


Talk about a program moving swiftly! There's only one way that could happen -- due to the excellence of Band Director Bill Shelly.



Finishing 1-2 were two **Republicans:** 


· Randy Neugebauer, a developer from land Lubbock, received 12,844 votes -- 22.3 percent of the total.


· Mike Conaway, a certified public accountant from Midland, had 12,211 votes, or 21.2 percent.

Carl Isett finished 3rd with 10,971, and David Langston was 4th with 8,015.


Parmer County, In Neugebauer got 285 votes -- 47 percent of those cast.

He is president of the National Honor Society, FCCLA vice president of finance, active in athletics, a member of the FFA, and a Robotics National Qualifer.




#### Cemetery cleanup scheduled

As you are aware, the elementary school challenged the junior high in a weeklong "walk-a-thon." The elementary Galavanting Gals pulverized the Southside Split Second Swifties! (Actually, the race was so close that literally day by day we never knew who would pull out into the lead.).

Pedometers actually measure each step taken, if worn throughout the day. The American Cancer Society says that to achieve good health, you should strive to take 10,000 steps a day, the quivalent of walking about 5 miles. A person who walks 10,000 steps daily will burn between 2,000 and 3,500 extra calories per week, which hopefully could result in achieving a vastly better health profile and longer life span.

The challenge was fun, though many times intense. Mainly the goal was to motivate us to get up and get active. And just try to imagine the competitive personalities that cropped up everywhere!



<u>LIVE CATTLE</u>: Prices were able to close above their \$72.25 resistance level this week and prices were also able to make it to a long term target price of \$73.45. The fact that the June/August contracts have carried significant discounts to the nearby April which went off this week also helped to support this rally. The Serial Month of May also reached \$76.00, which is very close to cash.

**FEEDER CATTLE:** The August Feeder contract broke out this week after trading inside a narrow range for almost a month. Prices reached their January highs of \$84.80 and should be in position to eventually reach their old contract highs made last December of \$85.70? This may take some time, but seasonal strength into late July has taken place almost 14 out of the last 15 years.

<u>CORN</u>: Prices have re-tested their April lows and have begun to consolidate over the past week. A close above \$2.34 would turn short term trends back higher and should set up a move toward the \$2.40 level. Improving weather conditions going into planting has added pressure to prices. A move below the April lows would be devastating to prices over the long haul.

<u>SOYBEANS</u>: Prices have continued to move higher since breaking out to the upside last week. The July contract has now reached the area close to long term projections. Major resistance lies between the \$6.40-6.50 level basis the July contract. Prices have been able to move higher on demand rather than face improving weather conditions. Exports have also been supportive.

<u>WHEAT:</u> Although the July KC Wheat price dropped below \$3.00 earlier this week, the market was able to come back and close above this level by Friday. This should be viewed as somewhat friendly, but the overall trend still remains down. There may be some pick-up in commercial demand around these levels as the domestic crop continues to dwindle in many areas.

<u>COTTON</u>: Prices basically collapsed over the last week and no resign of recovery yet? There was some support which caught the market around \$55.35 basis the July contract. Commercials were big sellers mostly coming from long liquidations, but we are still a long way from knowing how the crop will turn out? A bounce back up over the next few days would not be out of the question?
