New novel is based on Parmer County's most infamous crime

(Editor's Note: Rebecca Grayson, of Austin, has written a novel that might have a familiar ring to persons living here -- it may suggest to you the infamous Hassell murders of the 1920s.

Last year, the Tribune carried a series of articles on George Hassell, who murdered his family. It's considered the most heinous crime ever to take place in Parmer County.

After hearing about Mrs. Grayson's book, "Liar", the Tribune contacted her and asked her to send us information about herself and the novel.)

Dear Mr. Pomper,

Texas has been written about in so many ways, many not true. As a native Texan, I wanted to place the reader inside our boundaries, allow them to feel our history, and our strength. The novel is not simply about the man who confessed to murdering 13 people. It is about the Texas he grew up in and the people of the Panhandle. I have kept it short, although it could have been 600 pages, moving quickly through the events that began on a Christmas Eve long ago in the twin cities I have named Fulton, Texas and Mexias, New Mexico.

I was born as Barbara Deaton in Deaf Smith County Hospital and lived most of my youth in a little community by the name of Black, Texas. I attended school there in a two-room schoolhouse until our school was consolidated into the Friona Independent School District.

I attended school in Friona until I married and left there for North Carolina in 1956. They say if you ever wear out a pair of shoes in the Panhandle of Texas you will always return.

Well, I fell into that category and returned to Texas in 1958. I have lived all over the state but now live in Austin, Texas. I write songs, a few have been recorded, and one of my poems is in An Anthology of Texas Poets. It is called A Wreck Upon the Sea.

"Liar" is my first novel.

Among our family keepsakes was an old-yellowed newspaper. It was a copy of the State Line Tribune from December of 1926, which included the confession of the man I have named Jefferson Bryce in my novel.

When friends came to my house for a slumber party or such, we often pulled out the old newspaper and added it to ghost tales and other subjects of interest.

Those who might remember some of this would be Loretta O'Brien Hand, Doris McFarland Barnett, Phyllis Hinds Blake, and Margaret Rhodes Coker.

As a child, I visited often with a family friend in Texico. I was allowed a great deal of freedom in those times when children were safe and life was full of wonder. I talked to the people and savored the flavor of Farwell and Texico alike. The place I have described in my novel is a collage of my own memories and those of

If you want your business to be included in the fax list, please holler at me before the contest starts.

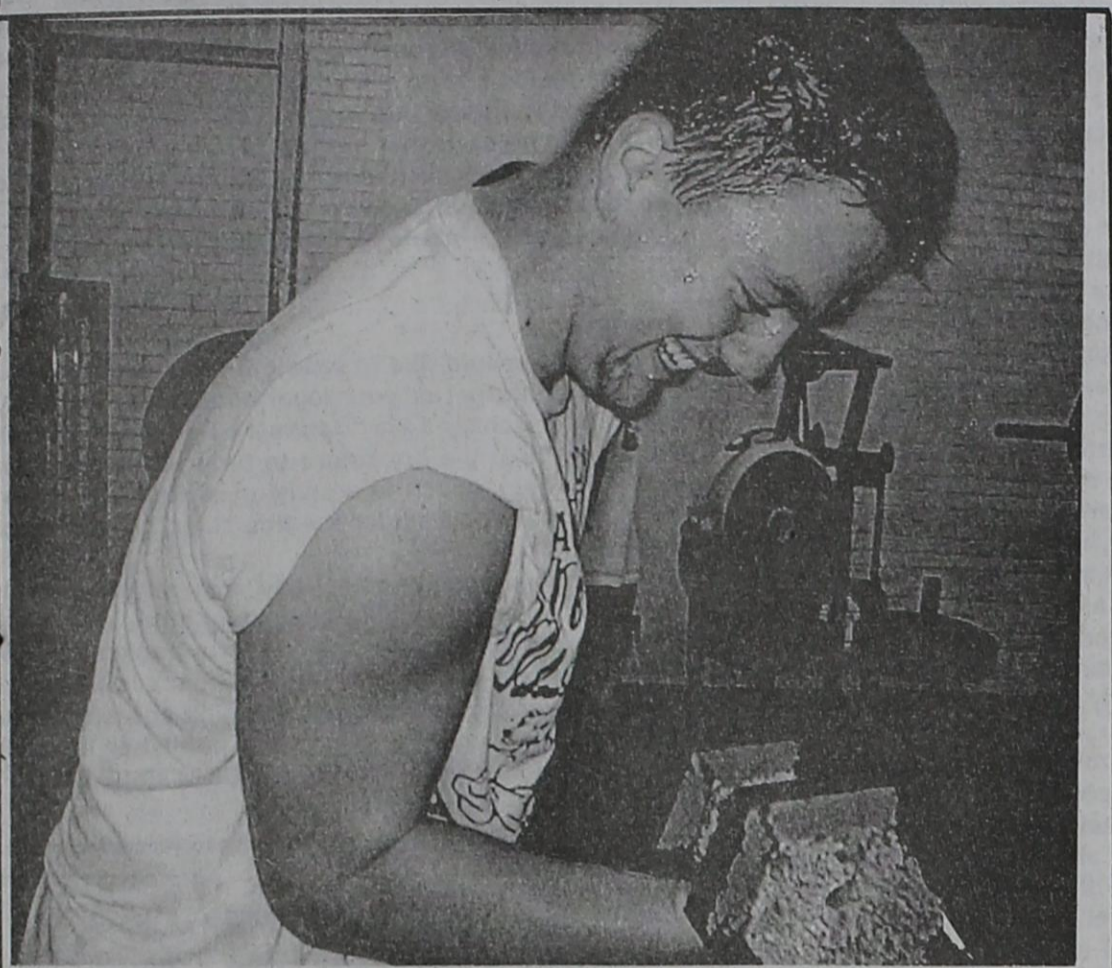

Attention, folks, who got reminder cards last week that their annual newspaper subscription renewals were due.

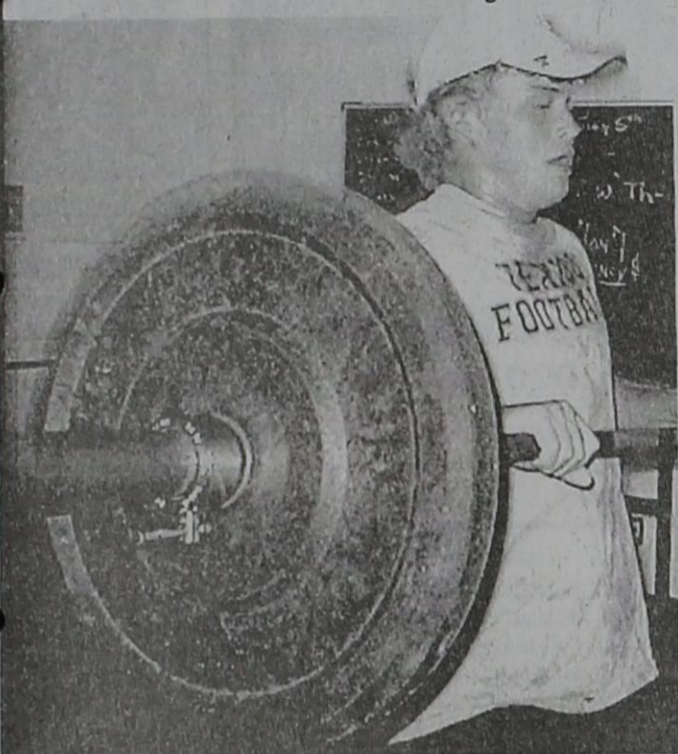
We inadvertently put "7-15" (July) instead of "8-15" (August).

Anyway, just to let you know -- your subscriptions don't run out until the end of August, so you can renew any time during this month and you won't miss an issue.

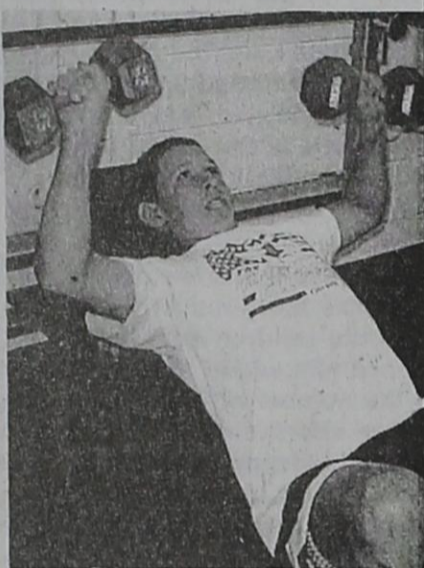

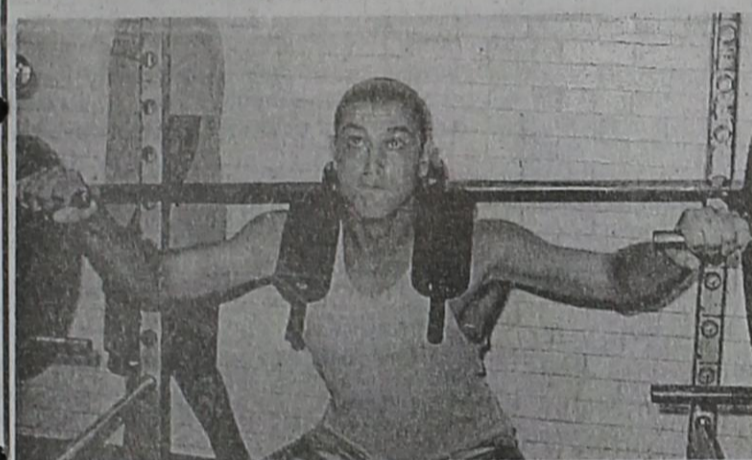

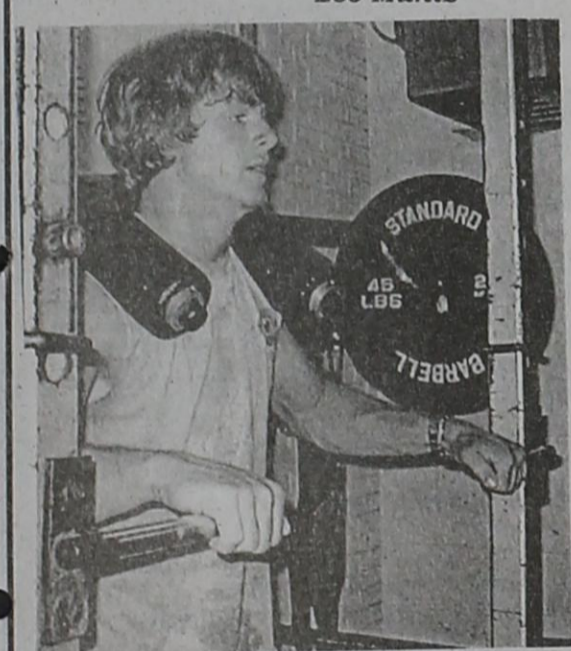
Texico weight training

This group of Texico Wolverines works out in the early morning hours during the summertime.



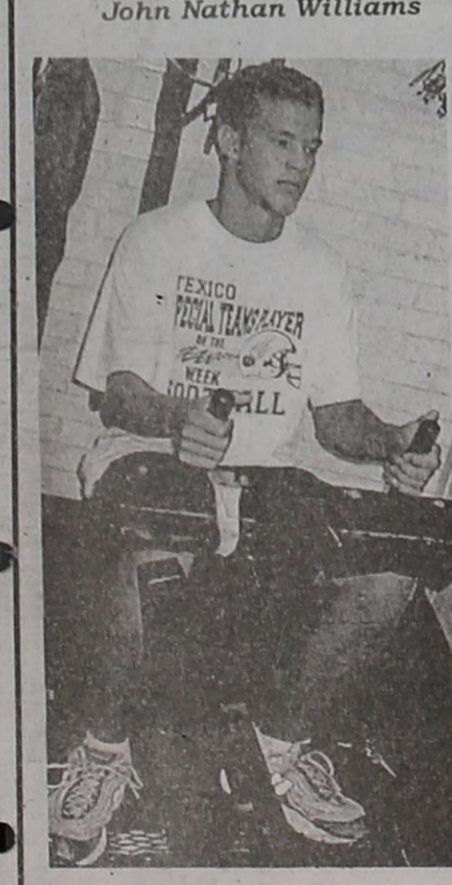

my mother who was among the children beside the fence on the day the bodies were discovered.

I visited the murder house there outside of Farwell when I was very, very small. I do not know how old I was exactly, but either my sister Bettie or my brother Patrick lifted me high enough to see in the windows. As a mother described the stains on the wall, this became a frightening experience for me. It was something nightmares are made of for children and I suffered many over the years.

In 1972, my eldest daughter came home from school needing a frightening story for her speech class assignment. I gave her this one and the seed for writing the novel was planted. The speech teacher wanted to know if I was a professional writer. I was flattered by this and began to consider becoming one. An old dream of writing had died long before and this revived it for me, though I remained only vaguely serious about actually writing a novel. Researching the book became my hobby.

It was fun to look up information on it everywhere I traveled with my husband. He went to see customers and I went to the public libraries, museums etc. gathering data. I accumulated a large box of napkins with scribbles on them and other numerous scraps of paper over the years. This caused a huge problem when I tried to put the notes together while raising my four daughters. Our house was always filled with noise and their many friends and was simply not conducive to serious work on a novel.

During the years of research, I was fortunate enough to spend an afternoon interviewing Clyde Goodwine from Friona, who was the last living juror who had sat on the case. He was full of anecdotes and information about the Panhandle during the years surrounding the events described in my novel. On that same trip back home, I discovered the place of burial of the family and was amazed to see that someone was tending their grave in an otherwise neglected cemetery. (The Olivet Cemetery south of Farwell on the State Line Road)

Finally in 1991, I asked myself if I wanted to finish this thing or not. If I did, I needed to do it or throw the "mess" away. My decision is obvious at the point. I sat down and wrote it in six months without my notes. I had done the research, the thing was in my head, and I needed to be rid of it.

Those familiar with the case will see that a few details have been changed but most of the story remains true to the facts. I have taken one of the children from those murdered in California and placed him within the family murdered there at Farwell so the number of his victims remains the same. I did this in an effort to reveal things that I believed to be true about the perpetrator of the

crimes and also to help reveal the personality of one of the boys.

It is a novel and is therefore fiction based on fact. Dates and names have been changed and personalities invented to open the events to a possible reality. I always loved the towns of Farwell and Texico. They had special mystery for me somehow and it is my hope that I have not insulted anyone with my depiction of the people whom resided there in the 1920s.

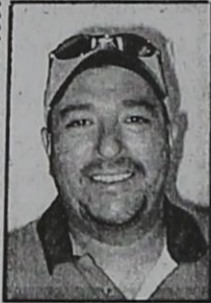

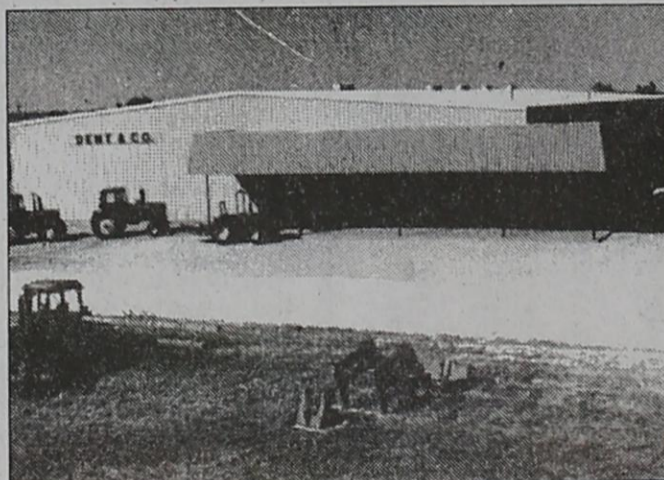

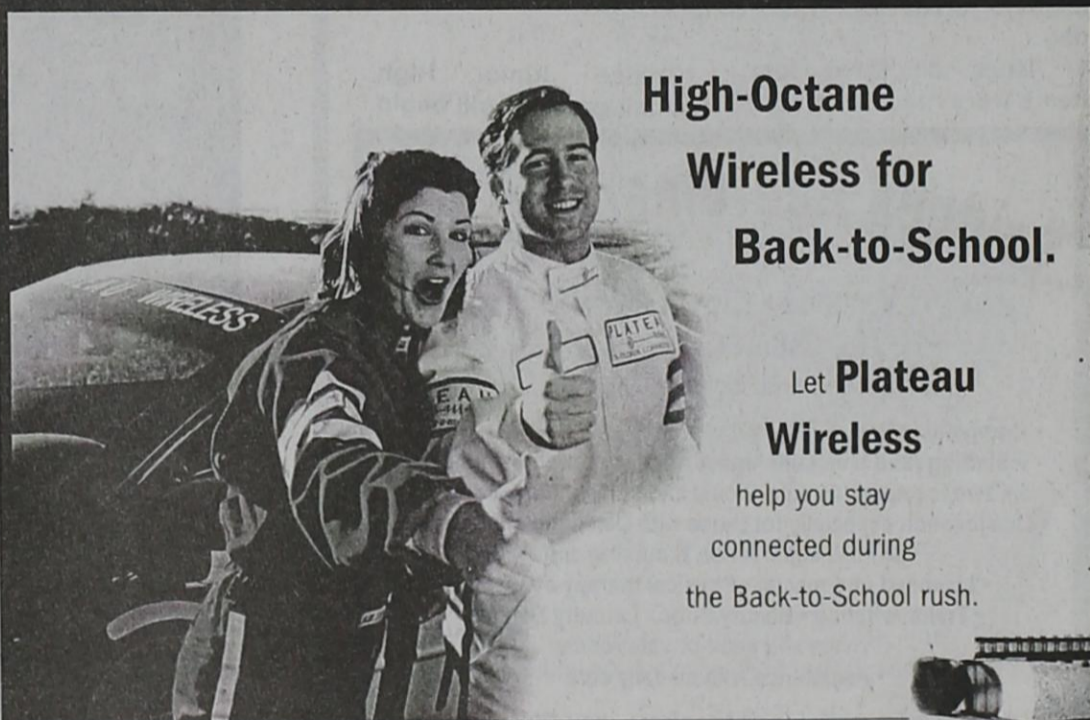

For DWI's, for example, there will be surcharges of \$1,000 to \$2,000, depending on the violation.

And an annual surcharge has been assessed for six or more points each year -- \$100 for the first six points, \$25 for each added point.

And if you are found driving without a license - an extra \$250 has been tacked on your bill.

Driving without a valid license will cost you an extra \$100 a year.
