Educational changes

## forthcoming

It's called Ne House bill 212 and it means major changes for education in the state. The bill has been signed by the governor -called the biggest educational reform in the state in at least 15 years.

Texico School Supt. R.L. Richards gave this revort to the Tribune: 1) Full-day kindergarten is being phased in over 5 years throughout the state. Texico officials will have to put in full-day will have to put in full-day years.
2) Graduation requirements were changed. A science credit was added and an elective deleted. This means that, to graduate, students need to have 3 science credits. Richards said Texico School has the staff to ment. ment.
3) School boards' powers have been severely
limited. No longer will school boards vote on hiring and firing personnel, except for the school superintendent.
From now on, all hiring and firings will be done by school officials, no chool boards.
Basically, school superintendents are now 4) There will be addi 4) There will be addi-
tional student testing, called "Adequate Yearly Progress." More on this will be reported later. 5) Salaries for certified personnel have been upgraded in order to move New Mexico from ranking $46^{\text {th }}$ in the nation for teacher salary averages
