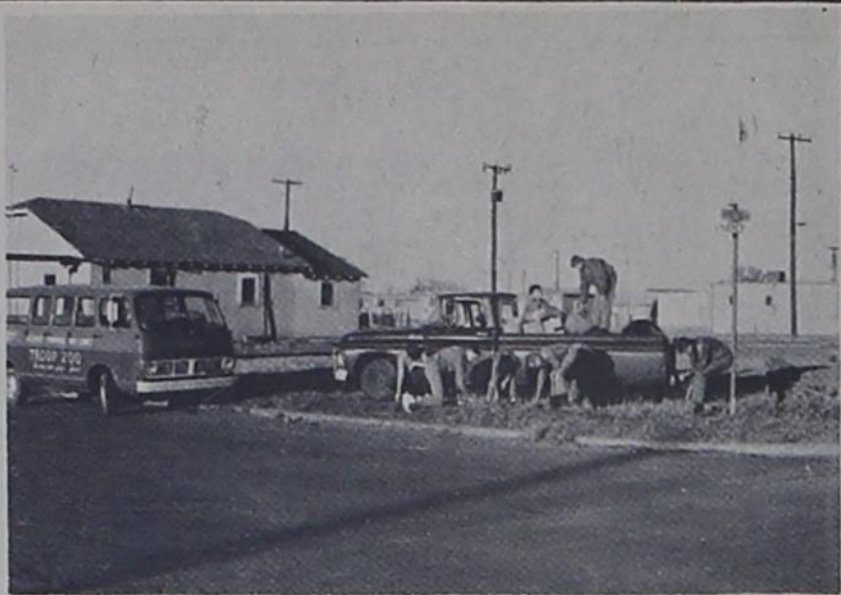

20% Of Vehicles Inspected

"With the April 15 deadline for obtaining inspection stickers drawing near, only 20 per cent of the registered vehicles in Parmer County have been inspected," stated Captain Alan Johnson, Motor Vehicle Inspection Supervisor of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

"Unless there is a rapid increase of inspections, long waiting lines will be forming at inspection stations as the April 15 deadline approaches. The authorized inspection stations are ready and capable of handling the inspection of Texas registered vehicles if owners will not wait until a few days before the deadline," Johnson added.

"Any driver operating a vehicle on public roads after April 15 that is required to be inspected will be operating in violation of the law," Johnson said.

Captain Johnson called attention to the fact that since the beginning of the inspection program in 1951, vehicles having a defect that was a causative factor in fatal accidents decreased from 13 per cent to 3 per cent.

Johnson said, "The purpose of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program is to discover any maladjustment which might become a link in a cycle of events leading to an accident and, by removing the link, prevent the accident."

NURSERY NEWS

By Alvin Woodburn Garden Center Nursery Clovis, N.M.

The last few weeks we have been trimming fruit trees, roses, and some other plants we like to have in the yard. This week we would like to point out some of the "do's and don'ts" in trimming some of the evergreens.

Basically, an evergreen is a plant that does not shed its leaves or needles. To the average person on the Plains, the mention of evergreens is to bring to mind the finest of the conifers, spruce, and pine, and maybe a few will admit the magnolia into the class.

To start with, the juniper grows in so many varied and different forms it would be rather foolish to say that you trim a juniper this way or limit the trimming to some other way. One thing I learned the hard way is not to take all the needles off of a tree at once. Some years ago we trimmed one of the upright juniper trees rather severely--in fact, took out the entire top and quite a bit of the stump. In a short time, it put out and really looked good. The next year there were two or three trees that needed some attention and they caught the same treatment. When they put out new growth and really looked good, we figured it safe to treat these trees, generally, in this manner. So, we started trimming on a big bunch, thinking we knew best. Well, some of the trees didn't make it. Since that time, if we want to prune that severely, we spend two seasons doing it. The first year, strip approximately one half of the height and let the needles of the other

half support it until it puts out and then, the second season, cut off the remaining part. Thus, the plant has a factory in operation continually without too much strain.

The juniper is very versatile in that you can prune for the boxed formal effect or you can prune for the feathered, natural look by simply changing very little in the basic method used. To get the boxed or formal effect, you cut all outside an imaginary line. To achieve the feathered effect, you clip the tips of main branches back, slick with secondary or side branches and then let them grow forward to give the appearance that they are the original terminals.

More Moisture Falls

Ranchers and farmers in the county were wearing big smiles Tuesday morning as they awoke to find light rain, later turning to snow, falling in the area. Moisture which has fallen this week, coupled with that of last week, measured from four one-hundredths to one-half inch in the area. This will add much to the growth of the winter wheat, from which cattle are presently being moved and also to the pasture land growth. However, the moisture at this time is too light to do much toward putting "season" in the ground to help row-crop farmers in the area.

In some areas of the Panhandle snows measuring several inches in depth had created driving hazards and were also adding much-needed moisture. In the Parmer County area the snow was much too light to create much of a problem for motorists.

Total moisture in the Farwell vicinity this year (since Jan. 1) has been approximately one inch. More snow fell during the night Tuesday and more was predicted for the

next two days. Temperatures stood at above freezing and the snow was melting and soaking into the ground at press time, adding to the delight of area residents.

Mamie Jane Bowery is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at City Hall within said City and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent.

That said election shall be held in accordance with the Election Code of this State and only resident qualified voters of said city shall be eligible to vote at said election.

That the City Secretary/Clerk shall give notice of said election by posting a copy of this order in each of the election precincts of said city, which posting shall be done not less than 30 days prior

to date fixed for said election.

The City Secretary/Clerk shall also cause a notice by publication of this election to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in this city, which publication shall be not more than 30 days nor less than 10 days before said election.

That immediately after said election is held, the officers holding the same shall make returns of the result thereof to the Mayor of this city as required by the Election Code of this State.

A copy of this order shall also serve as a writ of election which shall be delivered to the above appointed Presiding Judge, for said election.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE REQUIREMENT FOR RECORDATION AND LIMITATION OF CERTAIN CLAIMS OF WATER RIGHTS.

Notice is here given as required by Section 4 of the Water Rights Adjudication Act of 1967 (Article 7542a, Vernon's Civil Statutes) that all claims of riparian water rights, all claims under Article 7500a, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, to impound, divert or use public waters for other than domestic and livestock purposes for which no permit has been issued, all claims of water rights under the Irrigation Acts of 1889 and 1895 which were not filed with the State Board of Water Engineers in accordance with the Irrigation Act of 1913, as amended, and all other claims of water rights other than claims under permits and certified filings, must be recorded with the Texas Water Rights Commission. Section 4 does not apply to use of water for domestic and livestock purposes as the same is defined by Commission Rules.

On or before September 1, 1969, every person claiming any water right to which Section 4 applies shall file with the Commission a sworn statement setting forth the nature of the claim of water right. Claims to which the Section applies shall be recognized only if valid under existing law and only to the extent of actual application of water to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1967, inclusive.

However, in any case where any claimant of a riparian right has prior to August 28, 1967, commenced or completed the construction of works designed to apply a greater quantity of water to beneficial use, such right shall be recognized to the extent of the maximum amount of water actually applied to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1970, inclusive; provided an additional sworn statement is filed on or before July 1, 1971. Failure to file the sworn statement or statements in substantial compliance with Section 4 shall extinguish and bar any claim of water right to which the Section applies.

Instructions and forms for recording claims may be obtained without cost from the Texas Water Rights Commission, P. O. Box 12396, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711.

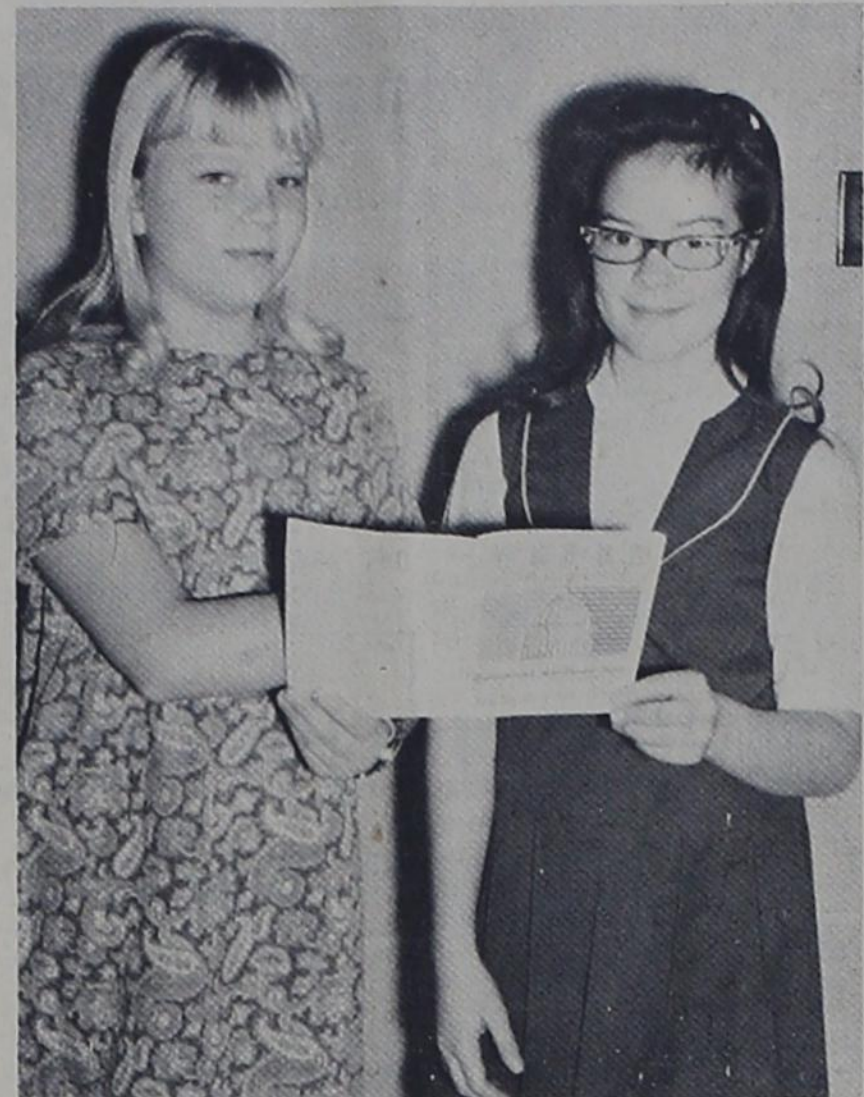

WEED CONTROL IN COTTON
Weed emergence in cotton during the summer after application of preplant herbicides indicates that the herbicides has decomposed.

HERBICIDES THAT CAN BE USED PREPLANT ARE AS FOLLOWS:
1. CAPAROL 80W - Soil incorporation is not advised. Suggested rates of application are 1, 1-1/2 and 1-1/2 lb./A for coarse, medium and fine textured soils.
2. COTORAN - Use only on medium and fine textured soil. Rates of active ingredient for medium and fine textured soil are 1.5 and 2.0 lb./A. Do not replant crop in treated soil. Weed control is very good with this herbicide but injury will occur on sandy, loamy sand and fine sandy loam soil.
3. DACTHAL - (Same as for preplant application.)
4. HERBAN - It can be used pre-emergence or with light soil incorporation. Sorghum can be planted the year of application if cotton fails. Application rates are 1.0, 1.5 and 2.0 lb/A active ingredient on coarse, medium and fine textured soils. Do not use on sandy soils.
5. KARMEX DL and KARMEX DIURON - Light incorporation of diuron is beneficial. Rates of Diuron are 0.5, 0.8 and 1.0 lb/A for coarse, medium and fine textured soils. Do not use on sandy soil.
6. LASSO - This new herbicide will probably be labeled for cotton, peanuts, corn and soybeans in 1969. Research results since 1966 indicate that this pre-emergence herbicide will give outstanding control of carelessness (pigweed) and good control of most annual grasses common to West Texas. Rate of active ingredient to use varies from 1 to 1-1/2 pounds per treated acre, depending upon soil type. Shallow incorporation may improve weed control.
7. PLANVIN - Must be incorporated to about planting depth with a power incorporator just prior to planting with

germinating weeds unless heavy rains leach herbicides deeply into the soil. Effectiveness of pre-emergence herbicides can be markedly enhanced by sprinkler irrigation immediately after application. Shallow incorporation with mechanical devices improves the effectiveness of certain herbicides.
HERBICIDES THAT CAN BE USED PREPLANT ARE AS FOLLOWS:
1. CAPAROL 80W - Soil incorporation is not advised. Suggested rates of application are 1, 1-1/2 and 1-1/2 lb./A for coarse, medium and fine textured soils.
2. COTORAN - Use only on medium and fine textured soil. Rates of active ingredient for medium and fine textured soil are 1.5 and 2.0 lb./A. Do not replant crop in treated soil. Weed control is very good with this herbicide but injury will occur on sandy, loamy sand and fine sandy loam soil.
3. DACTHAL - (Same as for preplant application.)
4. HERBAN - It can be used pre-emergence or with light soil incorporation. Sorghum can be planted the year of application if cotton fails. Application rates are 1.0, 1.5 and 2.0 lb/A active ingredient on coarse, medium and fine textured soils. Do not use on sandy soils.
5. KARMEX DL and KARMEX DIURON - Light incorporation of diuron is beneficial. Rates of Diuron are 0.5, 0.8 and 1.0 lb/A for coarse, medium and fine textured soils. Do not use on sandy soil.
6. LASSO - This new herbicide will probably be labeled for cotton, peanuts, corn and soybeans in 1969. Research results since 1966 indicate that this pre-emergence herbicide will give outstanding control of carelessness (pigweed) and good control of most annual grasses common to West Texas. Rate of active ingredient to use varies from 1 to 1-1/2 pounds per treated acre, depending upon soil type. Shallow incorporation may improve weed control.
7. PLANVIN - Must be incorporated to about planting depth with a power incorporator just prior to planting with

surface planter. Rates are the same as for preplant application.
8. TREFLAN - Must be mixed on top of the bed to about planting depth with a power incorporator just prior to planting with surface planter. Results are not usually as good as with preplant treatments.
POST-EMERGENCE HERBICIDES THAT CAN BE USED ARE AS FOLLOWS:
Post-emergence applications of the following herbicides directed at weeds and lower 2 inches of cotton effectively controls weeds up to 2 inches. Larger weeds may be controlled if they are not in drought stress.
Many of the post-emergence herbicides require that a surfactant be mixed with the carrier. Not all surfactants or wetting agents work properly. Check labels and determine if a surfactant is suggested. Spreader stickers will not work. Research has shown

“Surfactant WK”, “X-77” and “Sterox” have proven to be good surfactants.
1. CAPAROL 80W - Rates of application are 0.2 to 0.4 lb/A of Prometryne with 1/2% surfactant. Prometryne is most effective for caneless-weeds.
2. DSMA and MSMA - Many companies formulate these herbicides under a variety of trade names. Liquid formulations are made either with or without surfactants. Liquids containing surfactants are the most effective formulations. These herbicides can be used as directed sprays from the time the cotton is 3-inches tall and until it is flowering. Use each at the rate of 2.5 to 3.0 lb/A in 40 gallons of water containing 1/2% surfactant. Good for control of annual grasses and Johnson grass. Not effective against carelessly weeds. Do not spray over the top of cotton.
3. KARMEX DL, and KARMEX DIURON - These herbicides can be used as a directed spray once cotton is 6-inches tall. In 10-inch bands 0.05 to 0.1 pounds of diuron and 4 ounces of surfactant per acre in 5 gallons of water. This is 0.2 to 0.4 ounces of surfactant per acre in 5 gallons of water. This is 0.2 to 0.4 pound of Diuron (9 to 18 liquid ounces of Karmex DL or 0.25 to 0.50 pound of Karmex Diuron), 4/5 pint surfactant and 20 gallons of water per treated acre. A broadcast application during August, after layby, usually keeps fields weed-free for the rest of the season.
5. Mixtures of DSMA and MSMA with Caparil 80W, Karmex DL and Karmex Diuron, and Herban applied as directed sprays will control mixtures of both broadleaf and grass weeds. Weeds must be less than 2 inches tall and not under moisture stress. Most satisfactory results will be obtained if weeds are less than 1 inch tall.

PREPLANT HERBICIDES
Use of preplant herbicides is most profitable on fields where severe weed problems exist and hoeing costs have been high. Best results have been obtained when herbicides are applied to dry flat soil prior to bedding for pre-irrigation. Within 4 hours after application and before bedding, herbicides must be incorporated 2 to 4 inches deep. This is best accomplished with a tandem disk. Care should be taken not to list deeper than incorporation or middles will become weedy prior to planting. Cotton should be planted on top of the bed or in a shallow furrow to avoid moving herbicides to the middles, thus leaving the cotton row unprotected.
Successful preplant application of herbicides can be made to bands on beds with power incorporators just prior to pre-irrigation. If herbicides are not incorporated deeply, planting must be done on top of the bed without removing soil.
