## Autrey reports Avenue F paving will go ahead

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey reported at Tuesday's Texico City Council meeting that the planning paving of Avenue $F$ will go ahead.
The council had earlier said that if contracts were no okayed by Dec. 16, the state grant would be lost. But Autrey said Curry County has accepted Texico's deal for the county to do the job and approval is expected at the next county commissioners' meeting. "And the state said this was okay, said Autrey.

In other business, the council:

- Is still waiting to hear from Duncan Disposal on the city's request to have the company haul bottom ask from the SPS Tolk plant for use in Texico's alleys.

Gave the go-ahead for a company to lease the Santa Fe water tank. The company needs storage for by-products from the Clovis alcohol plant which supplement cattle feed, said Wendel Bostwick, their spokesman. City attorney Marion Ty Rutter will work out the contract details
Bostwick said the company has been renting a storage tank in Clovis for $\$ 250$ a month.

Heard councilman Dean Henninger say that "old dilapidated shacks" behind 612 Florence and 421 Lamar need to be torn down due to health and safety concerns.
The problem is that a building inspector has to condemn the sites and Texico has none. Texico wants to use Clovis' building inspector but the state has said it can't, but has to use the state inspector.
Mayor Marie Christian said there are 3 state inspectors in all. She said Texico needs to put together a list of sites that need to be condemned, then ask for a state inspector to check on them.
The city plans to document how long it takes for an inspector to come to Texico -- if ever.

Aureliano Munoz, 22, of Texico, pled guilty on Tuesday to charges involved in the shooting death last June of Phillip Ortiz, 18, of Texico, announced Randall Harris, 9th Judicial Dis-

Harris said Munoz pled guilty to involuntary manslaughter a 4 th degree felony; negligent use of a firearm, a misde meanor; filing a false police report, a misdemeanor; and felon in possession of a firearm, a 4th degree felony
Munoz also was found to be a habitual offender and was sentenced to three years in the New Mexico Department of Corrections, with three years of supervised probation and one Harris said Munoz had a prior felony for breaking and enter

Ortiz died of a gunshot wound to his body. Three persons riding in a van with him were charged. Besides Munoz, the vehicle driver, Joel Ortiz, 19, of Texico, pled guilty to filing a false report; and a 15 -year-old Texico boy pled guilty to shooting from a motor vehicle and tampering with evidence. Curry County Sheriff's Sgt. Sandy Loomis said the four had been firing a sawed-off shotgun out the van as they drove on county roads. They were on State Line Road just north of
