What Happens When You Haven't Enough NITROGEN?

These signs will be present:

1. Crops pale and yellow
2. Grow very slowly
3. Be dwarfed in total growth
4. "Fire-up" on crops like corn, and grain sorghum, starting on tips of bottom leaves and then going down the center of the leaf, finally killing whole leaf. Drouth doesn't make plant "fire-up" from the bottom, but makes the leaves roll up.
5. Have a restricted root growth.
