COOKING MEAT outdoors is a great way to keep the house cool in summer-
but don't forget that vegetables can be ooked on the grill too, advises Marilyn laggard, foods and nutrition specialist. Skewer raw vegetables and cook on

vegetables such as potatoes, carrots and onions may be parboiled a few minutes before placing on the skewer to hasten
cooking time,", she said Frozen vegetables can be cooked on

center of a piece of heavy duty center of a piece of heavy duty
aluminum foil. Dot with about 2 tablespoons of margarine or butter, 2

for each 10 -unce package. "Close the package carefully to keep cook 15 or 20 mimutes, turning once or twice," she said.
LaWN MoWING can be hazardous to
your health, especially if you disregard safety when using a power mower. Every year 55,000 Americans are
treated in hospital emergency rooms for reated in hospital emergency rooms for
injuries resulting from the use of power lawn mowers. Many victims lose finerers
or toes; some accidents prove fatal. or toes; some accidents prove fata.
"Most of these lawn mower accidents "Most of these lawn mower accidents
could have been prevented if a few safety ruves had been follwed," contends Wayne Keese, agricultural engineer for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, who is in ch
educational programs.
"The first rule in safe operation of a lawn mower is to become completely familiar with your machine. Read the owner's manual carefully. Make sure
everyone who will be operating the lawn everyene who will be operating the lawi
mower understands the controls and knows how to stop the engine quickly in case of an emergency," emphasizes the

"Damage is often widespread, and then decisions must be made as to whether to leave the damaged plants in
the garden or to start over and preplant"." points out Sam Cotner.

cucumbers and beans often receive heavy damage," says Cotner, a vegetable specialist for the Texas
Agricultural Extension Service, "They
enerally recover slowly, if at all, so it is often best to replant. If there is suf can be left while the remainder of the crop is replanted
Most vegetable Most vegetable seed will germinate
rapidly now that the soil has warmed replanting is often the best altermative of course, if transplants can be obtained, the gardener can gain several
weeks of valuable growing time. In many areas it is too late to replan
some garden crops such as potatoes. some garden crops such as potatoes,
carrots, caulifower and other cool season vegetables.
"Due to late season cool weather spring gardens have geonerally been making limited growth until the pasi several weeks," points out the specialist. "So, even though replanting
will bring some delays, these may not be will bring some delays, these may not be quite as as greal conditions."
Whether gardeners leave damaged plants to recuperate or whether they
decide to replant, the overall delay decide to replant, the overall delay
home vegetable production will mea closer attention to care and maintenance of the growing plants in the
coming months coming months, emphasizes Cotner
"Insects growing season progresses, so plant growing season progresses, so plants
must be checked more closely and control measures taken as the situation warrants. Also, watering will become more critical as the growing
enters the hot summer months. "Adversity such as that resulting from severe weather damage tests the true grit of the home gardener," says
Cotner. "It makes him realize Cotner. "It makes him realize that
