## Parmer County voters go to the polls

1. The amendment to revise the provisions for filling of a vacancy in the office of governor or lieutenant governor. Divides the executive and legislative branches by preventing a governor from holding both offices at the same time.

2. The amendment relating to the making of advances under a reverse mortgage. Conforms state law on reverse mortgages to federal law. Allows elderly homeowners to supplement their income with the equity they have built up in their homesteads
For 151, against 162.
.3. The amendment to eliminate duplicative, executed, oblete, archaic and ineffective provisions of the Texas Constitution. The Texas Constitution becomes easier to use while no substantive changes are made.
For 223, against 83.
3. The amendment exempting property owned by institutions engaged primarily in public charitable functions from ad alorem taxation. Clarifies whic charitable functions from ad xemptions may engage in auxiliary activities without ondan ering their tax exempt status.
For 180, against 132.
4. The amendment allowing state employees to receive compensation for serving as a member of a school district city or other local government district. Increases the pool of qualified candidates for local elections.
For 133, against 180.
5. The amendment increasing the maximum size of an urban homestead to 10 acres. Gives more Texans the right to secure a home equity loan on their homestead.
For 211, against 96.

Garnishment of wages places the burden of collecting and paying spousal maintenance on an employer instead of an employee ordered child support is allowed for the collection of cour maintenance could result in moves to allow garnishment for the collection of taxes, other judgments or debts.
