This historical photo of the 200 block of Main
Street (Avenue A) in FarStreet (Avenue A) in Farwell was taken about

## The Mansfield tragedy recalled

(Editor's note: The following information comes from articles written by Don McAlavy. It is refrom McAlavy Clovis News Journa the Clovis News Journal.) Besides the Hassell worst tragedy in the Farwell area history, there also was another tragedy from that era.
It involved Montell (Monty) Mansfield, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Mansfield, of Farwell. And it happened in 1929.

Mansfield was a land agent connected with the Capitol Freehold Land Trust Co., a remnant of the old XIT Ranch syndicate.
He was born in Kenlucky in 1882, came to was one of the first city aldermen), then to Farwell in 1916. He and his family lived in the house with the tall sloping roof adjacent to the State Line Tribune on 3rd Street. It is now occupied by Gene and Sherry Christian and their
On Aug. 14, 1929, Monty, 23, and Gail Hamilton, 39 , both then living in New York state, were found dead together.
Monty was the youngest of two daughters of Mansfield and was living near Poughkeepsie at the time.
Gail, a close friend of Monty's, was a great grandson of Alexander Hamilton, the first treasurer of the United States. Officially, the deaths were reported as a double suicide. The guess is tha
this was done to protect the Hamilton family name. But later Mansfield reter, pred anonymous ietter, presumably from a Gail and Monty hat said reled in her bedroo quar In the heat of the gument, Gail shot Monty, ghen unsuccessfully tried to revive her. When he saw she was dead, he ordered everyone out of the room (there were other guests present in the house), then shot himself dead.
Gail had apparently been in love with Monty and was jealous of her popularity with her other friends. Monty was a beautiful woman.
The Mansfields also received other letters to the shot Mot Gail had indee Mansfield
Mansfield built a private mausoleum at Mis Cemetery in Clovis, that had fallen into disrepair over the years.
Recently, Virgil Reed who owns the building housing Barb's Cafe in Farwell, began renovating the 72 -year-old, 10'x14' structure.

The building shown stood between the post office (now Dickie Magness' art shop) and the theater (now mpty, and adjacent to Lee Hutchins Electric).
C.G. Davis Mercantile was owned by Carl Davis, who ied in 1994. He moved his business from this building to the new Piggly Wiggly at Ave. A and Third Street in 1951. After the business moved, the mercantile building became a hardware store run by Mr. Sproul, father of Pat Owen.
