and following their marriage they returned to Louis to make their home. They lived at Louis until 1925 when they moved to the West Camp community where they are engaged in farming.

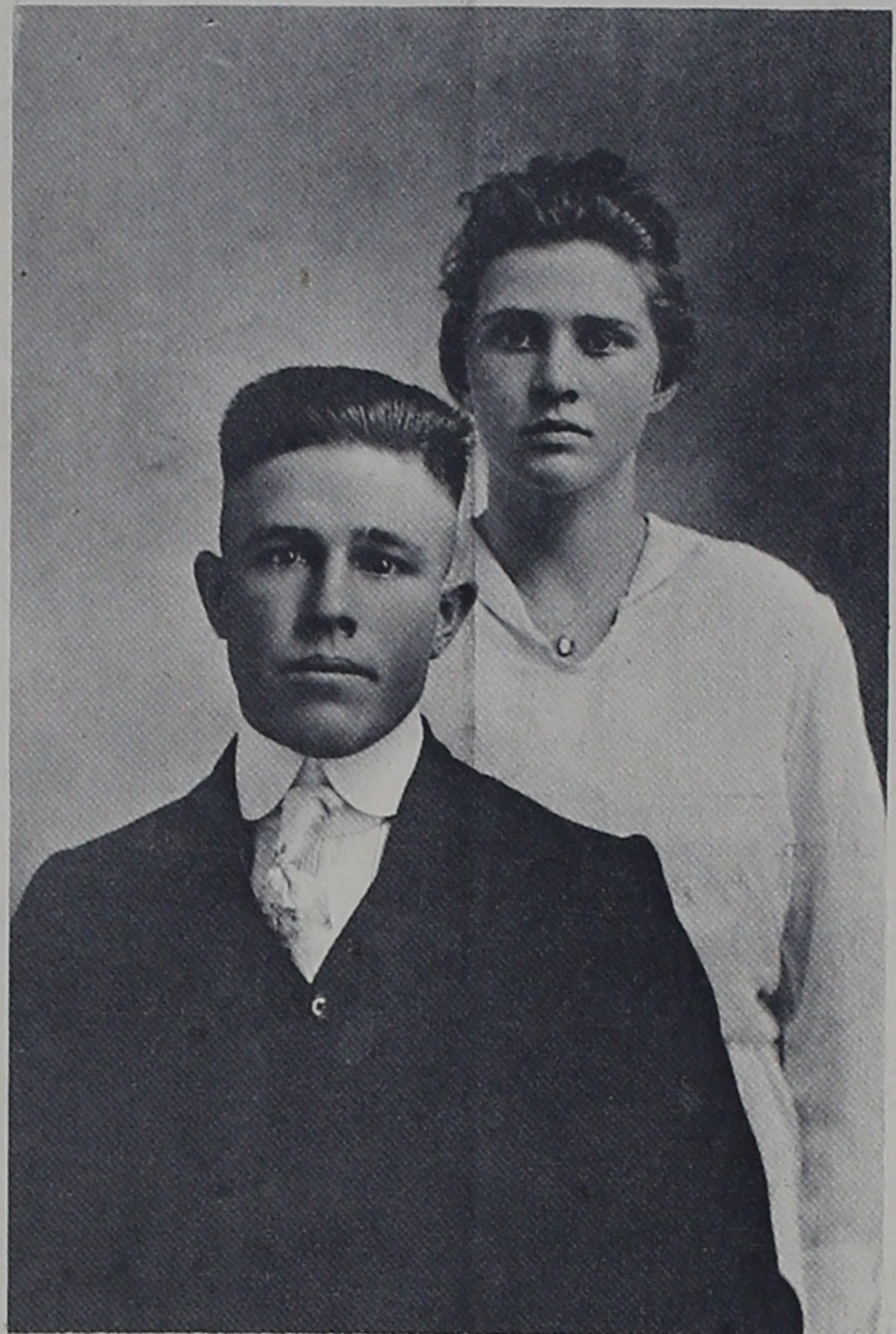
Mr. and Mrs. Snider lived and farmed in the West Camp community until 1950 when they moved to their present home on Third Street in Farwell. Al-

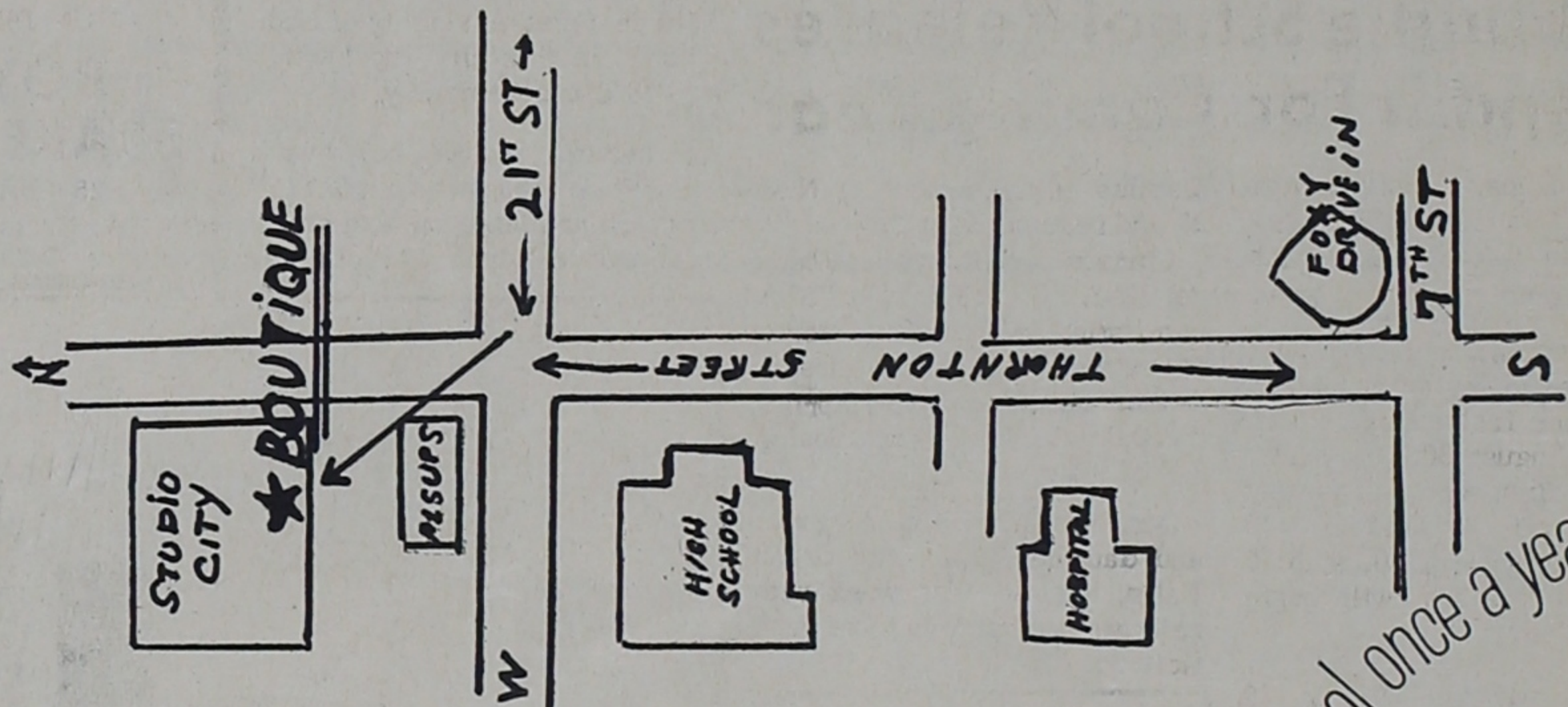
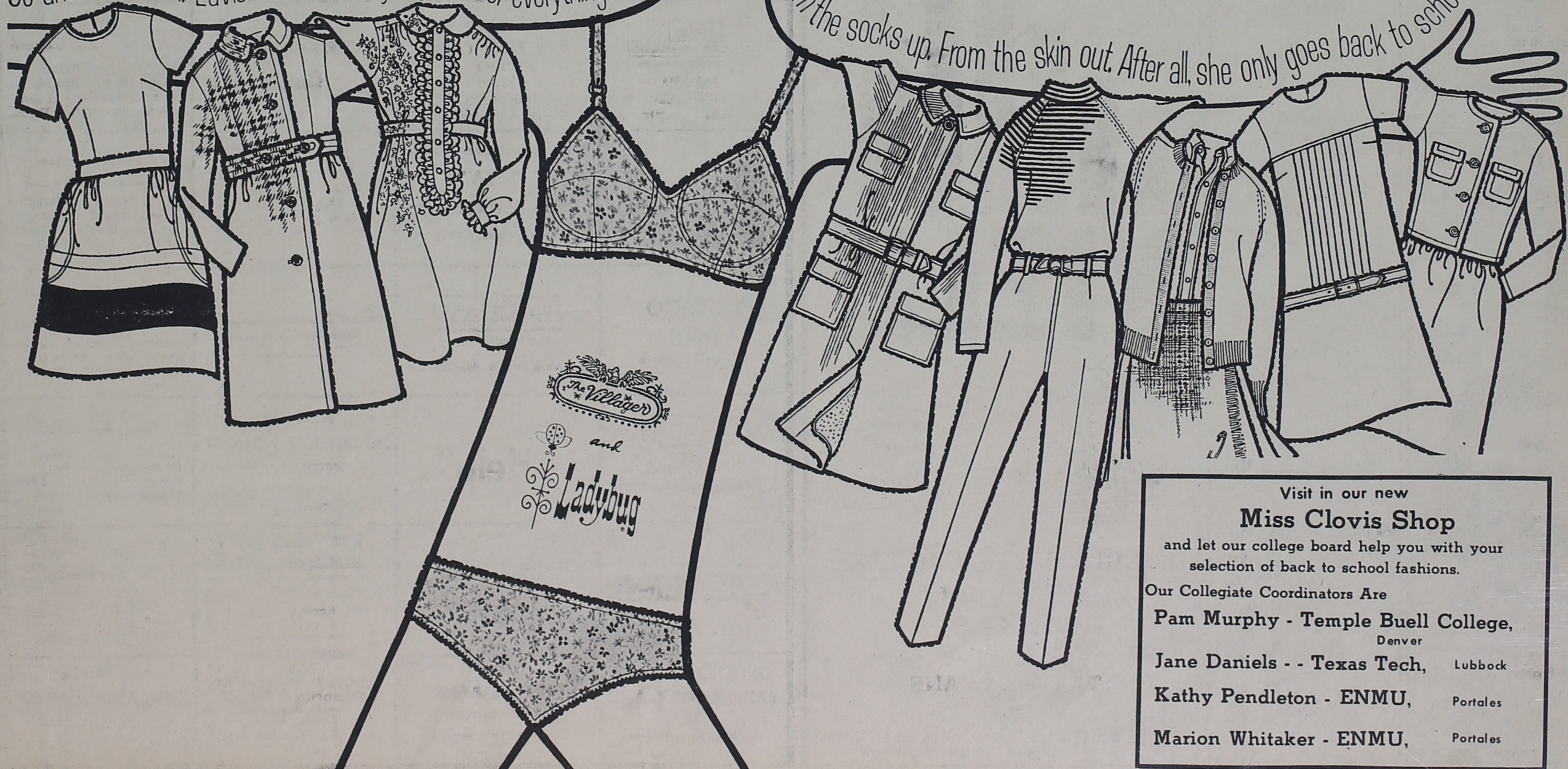

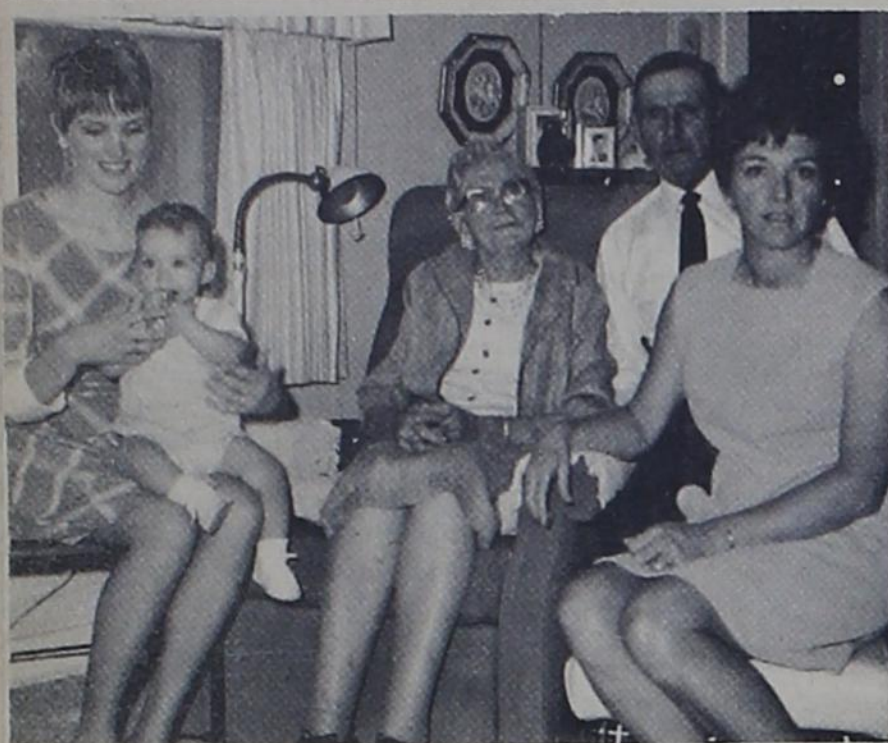
