Payments will be made at the same
Pase rate as for regular unemployment in-
surance, but the total extended benefits will equal only 50 per cent of regular benefits. However, a new federal program may pay extended benefits in state benefits. Persons claiming unemploymen insurance benefits as ex-servicemen or
ex-Federal employees are also eligible ex-Federal employees are als for these extended benefits.
Extended benefits are available so long as the rate of unemployment remains at levels specified by law. Claimants who file for extended benefits on or before February 19 may
file claims backdated to include January 26, 1975, if they meet the usua requirements for drawing unem ployment insurance.
