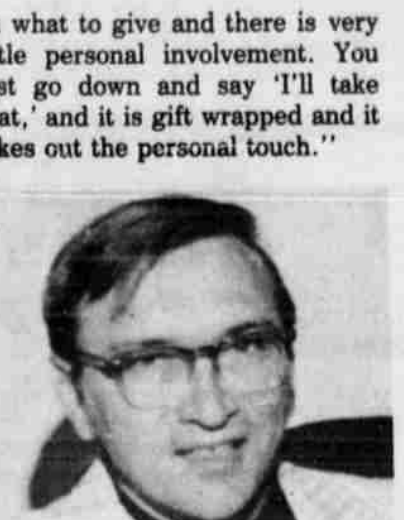

Is the significance of Christmas declining?



REV. T. F. STARNES, United Pentecostal Church

"I wouldn't think the significance of Christmas is declining. I think people are looking more toward the spiritual side than in the past. Spiritually, I'd say it is on its way up, with more involved in the spiritual aspect than in the past."



REV. JAMES RISTVEDT, Emanuel Lutheran

"No, I don't believe the significance of Christmas is declining—not for those who are Christians! And the number of Christians in America is about the same as it was in the 1940s and 1950s. What is really happening is that the size of America's general public is growing, the number of products offered for public consumption is increasing, pay checks are bigger, product advertisement is much more intense and insidious, and Christians are in a state of general bewilderment about how to cope with the intense demands being made on their time, attention, and money these days.



REV. JOE JAMES, Sacred Heart Catholic Church

"Yes, the significance of Christmas is declining if you mean as a religious feast and the birth of Jesus. If you're talking about Santa Claus and Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer and commercialism, then the adventure is on the upswing.

"Someone made an interesting observation that at one time presents were GIVEN, now they are EXCHANGED. There isn't the joy of gift giving there once was. People feel bad if they get a card or gift they can't return. I think this is a sad comment on the giving of gifts.



REV. BENNY GOSS, Sunset Baptist

"There is less emphasis on Christmas religiously, and more emphasis as a social affair. The commercialism is a trend we've allowed ourselves to get into. I don't think most people desire it this way, but they don't know how to stop it.

"I like to remember the times when items were more handmade and personal. Now everything is prepared with suggestions given

on what to give and there is very little personal involvement. You just go down and say 'I'll take that,' and it is gift wrapped and it takes out the personal touch."



REV. A.J. KENEMER, First Baptist Church

"No, I don't think the significance of Christmas is declining. I think it is coming back. I think it is more significant than it was 20 years ago."

Farm census records sales

The market value of all agricultural products sold by the 972 farms in Lamb County in 1974 amounted to \$67,560,000, according to a preliminary report of the 1974 Census of Agriculture released by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of the Census.

Production expenses on these farms totaled \$54,097,000 in 1974.

The figures are for farms qualifying under the definition first used for the 1959 Census of Agriculture: A farm includes all agricultural operations conducted at any time during the census year under the control of an individual management, provided that sales of agricultural products amounted to, or normally would amount to, at least \$250 for places of less than 10 acres or \$50 for places of 10 acres or more.

CLIPS & TIPS

LEFTOVER TURKEY MEAT provides endless possibilities for future family meals, says Mrs. Dorothy Powell, county extension agent.

"Cool cooked poultry quickly and store, loosely wrapped, in the coldest part of the refrigerator. Cooked turkey meat can be stored in the freezer in moisture-vapor resistant wrappings such as glass, rigid plastic containers, freezer foil and freezer paper or plastic wrap.
"Cooked turkey covered with broth or gravy will keep for up to six months, but turkey not covered with broth of gravy will keep only one month.
"If the meat is removed from the bone before packaging and freezing, less freezer space will be used and the meat will be ready for use. Defrost in the refrigerator before use," she advised.

Try these recipes to make the best use of one of this year's best buys— turkey.

TURKEY CROQUETTES
2 cups turkey, cooked, diced
1 cup rice, cooked
1/2 cup celery, finely chopped
2 Tbsps. onion, finely chopped
1 tsp. flour
1/8 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. poultry seasoning
1 egg, beaten
1/4 to 1/2 cup evaporated milk
2/4 cub bread crumbs, fine, dry
2 quarts oil for frying
1 recipe turkey sauce
1/2 cup nuts, chopped or a few sprigs parsley
Combine turkey, rice, vegetable, flour and seasonings. Add egg and enough milk to moisten. Shape into 12 croquettes. Roll in bread crumbs. Heat oil in a deep kettle or deep-fat fryer to 375 degrees F. Fry croquettes until browned, two-five minutes. Drain on paper. Serve hot turkey sauce over croquettes. Garnish with nuts or parsley, if desired.
Note: To obtain one cup cooked

rice, use 1/2 cup raw rice.
Calories per serving: About 360 if garnished with nuts; about 315 if garnished with parsley. Yield: six servings, two croquettes each.

TURKEY PINWHEELS
3 Tbsps. celery, finely chopped
2 tps. onion, finely chopped
2 Tbsps. water
1 1/4 cups turkey, cooked, finely chopped
1 1/4 cups flour, unsifted
2 tps. baking powder, double-acting
3/4 tsp. salt
1/4 cup shortening
1/2 cup milk
1 recipe Turkey Sauce
Cook celery and onion in water until tender. Drain, reserving two teaspoons liquid. Combine turkey, vegetables and reserved vegetable liquid. Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. (very hot). Stir flour, baking powder and salt together. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse cornmeal. Add milk; mix just enough to moisten dry ingredients. Turn dough onto a lightly floured board. Roll one-fourth inch thick. Spread turkey mixture evening over dough. Roll as for jelly roll. Cut into six slices. Place slices on a greased baking pan. Bake 20 minutes. Serve Turkey Sauce over pinwheels.
Calories per serving: About 275. Yield: six pinwheels.

TURKEY SAUCE
1 to 3 Tbsps. butter or other fat
3 Tbsps. flour
1/4 tsp. salt
1 1/2 cups turkey broth or a mixture
1 1/2 cups milk, whole or skim and 3 turkey-flavored bouillon cubes
Melt fat over low heat; blend in flour and salt. Heat and stir until bubbly. Add broth or milk and bouillon cubes slowly, stirring constantly, until thickened.
Note: Chicken fat adds extra flavor.
Calories per recipe: About 310 if made with turkey broth; 520 if made with whole milk and bouillon cubes. Yield: one and one-half cups sauce.

TURKEY-KIDNEY BEAN SALAD
1 cup turkey, cooked, coarsely chopped
1 1/4 cups kidney beans, cooked or canned, drained
1/2 cup pickle, sweet, coarsely chopped
1/2 cup celery, coarsely chopped
1 Tbsp. onion, finely chopped
2 eggs, hard-cooked, diced
1 tsp. salt
3 Tbsps. mayonnaise
1 tsp. mustard, prepared
1 tsp. pickle liquid
Combine all ingredients. Toss lightly. Chill at least one hour to blend flavors.
Calories per serving: About 205. Yield: six servings, one-half cup each.

IT IS WISE TO BE properly concerned about the living experience, and the individual happenings of which it is composed. That is, we must be interested; because this means being alive.
In this consideration, however, there is a problem. It is the ever-present inclination to be too intense, to be too "extreme", to "feel too deeply".
This may be better than being unconcerned, or having no interest at all; but this is not the point. We can be justifiably concerned, and act with the proper degree of interest, without "overreaching".

WE CAN "OVERREACH" ourselves in our talk and our actions, and thus become intense, or more literally "stretched out" too far. Such action will spoil what might otherwise be well accepted and successful behavior.
Even when the things we say and do are justified, "overreaching" will cause distortion and misunderstanding.
Such intensity will almost always bring an undesired and undesirable response from other people. It produces an objectionable stimulus, and, usually, the reaction from other people will be objectionable.

WE KNOW THE VALUE of good judgment, and, if good judgment is our aim, we must make sure that we "don't overreach". When we let ourselves "overreach", we become "too intense" and lose the power to think and act wisely.

If we reach too far, we begin to approach the irrational. We think, and we say, and we do things that would never be thought, or said, or

done; if we remained moderate.
We make mistakes cannot afford to make, create problems that may cate our lives. All of this amounts to an unfortunate tion of our mental, spiritual and physical strength.

OUR INTENTIONS will very best, and this fact is make our "overreach" complicated problem for

Instead of obtaining the desired, we will usually mark. In many instances the thing turns out wrong.

Of course, we are discouraged; but, when this, we often find ourselves in a state of distressful confusion. Intentions were the very best, were sincerely intended, tried, we honestly tried.

We may not know, or know, we may not admit, tried too hard. We were intense, we "overreached" less effort, and calmer than we probably would have ceeded.

THERE IS GREAT PLEASANTNESS, and this is es true in our associations with people. We can be concerned still be pleasant, and we properly interested and be ant, too.

\$2,500 or more are shown for 1974 and 1969. These farms accounted for \$67,470,000 of all agricultural products sold in 1974 and \$32,471,000 in 1969.

There were 871 of these farms in 1974 compared with 1,160 in 1969. The average size increased from 605 to 718 acres during the five years. The value per acre \$297 from \$393 to raising the average value per farm from \$179,550 to \$281,959.

The market value of livestock and their products on farms of \$2,500 or more of sales was \$17,318,000 in 1974; poultry and their products, \$91,000; and crop sales, including nursery products, hay and forest products, \$50,061,000.

Farms reporting less than \$1,000 in sales numbered 11 in 1974. The value of agricultural products sold on these farms totaled \$6,000.

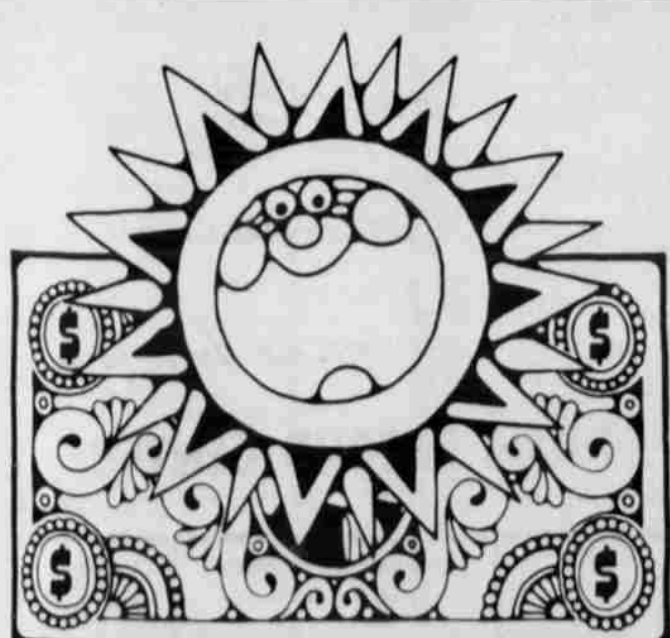
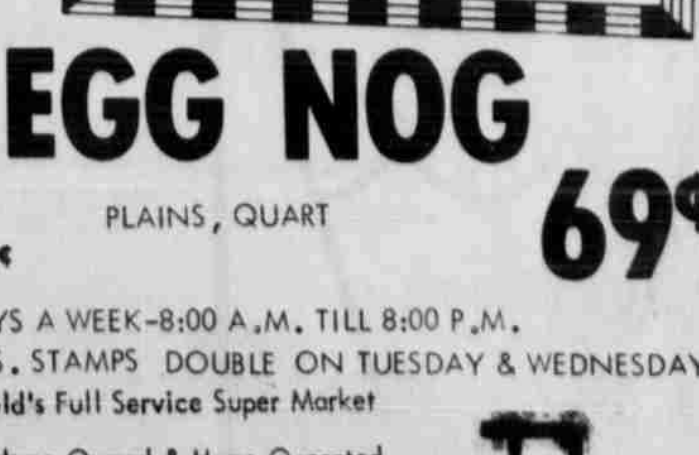

John Despres suing city

John L. Despres, former Littlefield policeman, filed suit Tuesday in U.S. District Court against the City of Littlefield, Mayor J. E. Chisholm, former City Manager Jim Blagg, Police Chief James Cox, and members of the city council.

Despres claims his constitutional rights were violated in his July 21 termination from the police force.

He wants to be reinstated to the force, issued back pay and asks U.S. Dist. Judge Halbert O. Woodward to issue an injunction against his removal from the city payroll.

Despres says he was presented July 21 with charges that he violated various provisions of the city's personnel rules and regulations and was fired. He says he

received a hearing on the termination, but that only he gave testimony and he was denied the opportunity to cross-examine those persons who alleged he had violated the rules—a violation of his right to due process of law under the U.S. Constitution.

Despres says the charges against him were intoxication while off-duty, failure to pay or make reasonable provision of payment of just debts, and committing any act or conduct showing a lack of good moral character or any other conduct unbecoming to an employe of the city.

No testimony or proof regarding those charges was presented during his appeal of termination, according to the suit.

HOLIDAY APPLE WALDORF SALAD

1 pkg. green gelatin
1 pkg. red gelatin
1 cup whipping cream
1 T. salad dressing
1 cup diced pineapple
1 cup diced marshmallows
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup diced apples, unpeeled
Prepare gelatin, each color separately. Place in 8 x 8 pan and let set until hard. Whip together the

whipping cream and salad dressing until very thick. Cut gelatin into cubes and fold all remaining ingredients into whipped mixture.

DATE PUDDING

1 cup sugar
1 cup flour
2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 cup milk
1 cup dates, chopped
Dissolve 1 cup brown sugar in 2 1/2 cup boiling water. Drop the dough into the syrup. Sprinkle nuts (of your choice) over top.
Bake 45 minutes in 375 degrees oven.

PEPPERMINT CANDY CANES

2 cups sugar
1/2 cup light corn syrup
1/2 cup water
1/4 tsp. cream of tartar
1/4 tsp. peppermint extract
Red food coloring
Combine sugar, corn syrup, water and cream of tartar. Place over heat; stir until sugar dissolves. Cook without stirring to very hard-ball stage (265°). Remove from heat; add peppermint extract. Divide in two portions. Add 1/4 to 1 tsp. red food coloring to 1 part. Pour on greased platters. When cool enough to handle like taffy, each part separately.
Form like ropes and twist red part around white. Cut in 8-inch lengths and form in the shape of candy canes. Makes 10 canes.

NO-BAKE WALNUT BALLS

Mix:
2 cups vanilla wafer crumbs
1/2 cup sugar

1/8 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 cup chopped maraschino cherries
1 cup chopped walnuts
Add 1 tsp. lemon juice
1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk.
Mix well, form in balls. Roll in granulated or confectioner's sugar. Decorate with cherries or walnuts.

**SOUR CREAM
CURRANT COOKIES**
currants-rinse with hot
water together:

1/2 cup oleo
1 1/2 cup brown sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
Add 2 eggs - 1 at a time - mix
sift together:
1/2 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. soda
Sprinkle of salt
2 1/2 cup flour
Add alternately with:
1 cup sour cream
Stir in 1/2 cup nut meats and the
drained currants.
Bake approximately 12 minutes
at 350°.

CINNAMON PUFFS

1- 8 to 9 1/2 oz. pkg. buttermilk
biscuits
About 1 qt. corn oil
1/4 cup sugar
1/4 tsp. cinnamon

Cut each biscuit into quarters.
Pour oil into 3 qt. saucepan or deep
fryer, no more than 1/2 full. Heat
over medium heat to 375 degrees.
Carefully place quartered biscuits
in a single layer in hot oil. Fry 1 to
2 minutes on each side or until
golden brown.

Drain on absorbent paper
(toweling). While still warm roll in
sugar-cinnamon mixture - makes
40 puffs.

If desired, biscuits can be flat-
tended slightly and form a hole in
center to make "donuts" - or -
even, roll biscuits making them
like "dunkers".

You can also substitute pow-
dered sugar for the sugar and
cinnamon mixture. Put powdered
sugar in plastic bag and add
donuts or dunkers and shake till
they are coated.

PISTACHIO DESSERT

Mix together for crust. Pat in
9x13 cake pan.
1 stick oleo (soft)
60 Ritz crackers-crushed
2 Tbsps. sugar
Filling:
2 boxes (3 1/2 oz.) Royal Instant
Pistachio Pudding
1 1/2 cups cold milk.
Beat above 2 for 2 minutes.
Add: 1 pint vanilla ice cream.
Beat last 3 items until smooth
Pour in crust - put in freezer
until ready to serve. (take out few
minutes (10) before serving).

BAKED STUFFED MUSHROOMS
1 lb. fresh mushrooms

3 T. butter
1 T. minced parsley
1 egg slightly beaten
1/2 cup seasoned bread crumbs
1 1/2 T. butter (for dotting)
2 T. toasted chopped almonds
Dash salt and pepper

Wash and dry mushrooms. Re-
move stems and chop. Saute stems
in 3 T. butter for 4-5 minutes.
Remove from heat, add parsley,
egg, almonds and bread crumbs.
Toss until well mixed. Spoon
mixture into hollow of each mush-
room cap. Place mushrooms in a
shallow, lightly buttered baking
dish. Dot with butter. Cover and
refrigerate. Place uncovered in a
cold oven. Set heat at 350 degree.
Bake for 20 minutes.

IDIOTS DELIGHT

3 pkgs. lady fingers
1 cup strawberry preserves
2 pkgs. vanilla pudding (prepared)
1 or 2 pints whipping cream
(whipped thick)
1/4 to 1 cup sherry wine
Slice ladyfingers and spread
with jam. Line bottom and sides of
a pretty deep dish or glass bowl
with ladyfingers. Sprinkle with
wine. Add layer of pudding, a
layer of whipped cream, a layer of
ladyfingers spread with jam and
sprinkle with wine. Repeat until all
is used, ending with whipped
cream. Decorate top with colored
"sprinkles."

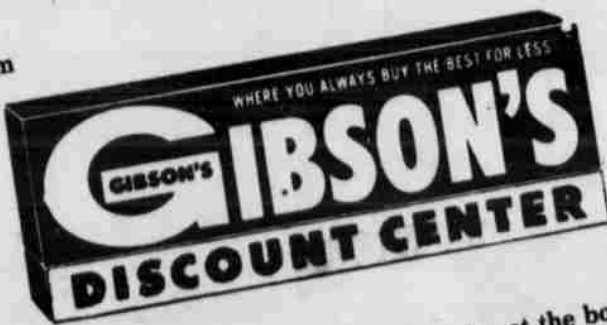

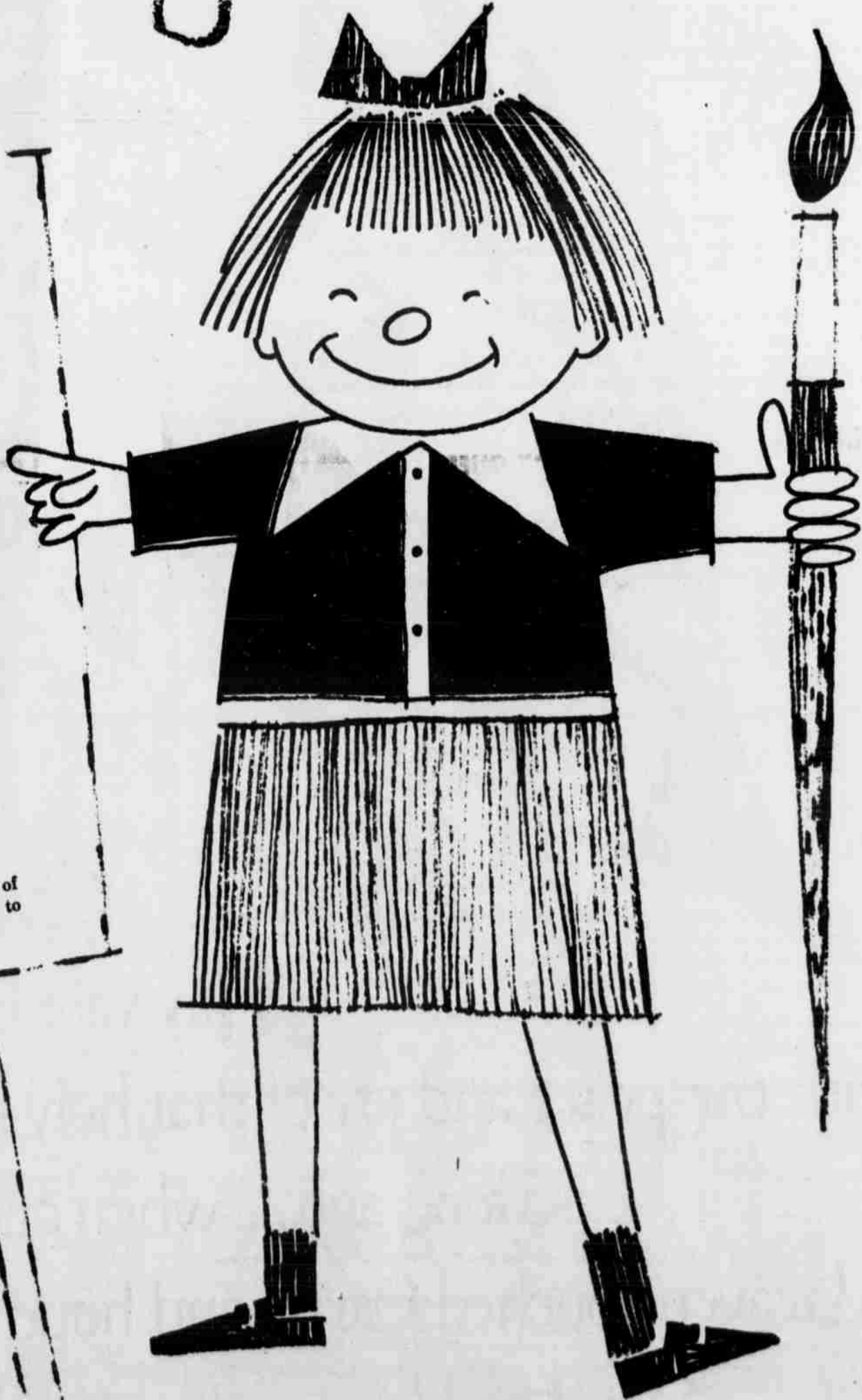
