

Yashi was lost in thought and did not see the group of vagabond travelers approaching him.


"What's this? A small turtle topped with rags?" poked one.

Two Farwell School Board officers are running for other elective posts next year.

Board President Ronald Byrd is running in the Democrat primary for the post of Pct. 3 county commissioner (Farwell area).

Board Secretary Teresa Ancira is running in the Republican primary for the post of Parmer County tax assessor-collector.

If Byrd wins election next fall, he must resign from the school board. But if Mrs. Ancira wins election next fall, she can continue on the school board.

This is because the two candidates are under a different set of guidelines.

Byrd would be elected to the county commissioner's post -- meaning a say-so over the tax dollars that are generated.

Thus, there would be a conflict of interest with also serving on the school board. So state rules mandate him to resign from the school board.

But Mrs. Ancira would not be in a position to make decisions in that regard, so state rules allow her to serve in both positions, as tax assessor-collector and school board member.








Lazbuddie to get SPC broadcasts

In January, South Plains College in Levelland will plunge into distance learning by broadcasting interactive television courses to students in six high schools in the Five Area Telephone Cooperative, including Lazbuddie School.

Students will get both college and high school or dual credit.

In addition, SPC will also offer evening ITV college courses that will be available for residents in Lazbuddie as well as high school students who want to take classes at night. Evening ITV courses will be offered in English, government and history.

SPC can also partner high schools with each other, providing instruction from one high school to another using credentialed resident faculty to teach college credit courses."

The co-op was one of 11 entities in the state that received a \$1 million project discovery grant through the Texas Infrastucture Fund that showed creativity, vision and networking in communities, explained Don McElroy, the grant's technology director. The grant has enabled the co-op to equip classrooms with the necessary technology to receive the courses from SPC.

Five Area supplied buildings in each school district with fiber optics, and each school district pitched in 10 percent or \$100,000 in matching funds to furnish the distance learning classrooms with computers, telephone lines, fax machines and carpeting.

The communities and telephone co-op formed a business partnership in 1992 to begin exploring ways to take advantage of the coming wave of educational technology.





1. Application must be in the immediate family or a dependent of an active member receiving service from ENMR+Plateau Telecommunications.


2. Applicant must use scholarship to attend an accredited vocational school, technical school, college or university.

3. Applicant must have at least a 3.0 grade point average or equivalent on a 4.0 scale.


4. Applicant must enroll and sustain a minimum of twelve semester credit hours throughout each term during the academic year.


Cantu and Mrs. Pierson will vie for the Democrat nomination, while Mrs. Ancira is unopposed for the GOP nomination so far.

If you signed a petition, you had better read this...

A question has arisen over the use of petitions for candidates in the Parmer County elections next spring.

So the Tribune called the Texas Secretary of State's office for clarification.

For a candidate to seek a political office, they either must pay a fee (usually about \$600) or have a petition signed by a certain amount of registered voters within their area (usually about 50 names -- but it can be more).

If a candidate goes the petition route, then the persons signing their petition cannot vote in the other party's primary election.

Thus, if you sign a petition for a Republican candidate, for example, you cannot vote in next year's Democrat primary.

And, obviously, the same is true if you sign a petition for a Democrat candidate, then you can't vote in the Republican primary next year.

If you sign a petition, and vote in the other party's primary, you could be criminally prosecuted if found to have done so knowingly.

If you want to have your name withdrawn from a petition, you can do so by doing it in writing and signing your name -- if it is done before the petition is filed with the GOP primary, you can with-Dec. 27.





The city I know better than I know any other in the this country is the Port of Manta, because it is the most popular port of call on this section of the South American coast for United States Navy and Coast Guard vessels. I fly to Manta each ship visit to ensure that anything a warship might need in her few days inport is provided, be it fuel or food or mail or emergency leave tickets. But I have found that a major part of every port visit revolves around two US Navy programs, one called Project Handclasp, and the other called Comrel (Community Relations).

Project Handclasp is a long-standing program in which companies from all across America will donate a portion of their products held in surplus for any reason, and they are placed in USN warehouses on both coasts (that includes about anything, but canned foods, medical supplies, and clothing are the most common). Deploying USN ships normally reserve one storeroom onboard to store these items prior to deployment, and the Navy is thus able to deliver these items, free of charge, during overseas port visits, to communities in greatest need.

Comrel is simply the voluntary donation of material and labor by Navy and Coast Guard sailors and embarked Marines during port visits, in whatever local projects may need their help. In my time here, I have worked with the service organizations of Manta (Rotarians, Kiwanis, etc) and with the sisters of the local convent, San Claver, to have projects identified for each arriving ship. Every ship so far has had dozens of volunteers, and we have painted, fixed plumbing, installed lights, and done small construction in schools and clinics in the

provide life for these families. This life is harsh most of the time, but you could never tell it during the Comrel projects I've seen so far. The children run and laugh after the sailors and Marines at their work, chattering away with those who can speak Spanish, and laughing as they try and teach Spanish to the others. The barrio's parents come to help in whatever the project may be, and the sincere warmth and friendship you see in their faces transcends any language barrier there may be.

There is a barrio named 15 de Septiembre (many locations here are named for historic dates) that has been a particular favorite for visiting US ships in the last six years, located on the banks of the Rio Manta, about a mile from the Port. The land is fertile and the setting is beautiful, but every 10 to 15 years, the climatic phenomenon called "El Niño" returns, and the coast of South America is ravaged by months of rains. In the past year, El Niño has savaged a major portion of Ecuador's economy, damaging major portions of its cash exports (shrimp, roses, shrimp, bananas, coffee, palm oil, etc). The barrios all had to struggle through as the rains brought with it floods and landslides. The country as a whole is still recovering from the damage, as the residents of 15 de Septiembre are doing with a little helping hand from visiting American servicemen and servicewomen.

The school in 15 de Septiembre has been built almost entirely with Handclasp and Comrel from visiting United States ships over the last six years, a simple courtyard, four classrooms, desks and lighting and plumbing, all adorned with the decals of ships that provided volunteers. Volunteer teachers from more prosperous neighborhoods give their time to teach these children the basics, the Peace Corps volunteers help with the English classes, and sailors have donated a wide variety of books, all this is necessary because with the recent economic distress, the government of Ecuador cannot afford to build a real school here, or to provide teachers.

Things are changing for the better now, with many indi-

Given these plans and estimates, I met the four USN ships that arrived in Manta in August (O'Bannon, McInerney, Carter hall, City of Corpus Christi), and spoke with the embarked chaplain captain, Father O'Neill. Before the ships departed Manta, \$1,500 had been donated to the school fund being administered by the Rotarians. Visiting ships are still passing the hat, naval attaches that served here before me are mailing me checks, Father O'Neill is asking for a special donation from his parish back in California, and bit by bit, we are approaching our goal.

The ball started rolling when construction has begun on the first three classrooms, and the mayor of Manta directed that the city provide the material for the barrio families to construct a wall around the school courtyard. Expatriate American businessman, Doug Burke (an oilman originally from Oklahoma) donated the iron gate for this courtyard, plus four swingsets to give the children their first playground there. The city of Manta also pledged that when the school is completed, that funding would be located for the city to provide the school's teachers and books.

Last month, I was given the honor of placing the cornerstone of the new school, and to enjoy the barrio festival for this occasion with my wife, Ginger, and girl, Courtney (the local newspaper declared Courtney to be the American Ambassador to Children). But the biggest day was when our Ambassador, Gwen Clare, visited this small barrio in October. With the festival in her honor and all the coverage from Ecuadorian newspapers and television stations, 15 de Septiembre is finally gaining the attention it has deserved for years. The afternoon was filled with music and happiness, but more than anything, it was filled with hope for a better future for this barrio and its children.

Being a naval attaché can be paperwork and bureaucracy at times. Ecuador is faced with challenges from foreign narcoterrorists, domestic crime, economic chaos, climatic destruction, and a couple of good sized volcanoes. But nothing was going to bother me on this day, looking at all the happiness around me, and looking up at the sign with the name of the school printed on it, UNIDAD EDUCATIVA BILINGUE ARMADA DE LOS ESTADOS UNIDOS DE NORTE AMERICA. (The U.S. Navy School!)


poorest barrios in the region.

Barrio in Spanish, favela in Portuguese, every country has a name for these poor communities. The landless classes of South America must build their families' homes on lands unclaimed and unexploited by wealthier levels of the societies. These sites, on hillsides too steep for cultivation, in fields depleted of nutrition years ago, or in the foodplains of valleys,

viduals contributing in their own way. Architects in the Rotary Club of manta drew up the design for a permanent sixclassroom school in this barrio, with an estimated total cost of \$11,000 U.S. dollars. Other Manta Rotarian businessmen looked at the plans, agreed to provide materials at cost, and the estimate was reduced to \$8,000, if only the funding could be obtained.

Put safety covers on unused wall outlets so children can't explore the outlets with tiny fingers. Replace any broken wall plates.

If cords are frayed or cracked, replace them. Never nail or staple cords to the wall of floor. And keep furniture off the cords.

Extension cords are meant to be used temporarily. It's not safe to use them as permanent household wiring.

Use three-prong plugs in three-prong outlets. Never cut the third prong off to fit it into a two-prong outlet. And don't force, plugs into outlets if they don't fit easily. You can start a fire that way or get a shock.

Install ground-fault circuit interrupters in bathrooms and kitchens. They help prevent electrocutions where electricity and water might meet.
