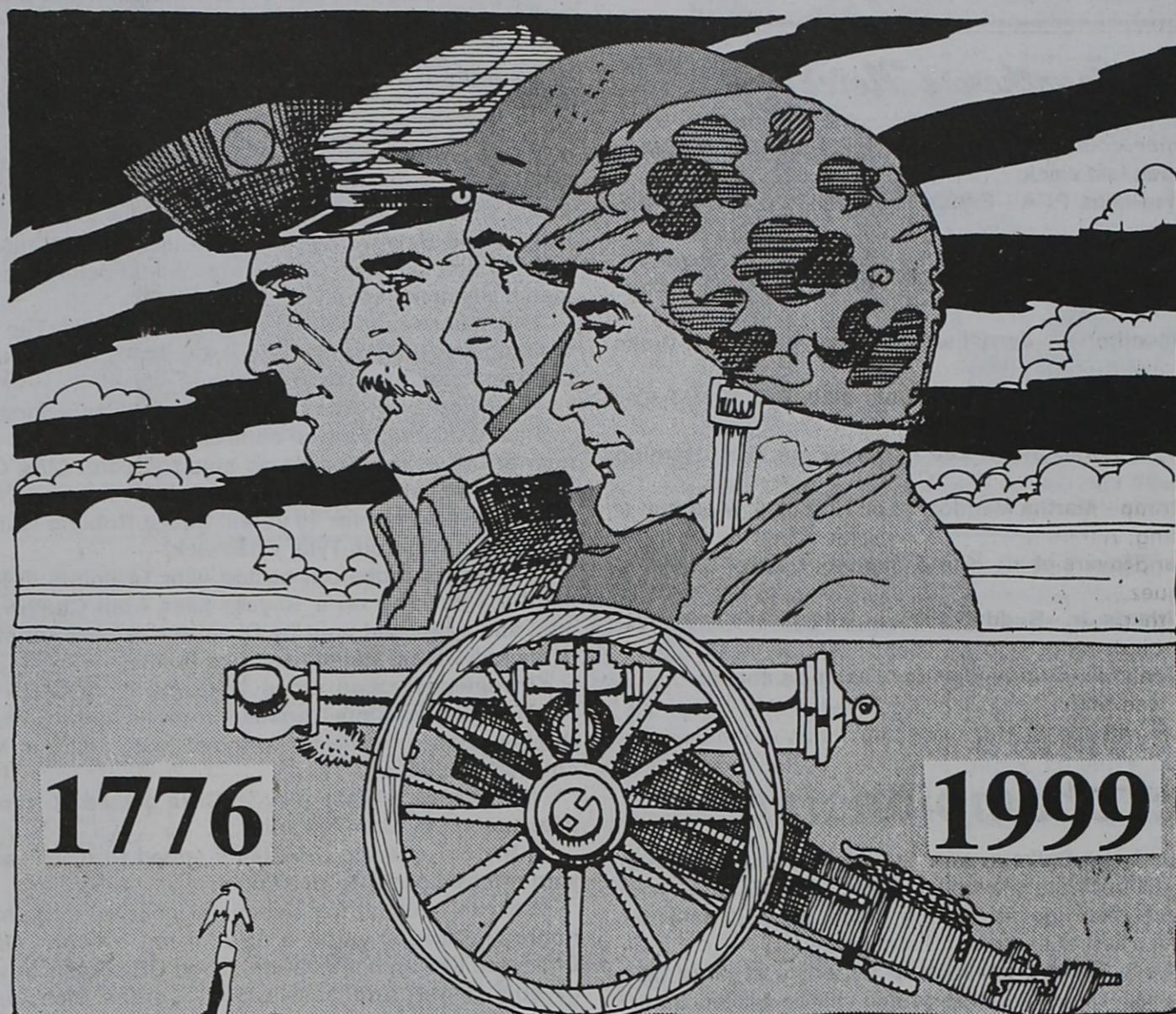

The Farwell Steers stayed in strong contention for a state playoff berth by soundly whipping Olton's Mustangs, 33-0, in an away game last Friday.

## Lady Spikers win district championship

The Texico Lady Spikers won the district championship with a straight 3-set victory over Jal, 15-11, 15-6, 15-11. It was sweet revenge for Texico since Jal had defeated them a few days earlier in regular district play.

The 18-4 Lady Spikers advance to regionals at Mora (220 miles from here). The regional H games will be played Saturday. Texico plays Cimarron at 10 a.m., and Jal plays Mora at noon. The two winners -- both of whom advance to the state tournament -- play for the regional title at 6 p.m.

The state tournament will be held at Moriarty and Albuquerque Nov. 10-13.

Against Jal, Kristen Roberts had 15 kills and Elizabeth Richards had 18. Michele Littlejohn had 5 aces. Callie Rucker helped on 5 blocks. Jennifer Roberts and Rucker had 17 assists each.

In the district semi-final, Texico whipped Fort Sumner, 15-6, 15-7, 15-8. Richards had 12 kills and Kristen Roberts 10. Rucker helped on 5 blocks. Kristen Roberts had 6 aces and Littlejohn 5. Rucker had 16 assists.

On Oct. 23, Texico had lost to Jal 12-15, 14-16, 12-15. Kristen Roberts had 11 kills, Richards 9 and Ashlie Loven 6. Littlejohn had 4 aces. Rucker had 12 assists, and Jennifer Roberts 17.

The Steers, 3-1 in district and 7-2 overall, finish regular season play tonight (Friday) at 7:30 by hosting Bovina. Here's how the playoff picture looks: The top three teams in Farwell's district go into the playoffs. The current standings show Sundown at 4-0, Farwell and Hale Center at 3-1, Bovina at 2-2, and Olton and Morton at 0-4.

Sundown has earned its playoff spot. If Farwell beats Bovina, the Steers are in the playoffs, too.

If Farwell loses to Bovina, there is still a chance the Steers will be in the playoffs. That would occur if Hale Center also loses, creating a 3-way tie for 2nd place between Farwell, Bovina and Hale Center. All three teams would have 3-2 records. In that scenario, a coin toss would determine which two teams advance (along with Sundown).

This has been a special year for the Steers. The whitewash of Olton was the fourth shutout thrown by the team. They also blanked Petersburg, Crosbyton and Kress.

The Olton game was played during Friday's rains. Against Olton, Farwell controlled the ball most of the first quarter but neither team was able to score. Clint Corn had a nice run behind blocks by Matt Schwertner and Clint Patterson. Corn also ran for 15 yards. Shane Roberts caught a pass for a first down from Tyler Chadwick.

The Steers broke out on top with 14 points in the second quarter -- scoring on a 10-yard pass from Chadwick to Roberts, and a blocked punt by Chadwick. A pass for extra points to Manuel Garcia added two more points.

On defense, good stops were made by Derek Goetsch, Paul Franse and Cade Christian. Roberts had a QB sack. Grant Opliger had a tackle for a 4-yard loss. Jourdan Nichols recovered a fumble.

On offense, a pass play to Corn gained 20 yards. A field goal attempt by Corn fell short.

In the 3rd quarter, the Steers added to their lead on a 52-yard run by Corn. The kick failed.

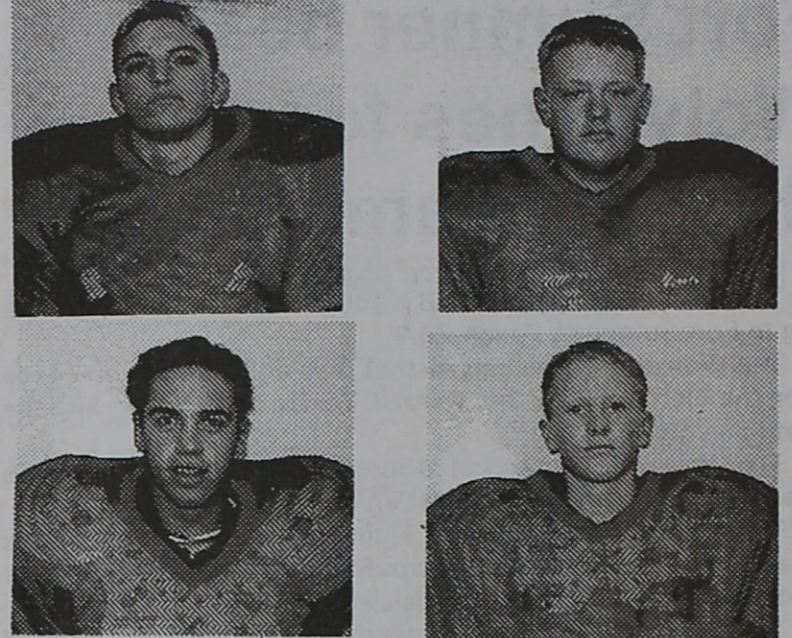
Other top-notch offensive plays included a return by Kolby Kimbrough for 50 yards, a 35-yard run by Corn. On defense, Chadwick had an interception. Good QB pressures were made by Joel Barrett and Schwertner. Jourdan Nichols, Christian and Goetsch had strong tackles.

The 4th period opened with a 2-yard plunge for a TD by Corn, followed by a Corn kick. And the Steers ended their

scoring on a 52-yard pass play from Chadwick to Kimbrough. On defense, Opliger had a QB sack. Cody Schilling had a fumble recovery. Good tackles were made by Isaac Nicolas, Christian, Roberts and Patterson.

Team stats were: first downs, Farwell 12, Olton 4; rushing yards, Farwell 51 for 258, Olton 29 for 25; passing yards, Farwell 4 of 5 for 96; Olton, 2 of 6 for 34; punting average, Farwell, 1 for 21 yards, Olton 5 for 30; and penalties, Farwell 4 for 25 yards, Olton 4 for 28.

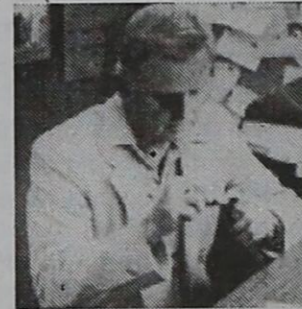

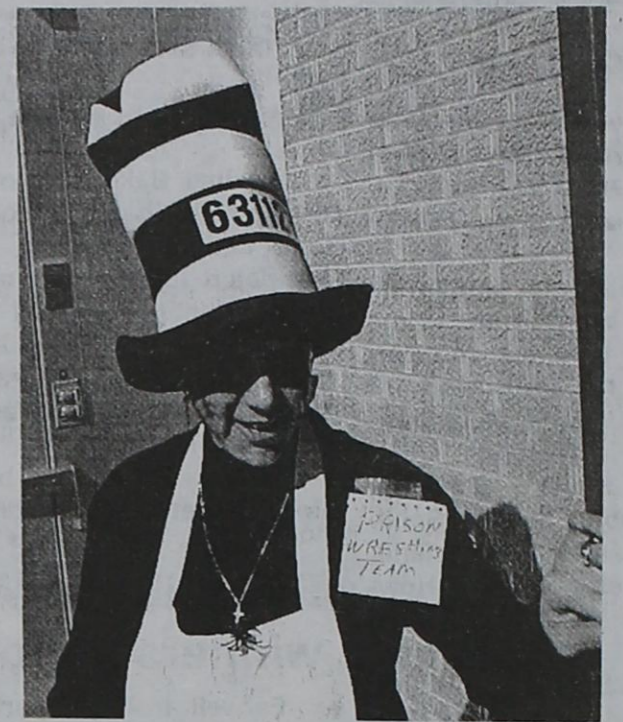

The Panthers increased their lead to 32-14 by halftime.

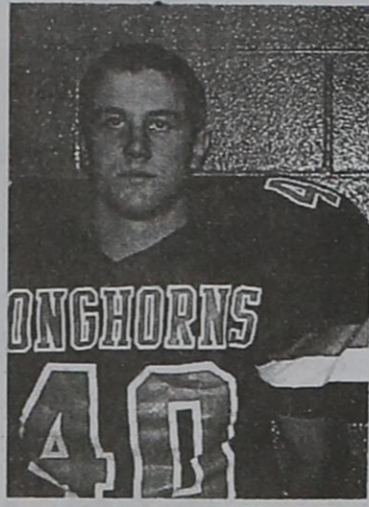
Lazbuddie again was held to one score -- a 54-yard TD run by Seaton. He also kicked the extra points.

The Farwell JV Steers beat Olton, 29-18, on Oct. 28.

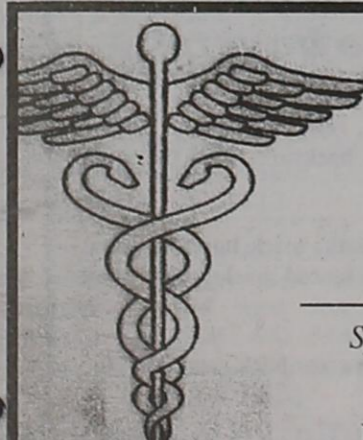
Gaby Garcia scored the first TD on a one yard run, with the two point conversion failing.

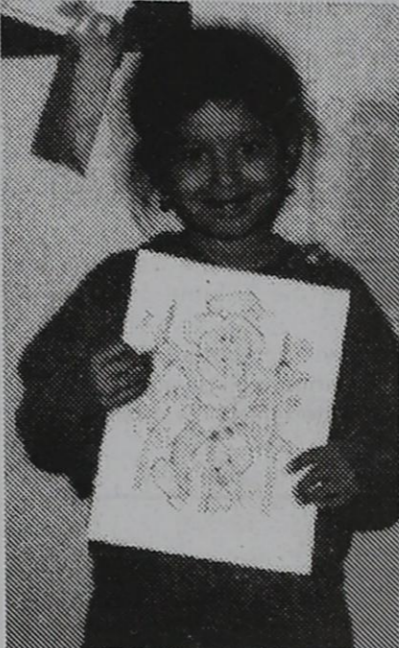
