Texas voters went to the polls on Saturday for local elections.

Four candidates sought three Farwell School Board posts.

Totals were: Roberta Howard, 140; Mike Woods, 140; Randy Mitchell, 133, and Nancy Chasteen, 18.

Thus, Mitchell and incumbents Mrs. Howard and Woods were elected.

Six candidates ran for the Farwell Hospital District Board.

Totals were: Jack Kirkland, 143; Greg Actkinson, 142; Mike Ratke, 140; Tim Cooper, 139; Tom Nichols, 138, and Nancy Chasteen, 24.

Thus, the five incumbents were picked -- Kirkland, Actkinson, Ratke, Cooper and Nichols.

Six candidates vied for three Lazbuddie School Board posts.

Totals were: Donnie Coker, 109; Paulette Foster, 106; Daniel Schacher, 79; Randy Smith, 54; Sheldon Mason, 42; and Kim Kimbrough, 24.

Elected were Mrs. Foster and incumbents Schacher and Coker.

Tommie Martin did not seek re-election.

Finishing 1-2 were two Republicans:

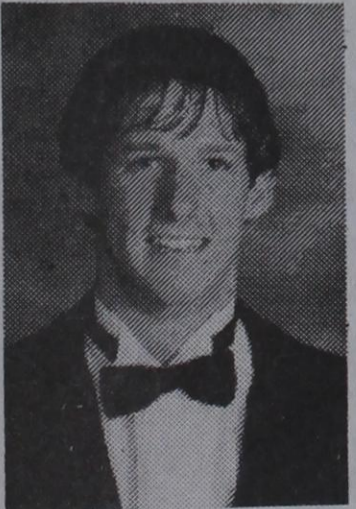
• Randy Neugebauer, a land developer from Lubbock, received 12,844 votes -- 22.3 percent of the total.

• Mike Conaway, a certified public accountant from Midland, had 12,211 votes, or 21.2 percent.

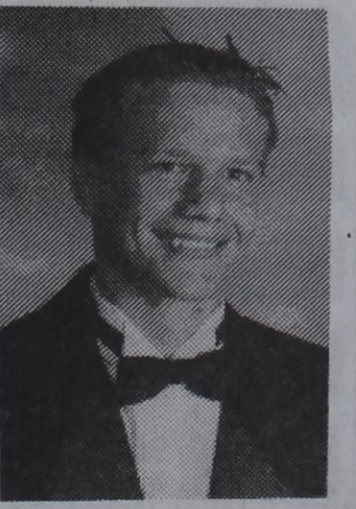
Carl Isett finished 3rd with 10,971, and David Langston was 4th with 8,015.

In Farmer County, Neugebauer got 285 votes -- 47 percent of those cast.

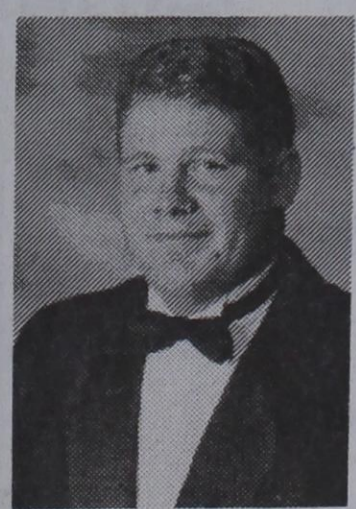

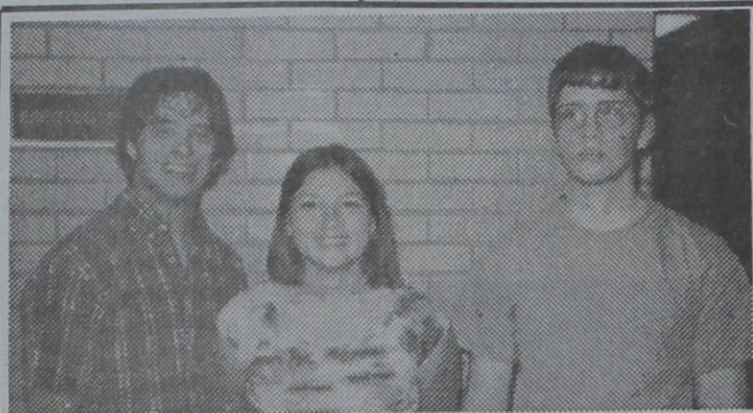

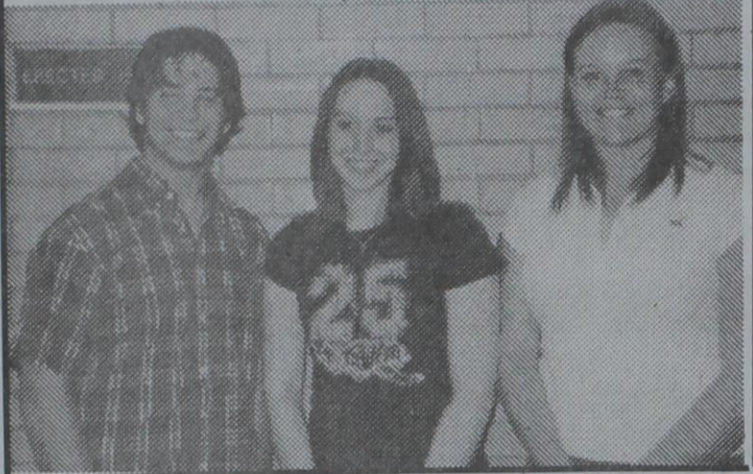

Wolverines' playoff hopes dashed

From Texico Wolverine assistant baseball coach Dennis Roch:

Despite having a game left to play, the Texico Wolverines (5-3 in district) knew their fate before they even stepped on the field against the Elida Tigers last Thursday night. Santa Rosa had defeated district leader Dora earlier that day, securing 2nd place in District 7-A/AA and ending the Wolverines' hope of advancing to the playoffs in their first year of eligibility.

Still, Texico finished the season with a victory, beating Elida, 15-5 after 6 innings of play. Bryce Bailey pitched the entire game, striking out 10 and walking only 3. On offense, Bailey helped his own cause, going 2 for 4 at the plate with an RBI single in the 2nd inning and a massive solo home run in the 5th.

The Wolverines recorded 19 hits, including RBI doubles by Jesse Serrano and Logan Brown. Brown also recorded a 2-run homer early in the game.

"It's always tough to have your playoff hopes cut short," said Manager Richard Luscombe. "But our players showed a lot of character by stepping up to take care of business in our last game of the season,"

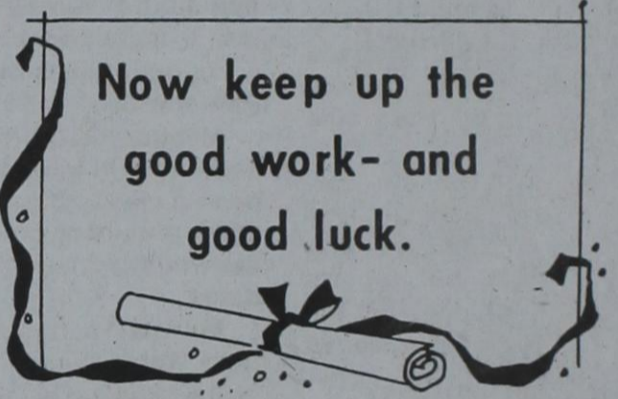

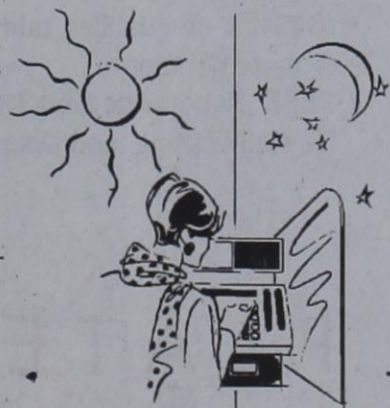

About 50 persons attended.

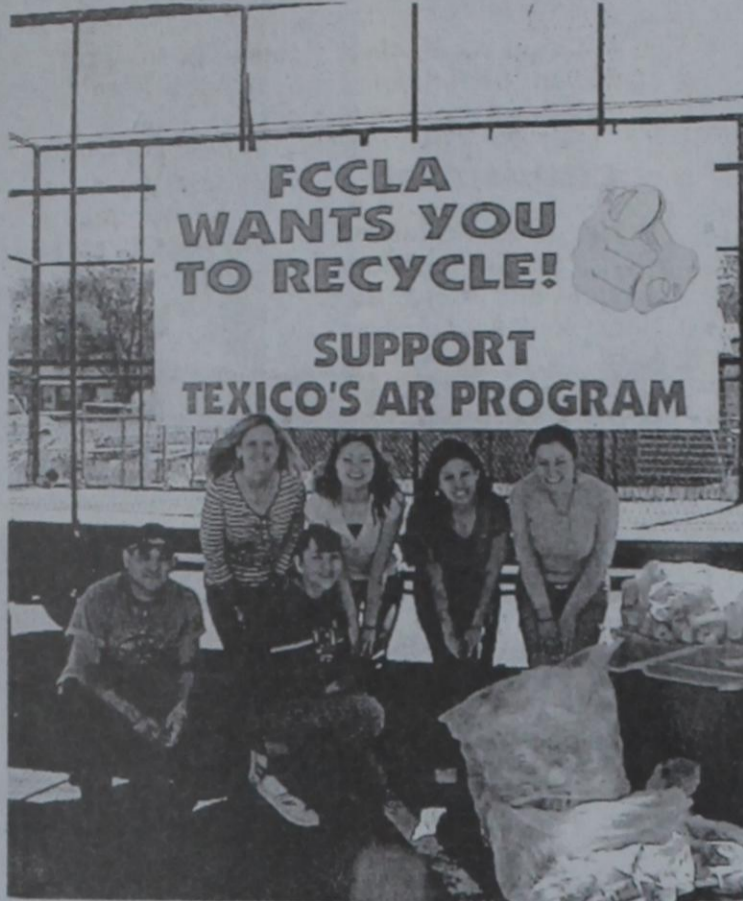
